NPC FINANCE UPDATE

It's Fall and that means we're into a new budget year here at NPC and an opportunity to see how God will work through the giving of His people to accomplish His mission here in the North Hills of Pittsburgh and around the world. Giving over the past budget year (ended August) totaled \$1,078,421 and expenses totaled \$1,155,994 which enabled:

- over \$150,000 of missionary support
- our staff to lead several areas of ministry
- over \$200,000 of campus maintenance and capital projects (including a new digital sound board)
- funding the ministries of the church aimed at our Worship Connect Impact mission statement
- and many other things!

Thank you for your support of this tremendous ministry work over the past year, both in your giving and in your service!

This year's budget, which was presented at the August Congregational Meeting, is \$1,198,250. In an inflationary environment, your leaders are keeping the budgeted expenses at less than a 4% increase from last year's actual costs. But to make this budget a reality, Session is asking for an 11% increase to last year's giving so as to not dip further into our limited cash reserves. The Session knows that this is a big ask, but asks that you be in prayer about your giving and for the operational decisions that need to be made throughout the year to steward the level of giving received.


Also mentioned in the Congregational Meeting, Session is contemplating how to act based on the recommendations of a team of congregants that evaluated ways to enhance the use of our upper building area (commonly known as the Blue Room) to transform the way ministry is done here at NPC for the next generation. This would be a substantial investment in the future and is beyond the budget approved for this year. Please also be in prayer for the Session as they seek the wisdom of the Lord in this matter. Hopefully, you'll be hearing more about the path forward soon!

In addition, pray for discernment as evaluating candidates in interview settings doesn't always provide a full picture. Finally, pray for the current adult leadership team that has just been doing an amazing job creating an energizing and fun atmosphere for the students.

Back in May we asked you to fill out a survey about **PBJ** to help us evaluate how to move forward. Many of you answered this call and provided us with some great feedback. THANK YOU!

We'd like to share some of what we learned from the survey with you, both to encourage you and to spur you on in your **PBJ** endeavors.

- 48% of you said that you are **PRAY**ing more for non-Christians
- 46% of you said that you are **BLESS**ing (Affirm, Give, Eat, Listen, Serve) more
- 37% of you said that you have been more willing to share **JESUS** with others

We are thankful for this spiritual growth and look forward to more.

We also are extremely grateful for your critiques and creative ideas. Here are some of your ideas that we are planning to implement this year:

- Focus more on the outreach & JESUS portion
- Offer trainings and more instruction on how to share **JESUS**

- · Look at what other churches are doing

- Nile River: 548,988 school buses long






Also, we have been working on giving kids an opportunity to talk to God each week in our Younger Kids Kids' Worship class. Here are some of the questions that have been asked recently:

TASTE OF ALPHA

In October, you'll get the chance to experience Alpha for yourself and make that assessment. On October 2, 9, 16, and 23 from 6:30-8:30 P.M. we are going to offer a sampling of Alpha, and we want everyone in the church to plan to come to at least one of those evenings and hopefully to all of them. We will be offering this concurrently with Youth Group, so parents can plan to attend while their kids are at YG. Childcare will be offered for children 11 and under.

This "Taste of Alpha" experience is designed for our church members, and the purpose is to make sure North Park people experience Alpha firsthand as a safe place so we would be comfortable inviting our friends and neighbors to it in the future.

What will happen at a Taste of Alpha? It will look a lot like a normal Alpha meeting. We will begin with a meal where we spend time developing and deepening relationships, even if you think you already know the people sitting with you.
