Welcome to September, Peace UCC!

As I hope many of you know already, we started a project here at the church a few months ago with the Council's approval. We are working to convert one of our two nurseries into a sensory room that the community will be able to use in a variety of ways! This is a very meaningful project and one that I hope will spark creativity and life for other projects in the future. It encourages us to think of our building in a different way and challenges us to meet the needs of our community that we are here to serve. If you haven't, I highly encourage you to watch our service from August 28, 2022, titled "Creating Sacred Spaces." It is posted on our church website (peaceshawano.org), on our Facebook page, and on our YouTube page. The service was crafted around this project and in particular education around how we are hoping to use this new room and what exactly a sensory room is. I thought it would be valuable to share in this newsletter, however, what some of our intentions are for the use of the room.

A sensory room is a space filled with sensory (like the five senses of hearing, touch, taste, smell, and sight) tools to meet different needs within neurodivergent individuals such as those with autism. With modern science we know now about different ways neurodivergent individuals can become overloaded with their senses which can lead to outbursts that seem uncharacteristic to those of us who are neurotypical. Many schools have started incorporating sensory rooms into their daily curriculum for students with sensory needs and have found how that often helps students' focus and reduces their likelihood of experiencing sensory overload. Our main goal with developing our own sensory room is to provide a space like this for families outside of a school setting. In essence, we recognize that sensory needs do not just disappear when a neurodivergent individual is at home and we would like to provide a space where families could exist in a calm and safe state together, not just in a school setting.

With this in mind, we are hoping to partner with a variety of non-profit organizations throughout Shawano to promote this resource for their use once it is complete. We are hoping to advertise it with families who we believe would benefit from its use and we really want this to not just be a space for Peace UCC members, but for the wider Shawano community. We are envisioning hosting nights as a church at least once a month with family-oriented activities and eventually moving towards providing childcare nights for families with neurodivergent youth so they can have a date night or run errands or whatever it is that would best help them to relax. We are hoping this is a life-giving ministry for families who often may feel neglected and let down by the majority of society. Again, I encourage you to watch the service from August 28, 2022, where I explain more in depth about the room, to include showing a video of what a fully realized sensory room may look like, and then go on to root this ministry in the ways Jesus interacted with his community. I hope and pray you all have been well this summer and I look forward to seeing more of you again as vacation season begins to slow down! Let us do meaningful work together!

GIVING ONLINE INSTRUCTIONS

Interested in giving online? Just follow these easy steps!

1. Go to our church website at <https://peaceshawano.org>
2. Click "Sign In" in the upper right-hand corner of the home page.
3. Sign into your Faithlife account or create one by providing a valid email address and creating a password.
4. Once you're signed in, click on the "Giving" link in the upper right-hand section of the home page.
5. Enter the amount you would like to donate and then select where you would like the funds to go from the drop-down list available.
 - a. If you would like to donate to two different funds, you don't need to make two separate donations. You can click the button "Add another fund," select the other fund you would like to give to and input a dollar amount for both.
6. Click "Next" once you have decided where to send the funds and the dollar amount.
7. Now you can designate which family you are giving as, input either a debit card or bank account to draw from and decide if you would like to have this be a recurring gift or a one-time donation.
8. You also have the option to cover the processing fee that Faithlife charges by checking the box titled "Cover the processing fees." If this box is not checked, the fees are deducted from your gift to the church.
9. That's it! Thank you for your generosity and trust that we will use your donations faithfully and fruitfully!
