- 1. One day there will be no COVID and no pain.
- 2. In the NJ we will be assured of permanent healing.
- 3. How is Revelation relevant to us in the 21st century?
- 4. This AM we will 1st seek to review Revelations 7 parts.
- 5. Then we will look at 7 practical ways to respond to Revelation.

Review

- Prologue: John described 7 characteristics of Jesus (Rev 1).
- In the 1st part of the book's body,
 Jesus evaluated 7 local churches (Rev 2-3).

II. Jesus will judge unbelievers for 7 years (Rev 4-18).

- A. Tribulation period is between church's rapture & Jesus's return to earth.
- B. The first half of 7-yr tribulation will last for 1260 days (11:3).
- C. The next 3.5 years will bring more persecution & 7 series of plagues (Rev 6:12-18:24).

III. Jesus will return with His bride, the church (Rev 19).

• That's us.

IV. Jesus will punish Satan, & reward tribulation saints (Rev 20:1-

- 4).
- A. He will have Satan bound for 1000 years.
- B. Deceased tribulation saints will be rewarded to rule w J for

1000 yrs.

V. Jesus will rule for 1000-years on the earth (Rev 20:5-6).

• This is the millennial kingdom of Christ.

VI. Jesus will send Satan & followers to their lake (Rev 20:11-15).

- A. Satan will be released to lead the final rebellion (20:7-9).
- B. Satan will be thrown into the lake of fire (20:10).
- C. All unbelievers will go to the lake of fire (20:11-15).

VII. Jesus will host all believers to live with Him forever (Rev 21:1-22:6).

• Conclusion: Jesus promoted 7 responses (Rev 22:7-21).

7 Right Responses (Rev 22:7-21)

We are directed here to praise, proclaim, persevere, purify, plead, preserve, and pray!

I. Praise God (22:8-9)!

- A. John's immediate reaction to the revelation was to worship.
 - 1. Yet, he worshipped an interpreter of Rev, not its author.
 - 2. Let's not praise G's messengers more than we praise God.
 - a. Some people praise a Xn minister more than God.
 - b. An affective Xn prompts people to praise G not himself.
- B. He was redirected to worship God.
 - 1. Worship involves praise (Luke 24:51).
 - 2. Worship is matter of heart not art.
 - a. Worship is about our awe of God.
 - i. It not about the angle of our legs, arms, or head.
 - *ii.* When I'm in awe, I might spontaneously give a physical response or a musical response.
 - iii. Let's each seek to give God our awe-ful praise.
 - b. The Pharisees hearts were focused more on their legalism than their praise of God.
- C. Application
 - 1. This coming week, stop & appreciate what God is showing you about Himself.
 - 2. Let God bring you a greater awe of Him.

II. Proclaim Revelation (22:10)!

- A. John was not to seal up the prophecy but proclaim to others.
- B. Let's not withhold from others the information of this book.
- C. Application: Recognize that this book is rarely taught in local churches these days.
 - 1. Many pastors say it is irrelevant or too controversial.
 - 2. We are not to bundle it up, but to unroll it for all to see.

Finally,

III. Persevere faithfully (22:11-12)!

- A. People will be stuck in their decisions and sins.
 - 1. This cemented deception will come to unbelievers when Antichrist desecrates Jerusalem's temple.
 - 2. Now a days, people can change their ways.
 - 3. Evangelism is

"one thing we will not be able to do in the New Earth."

- 4. Jesus directed His followers to focus on evangelism.
- 5. They were not to use their time and energy to set dates for the rapture and J's kingdom (Acts 1:6-8).
- B. Jesus is coming soon w rewards for faithful Christians (11-12).
 - 1. Unbeliever's sins will condemn them to the lake of fire.
 - 2. Believer's faithful service will secure eternal reward.
- C. Let's be faithful in our assignments from God.
 - "Only one life will soon be passed. Only what's done for Christ will last."

IV. Purify souls (22:11-15)!

- A. Like God the Father, Jesus is the Alpha and Omega.
 - 1. The Father claimed this for Himself.
 - 2. Yet, the Son also is fully God.
 - a. Alpha is the first letter in the Greek alphabet.
 - i. Jesus was in existence at the beg of time (Col 1:15).
 - ii. Jesus is the alpha in our dog sled team,
 - iii. He leads us through this life.
 - b. Omega is the last letter.
 - i. Jesus will be with us at the end.
 - ii. He will usher us into the eternal state.
- B. Blessed is the purified.
 - Purification comes by accepting J's blood for forgiveness (Col 1:14; Matt 26:28).
- C. Cursed are the unwashed.
 - 1. Dogs is a derogatory term for people of low character.
 - 2. Will there be dogs in heaven?

V. Plead for Jesus to come back for us (16-17)!

- A. Let's get ready for Jesus!
 - 1. Revelation is for our churches.
 - It will also help believers in the trib to find their way.
 - 2. Jesus is David's ancestor (Matt 1:1).
 - 3. Jesus is David's descendant (Luke 2:4).
 - 4. Jesus's return will announce the dawn of a new day.
- B. Accept Jesus's invitation for you!
 - 1. The Spirit [of God] and the bride [the church] invite thirsty ones to come to God.
 - 2. As Ian & Claire invite others to their wedding, God & His bride invite us to our wedding.
- *C.* Accept Jesus to gain real life for free (John 4:14; 10:10).

VI. Preserve Revelation (22:18-19)!

- A. J will punish anyone who adds to or subtracts from Revelation.
- B. Jesus's followers are directed to keep Revelation just as it is!
 - 1. Do not add prophecies. Cults add new revelation to Bible
 - 2. Do not set dates for future events.
 - a. Radio preachers air predictions that are not in Rev.
 - *i.* The have announced to the world that Jesus will come this October.
 - ii. Christians get all stirred up about current events that merely reflect the tribulation period.
 - iii. People are led to believe that certain events mean that Jesus is returning in the generation that witnessed the rebirth of Israel
 - b. *Here are some things that cause Xns to think that Jesus is coming back in this decade.*
 - a) Global banking, open borders, superpowers' alliances, rise of charismatic leaders, inflation,
 - b) *NYC fitting B's description*.
 - ii. Jesus told us <u>not</u> to do that (Matt 24:6).
 - iii. Date setters lose credibility when they are wrong.
 - iv. Let's not be like the The Boy Who Cried Wolf.

VII. Pray for speediness & grace (22:20-21)!

- A. Jesus announced His soon return.
- B. John affirmed that he wanted Jesus to come sooner than later.
 - 1. Jesus instructed us to pray this as well (Matt 6:10).
 - 2. Jesus said to remember His soon coming whenever we have communion (1 Cor 11:26).
 - 3. Paul closed 1 Corinthians by asking the Lord to come.
 - The Aramaic, *Maranatha*, means "Our Lord, come!"
- C. John then asked for God's grace to bless the seven churches.
 - 1. How does Jesus's grace affect us today.
 - a. His grace helps us endure pain and aging (1 Cor 12:9).
 - b. His grace gives us peace during our storms.
 - c. His grace prompts us to invite others to experience Jesus' grace of salvation (Titus 2:1).
 - 2. There have been many conversions because Christians clarified Revelation to others.
 - a. I know a couple who accepted Jesus by reading a book that clarified the immanence of Jesus's return.
 - b. They got ready for eternity. Are you?
 - 3. What are we to do with Revelation?
 - a. Let's praise Jesus,
 - b. Let's proclaim Revelation's truths.
 - c. Let's persevere in doing G's assignments for each of us.
 - d. Let's purify ourselves by accepting Jesus's blood.
 - e. Let's plead for Jesus to come quickly.
 - f. Let's preserve Revelation just as it is.
 - g. Let's pray for Jesus's grace to reach people in the UP, the UK, and the UER: the United Emirates Republic.
