## PARTNERS IN MISSION

*LBIM intentionally partners with sister church missionaries in God's mission to the nations. The following story highlights one of these partner missionaries. Haruya Ito, works together with Dean & Linda Bengtson in Japan as Church Planting Pastor at Ishinomaki House of Hope.*

It's been half a year already since I came to House of Hope, but Ishinomaki has been a special place for me ever since the disasters of 2011. Since then, I often visited to help with concerts and events. I sensed the suffering and sadness of the people there and felt God calling me to share his love with them. Later I found out Dean and Linda had been praying fervently that I would come to Ishinomaki. Now I feel very glad to have come here.

When I finished seminary and moved to Ishinomaki, God gave me a special "word of hope" from Jeremiah 29:11. As I started ministry in this new place, I felt a mixture of anxiety and anticipation. It takes time, but gradually I am deepening relationships with neighbors by participating in neighborhood activities and spending time visiting homes. As a musician, music is an important part of my ministry. Early on I became friends with a local musician, Morioka-san, and we started practicing guitar together every week. We formed a "duo" and have already performed several times.

I was really excited to start ministry in Ishinomaki this spring, but we soon ran into a big problem. The parking lot adjacent to the House of Hope, which we had used free in exchange for maintenance, was suddenly put up for sale. To lose the parking area would be a huge blow. After much prayer and discussion, we decided to try a 2 ½ month



crowdfunding campaign. It was a lot of money for us, and we prayed continually, asking God for help. When the deadline came, we had received just a little MORE than we needed! Then I had to repent. While Dean and Linda were praying in faith for the whole amount, I was hoping God would provide... well, maybe about half of what we needed. Instead, God provided more than enough. I was able to experience that God is alive, he knows our needs, and he is able to meet them.

Looking back, I have seen many of God's wonderful miracles in the past six months. I believe that I will continue to see many more. The important thing is not to stop. With God's help, we will keep on going and trust him to save souls in his timing. It is my hope to continue deepening friendships with the people of Ishinomaki and speaking with them about God's love. We are thankful for God's mercy, and your prayers and support.
