From our pastor

On Sunday we had our annual meeting to report on ministries and elect new elders and deacons. This is my report to the congregation.

Dear Covenant,

We have had quite a year, and the best part about it is that we did it *together*! After 17 months of separation due to the pandemic, it was time to gather once again. We began the program year with a service of healing where anyone who had been hurt over the past few years at Covenant were welcomed to bring that grief into worship and ask God for healing. It was an evening of music, prayer, meditation, and reconciliation. The following Sunday, for the first time in a long time, Covenant began worshipping together with one service as one church. We welcomed back our own members to their church home. Here are a few highlights from the year:

• We instituted intergenerational worship, altering the sanctuary, so that children could have the best seats in the house. Erin Wise created worship toolkits, so that our youngest members can actively participate in worship, not merely sit quietly. Our hope is to find more and more ways to have all generations participating in worship together.

• Music brings people together, which is exactly what our music ministry did this year. The diversity of music that Cherie and Katie brought to us has been extraordinary from classics to contemporary, and music from across the world. The chancel choir, the bell choir, and our singers have blessed us all. Covenant has a legacy of great music, and this year was no exception.

• Our Technology ministry took significant steps forward. We updated our<u>website</u> and improved our online worship. We installed a screen in the sanctuary and are currently installing new equipment that will allow worship to be streamed in the Fellowship Hall, the Lounge, the hallway, and more. Technology was a lifeline during the pandemic and remains a significant way for people to connect with church. We will continue to find ways to utilize it in our facility and online.

• Session created the Welcoming and Inclusion Taskforce whose purpose is to help Covenant welcome people of all sexual orientations, gender identities, and races. The Taskforce supported my class on *The Bible's Yes to Same Sex Marriage*, which gave a Biblical and theological framework for inclusion. Their work is ongoing, as they canvas our membership to see where we are as a church.

• In May, we were visited by The Rev. Brian Ellison, the Executive Director of <u>The Covenant Network of</u> <u>Presbyterians</u>. Brian taught an excellent workshop on "Becoming an Inclusive Church" and preached a powerful sermon in worship.

We said goodbye to Ingrid Smith and welcomed Tanvi Bhowmik as our Financial Administrator. We also

welcomed Rev. Don and Rev. Janice Hilkerbaumer as Parish Associates.

• The incredible mission and outreach ministries of our church continued unabated. Food is delivered to people in need through our SOS Food Pantry. Meals are created and served every month at Hoge Presbyterian Church, CATCH Court, The Open Shelter, and the Ronald McDonald House. Covenant helped Habitat for Humanity build yet another home, and the Seeds of Hope Community Garden continues to grow hundreds of pounds of fresh produce to First Community Church's Food Pantry. In a world where we can be divided over so many things, we unite around being a source of help and hope to those in need.

• Covenant's generosity was on full display this year. We gave over \$28,000 to Presbytery Mission Giving, more than any other church in our Presbytery. In total we gave more than \$62,000 toward mission, and Covenant Presbyterian Women gave an additional \$12,000. Behind every dollar given, families have been housed, hungry people fed, lives touched and changed in our community and across the world.

Though much has changed over the past few years, Covenant remains a stable presence of love, worship, and service. Together we continue to live out our mission as an accepting, welcoming community, sharing the glory of God's love with all. I cannot wait to see what God has in store for us as we pursue this mission together.

Report of the Clerk

Session met Wednesday September 21st for a Called meeting.

The purpose: To listen and respond to Properties Commission's proposal to repave Covenant's parking lot. Moderator Esala opened the meeting at 6:30 pm with prayer

Joel and members of the Properties Commission presented two quotes from Shealy Paving to repave Covenant's parking lot. The first quote for \$7,615 would repair and repave the west entry into the parking lot. The second quote for \$87,780 would repave all of Covenant's parking lot including the west entry area.

Joel informed Session there is \$90K left over from our last Capital Campaign and those dollars were ear marked for the parking lot and improving the bathrooms. Joel told Session we will find the dollars to complete the bathroom project as proposed.

Session unanimously approved the quote to pave all of Covenant's parking lot and instructed Properties to sign the contract with Shealy Paving.

Properties indicated Shealy intends to begin paving early in November.

Lynn Elliott asked Session to approve CPW's request to have a bake sale in December and her request was approved

Moderator Esala closed the meeting at 7 pm with prayer.

Session's next meeting will be Monday October 10 at 6:30 pm.

Assistance - Ukraine

We are grateful for the outpouring of prayers and calls from congregations and individuals asking how they can help. As the violence continues, the number of people being displaced internally and fleeing to neighboring countries increases by the day. And in the midst of the chaos, there are sibling churches and ecumenical partners who are already providing assistance with basic items for survival. Our first

priority as PDA is to provide funding to these partners on the ground. While the scale of this crisis is new, receiving refugees from Ukraine and other countries in Central and Eastern Europe is not, which means we have trusted, established partners with the knowledge and expertise to carry out this important work.

We are hearing that the reformed churches in Ukraine and the region are also feeling called to join in the humanitarian response. PDA, therefore, anticipates that our response will include both financial and technical assistance as the network of faith communities providing humanitarian assistance grows in the months ahead.

As we pray for an end to this violence, we ask the U.S. Government and our European allies to make a commitment to the Ukrainian people for a peaceful solution. We don't know how long it will take, but we know that they will need help with the rebuilding of their country so that those who are fleeing now may one day return home safely.

CATCH COURT and Freedom a la Cart

For many years, Covenant members have made efforts to support programs for women who were trafficked and who are trying to recover their lives especially through CATCH Court's program. Each month, we take lunch for 55 people to CATCH Court on the first Thursday of the month. After serving lunch we have the option to stay to observe court in action. This is always inspiring because there is so much love, courage and determination expressed and you are invited to be part of this!

We have also provided resources such a toiletry bags and clothing for Freedom a la Cart which provides training for women in catering, food preparation and restaurant operations. Helping women regain drivers' licensing and providing activities for CATCH Court graduates, Butterflies, are among the many services we can help support. In December we will host the annual Christmas party for the CATCH women.

We recently watched the graduation ceremony for 12 women who were graduating from CATCH. The State House Atrium was filled with celebrants! Each woman was introduced, and each had the opportunity to say a few words. Judges, court workers, volunteers, friends and family cheered each one. It was a special day! Opportunity to Serve by Providing Lunch through the OPEN SHELTER

Do you want to do hands-on mission once a month or occasionally? We would love to welcome new people to the Open Shelter Lunch Making Team!

Join us! You could shop in advance, prep in advance on a Thursday, join the team that works together on a Friday morning, or deliver the finished product on a second Friday morning at 9:10. We'd love to expand the team of people involved to create the lunches for **Friday**, **October 14th** and in any future month

Covenant helps out people in need (including the homeless) served by the Open Shelter by providing 175 sack lunches on the **second Friday of every month**. We revised the menu and process, and we need more volunteers to help out! Here are ways to join in:

- Anytime, you could **drop off your clean, lidded take-out containers** (reusable disposable food containers) to shelving on the counter under the windows of Covenant's kitchen. We take them to the Open Shelter to help people take home leftovers from donated restaurant meals. When these meals are donated, people are encouraged to take sack lunches with them to-go as well.
- You could help with supplies for the sack lunches; we would let you know the quantity, and you'd deliver them to Covenant's kitchen by the Thursday before the delivery day (church closes at 4pm) or by the second Friday of the month at 8:15, when we assemble the sack lunches. The costs for these supplies may be reimbursed by submitting your receipts to our Financial Administrator, Tanvi Bhowmik. Ways to help include:
- You could **shop** for supplies (like paper bags and napkins from GFS, drinks, plastic bags, sandwich makings, bananas...)
- You could make 45 or 90 bags of unsalted nuts at your home.
- You could make 45 or 90 bags of baby carrots at your home.
- You could make **30 Peanut Butter and Jelly sandwiches** at your home.
- You could help make 160 ham and cheese sandwiches with the team at Covenant's kitchen, and then assemble the lunches into paper bags and pack them in boxes and into a car (or two) between 8:15 and 9:10 am on the second Friday of the month.
- You could transport the lunches and other supplies from Covenant to the Open Shelter on Parsons

Ave. by 9:30 on the second Friday of the month. This takes either two drivers or one driver with a minivan.

By splitting up the work, we can get more people involved sharing the Love of Christ in our community. Join us!

Hoge Presbyterian Church offers the HM3 program every Saturday for its community in Franklinton including Music, Message, and a Meal. Area churches assist with the Meal, and Covenant creates and serves a hot,

home-made meal every 3rd Saturday. The wearing of masks is optional for both servers and guests.

Current attendance at HM3 leads us to bring enough for 50 meals.

- In the past, Covenant members cooked in their own homes and then brought the food to Hoge to serve from the Hoge Kitchen. Alternatively, you can prepare the food as a group in the Covenant kitchen and carry it to Hoge. For example, in April and June, teams prepared most of the meal in the Covenant Kitchen as a team activity and then brought the food to Hoge.
- Groups have signed up to serve in the months throughout the year of 2022 and for January 21, 2023... THANK YOU! Group leaders: If your group is lacking servers or chefs, let Cathy know; she has contacts for volunteers who can join your team. Chefs: Your expenses incurred in cooking may be reimbursed through our Financial Administrator, Tanvi Bhowmik.
- If you or your kids would like to help outas a chef and/or server (from 4-7pm) during one of those 3rd Saturdays where a group already is signed up, go ahead and contact that groups' leader, we'll bet they would LOVE to include you on the team! You can find the leader's name on the website, or you can ask Cathy Levy, and she'll connect you up.


