On learning from the dishonest steward

How are we to understand Jesus defending the dishonest steward and even praising him?

Jesus seems to be anticipating and defending himself against any accusation of complicity by his statement that "the children of this world are more prudent in dealing with their own generation than are the children of light." The children of this world are clever and quick to make decisions when it comes to business, whereas the children of light, whose goal is the Kingdom, are often so slow and lacking in cleverness when it comes to the means of finding the Kingdom. If people can show themselves so able in the pursuit of perishable blessings, why is it that we are so half hearted in seeking the Kingdom?

Thus, Jesus is not by any means praising the dishonest actions of the steward. **He praises only the steward's shrewdness and regrets that such shrewdness should always be found in those who live for the present world and not in those who seek the Kingdom but often seem so clumsy in their ways.**

One means of entry into the Kingdom is to be generous and make friends in the eternal dwellings so that they may intercede for us at our death. Jesus is here encouraging us to generosity and almsgiving. Use money in order to give generously and you will have intercessors in heaven when the time comes for you to die.

Jesus takes advantage of the parable to point out the true meaning of money. A person cannot serve two masters, namely, God and mammon, or money. There are people who come close to this kind of idolatry every day. If we possess money, it is given to us not so that we should become attached to it as though it was something of unqualified value but so that we might share it. To cling to money is to show that we have not really understood God and the absolute values he embodies. We are bidden, therefore, to use money but also to be detached from it.
