Dear Siblings in Christ,

Do you think God might be interested in how we're doing? I mean, really—God loves us; God is love; Jesus gave his life for us; God grants us mercy no matter how rotten we may be/do/feel. LOVE is all the rage in the Bible and in our relating with our Creator, Redeemer, Sanctifier, L.O.V.E.

But, that's not the only thing. It's not just about me and my relationship with the Lord, not my knowledge of and testimony to the Savior, not my ministry or works or faith. If you look at the NINE sightings in the above scripture and pay attention to how the Ten Commandments teach us how to live with one another, we see that God is intently interested in how we're doing, not just in receiving and sharing divine adoration, but with our COMMUNITY.

How's our community? How are you doing, collectively? And, yes, individually as well since our collective is made up of discreet parts. As your pastor, I especially want to know. How are our neighbors, within and around Trinity?

We're into the third year of handling covid among us. About a third of our congregation has not returned to worship on Sundays. Consistent with this drop in attendance is also an overall shortfall in financial contributions to the ministry of Trinity. We have expanded our online ministry but have no idea who is participating and when. Our youth ministry has struggled since the original lockdown in 2020. Plus, there's a whole new pastor on scene since the beginning of the pandemic and we haven't gotten to know one another in the traditional ways.

I know we're in a changing time and I know that we can't look backwards and expect what we used to think of as normal to simply return. We're in a time that calls for new understanding, new expectations, and new listening to God and to one another.

All these circumstances seriously draw me back to scripture and leads me to ponder how you are. Those not participating as much or at all—are your needs being met elsewhere? How's your spirit? You'll find no shaming going on here if you aren't ok, if you are feeling shy about coming back, or if you've moved on to another spiritual home.

If you don't know how to get back into the pattern of worship, try joining online first. If your financial situation has changed and you can't participate as you once did, please let us know if you need help. If you aren't being fed spiritually here by our worship, study, and service, please tell us so we can address what we may do differently.

Our calling from the Lord, as people of God, long before Trinity itself even existed, is to love the Lord, love ourselves, and love our neighbor. My prayer for all of you is that we, as a community, are helping one another do just that. Trinity isn't alone in experiencing changes since March of 2020 threw us into a tailspin. Every pastor or other church leader I speak to shares the same story. Church isn't the same as it was.

The whole world isn't the same as it was. We'll be recovering for a while. If you need help doing it, come here, where we're all seeking the Lord together—and listening as best we can to God's teaching to LOVE.

Finance

July giving for "Current" of \$20,694 was higher than our budgeted requirement of \$19,912 – Good news! However, we are still short on our **budgeted income** requirements on a year-to-date basis by \$17,076 (Current) and, also short by \$1,471 on our Synod Benevolence commitment. Thus far for 2022 our total income is \$112,356 and expenses \$125,873 resulting in a deficit of \$13,517. Non budgeted income of approximately \$5,407 effectively reduces the deficit to \$8,110 through July. COMING THIS FALL - BIBLICAL STORYTELLING

Want to become more familiar with the Bible? Interested in learning more about the passages we read in worship? Love serving as a Reader (lector) in church and wish you could expand on those readings? Here's a great chance! Biblical Storytelling is a method of proclaiming Scripture that involves becoming familiar with a passage and then telling the story to others. There's a general goal of 75% accuracy in repeating the words of the passage and 95% accuracy in sharing the content or message of the passage. **YOU can do this!** This is particularly a great way to share the stories of Scripture if you're not comfortable reading out loud - you get to tell the story in your own words.

Here are some tips on how to become a Biblical Storyteller:

- *Pick a passage of Scripture that you'd like to share (The list of fall options can be found on the table in the upstairs lobby/narthex.)
- *Know your passage well enough to tell it, not read it. Study its context. Set the scene by describing it and introducing the characters.
- *Pace yourself. Don't rush through the story, tell it at a natural pace with your normal voice. Speak clearly so you can be heard.
- *Use props and other visuals if they'll help.
- *Figure out how you'll enlist the help of others if it's appropriate.
- *Practice, practice, practice. Practice alone, in front of the mirror, and in front of people.



If you'd like to be a Biblical Storyteller this fall during worship, September 11 - November 20, check out the list of lectionary passages on the sign-up sheet on the table in the upstairs lobby/narthex. See

Pastor Susan with any questions or to learn more. The Storyteller will serve to tell the story during the worship time and will act in the place of the Lector for that particular passage. If no Storyteller signs up, then the Lector's job remains the same as always. Give it a try!

ELCA Church Wide Assembly 2022 Update

The tri-annual meeting of the Churchwide Assembly of the ELCA was held Monday, August 8 through Friday, August 12, 2022 in Columbus, OH. Kay Hinkle shares her experience as a voting member.

It was something that elicited in me a wide range of emotions from frustration with the process which moved very slowly at times - to elation as I worshiped with about 900 other members of the ELCA. It was an experience I would recommend to every Lutheran who has an interest in learning about the governing body of our church. One critical election was to fill the open position of ELCA Vice President, and we did that on the fifth ecclesiastical ballot; our new VP is Imran Siddiqui. All candidates had a chance to present their vision of and actions planned to further the ELCA's reach in the future. Coincidentally, the final 3 nominees were all people of

color. The VP of the ELCA, as it is with the VP of the Lower Susquehanna Synod, is the lone layperson on the Bishop's Executive Staff.

There were about 800 voting members present for each agenda item. Small handheld voting machines made the yes/ no results immediately available. For some less critical decisions, a green or red card was raised by the voter, with the majority color deciding the outcome. The 2023 budget was adopted at about \$63 million with just over \$40 million dedicated to mission support. The ELCA currently supports 240 missionaries in 40 countries. Trinity dollars, in large part, go to Mission Support.

Much of the meeting focused on diversity, and concern with the racism present in North America today. The ELCA has partnered with other denominations throughout the world, most notably the Episcopal Church and the Anglican Church of Canada to enact a united approach. In addition, many other ecumenical relationships have been developed with faith leaders present from the United States and countries across the globe. Our theme for the week was Embody the Word and the message throughout was that it is one thing to say we are an inclusive body of faith, but quite another to actually "live into" being an inclusive body of believers.

One final note to share is this observation of the way our Lutheran lives are structured. At the start of the meetings, I heard reference to 3 expressions of church - 1) our local church council (Trinity), 2) regionally through our synod councils (Lower Susquehanna) and 3) churchwide, or the ELCA. It occurred to me that we are each more personally guided by another very spiritual Trinity - Father, Son and Holy Spirit. And throughout the week, I realized that it is a combination of all these expressions of "three" that lead us through decision making in holy discernment. The week was a great experience for both Jack and I - exhausting, but rewarding. I would urge you to give thoughtful consideration to accepting the role of serving as a representative to one of the 3 governing bodies within our Lutheran church when asked - it is an opportunity to serve that I think you'll appreciate. Amen.

Trinity Evangelical Lutheran Church Council Meeting Minutes August 11, 2022

Present: Pastor Susan McCarthy, Lisa Miller, Jay Smith, Bob King, Sue Clauser, Rick Madsen, Mark Boyer, Dona Lerew

Bob called the meeting to order and Pastor Susan led our Council Meeting Liturgy with prayer and a read-

ing from Micha 6:8. The agenda was reviewed and no new items were added.

Secretary's Report: The written report was reviewed and was approved as written.

Treasurer's Report: The report was reviewed and discussion was held about the continued deficit of \$13,000 on budgeted items. There is \$6000-7000 remaining on non-budgeted income which in reality, reduces the deficit to \$7000. Utilities are still high and discussion was held about checking the time sequence for the AC in an effort to keep utilities as low as possible. Specific information is in the Finance Committee Report.

Ministry Reports:

Learning and Youth – All events are scheduled up to Christmas. Rosters have been updated including teen time with Pastor, Mark Boyer, and Steph Haley. Teachers are confirmed for all classes. Music will be included and all topics have been identified. The cookie break will resume this fall. Rally day is September 18. A newsletter will be created two times through the year. The Spark Bible will be purchased and distributed to all children K-2. The Adventure Bible is being considered for grades 3-6. The intergenerational sessions will be expanded in the fall with All Hallows Eve and Ghost Stories. There will be a Christmas pageant.

Worship & Music Committee:

August 4, 2022 - Present: Karen Wire, Mike Brown, Karen Sheaffer, Pastor Susan Review of the Worship in July:

- Mike played twice and went well. Luke McCarthy and the Kline girls shared their musical gifts. Pastor Susan was sick and Pastor Terry filled in.
- Still need to train others to set up outside or other mobile worship opportunities and learn how to use the portable sound system.
- More concern was shared regarding singing directly into the microphone in the choir space. Andie has placed a sign but we need to continue to problem solve and educate.
