OUR STEWARDSHIP STORY

Someone once defined "Stewardship" as everything, once we say yes to Jesus! I think it is the best definition ever and it really gets to the heart of what our October 4 week worship series is all about. We have entitled it "Our Stewardship Story" and will focus on 4 aspects of what defines the rhythm of stewardship in a person's life . . . Remember . . . Release . . . Re-Imagine . . . and Restore.

Each week starting Oct. 2 we will seek to unpack a little of the rhythm that shapes and defines our life of stewardship. For example, it may begin with remembering but that is only one part of the story. In addition to the Sunday worship focus, we will also be offering a class each Tuesday at 1:30pm in the fellowship hall. Our class time will provide an opportunity to unpack and discuss on a deeper level some of issues brought up in various Sunday messages. We sincerely hope you will make time to join us on Tuesdays, Oct. 4, 11, 18 & 25 to deepen your understanding and experience of Our Stewardship Story.

In addition, we are focusing on some of our senior congregational members stewardship expressions. We have so many precious seniors whose very lives are a reflection of stewardship and commitment at Trinity. We are intentionally reaching out to have them share some of their stories of stewardship and leadership over the years. We are preparing a series of videos in order to hear more about their service, giving and remembering. Come each Sunday to listen in as they each tell their story!

It is important to know we all have a stewardship story, whether we recognize it or not. Sometimes we are living from a story of fear or shame. Or a story that the church is disconnected from the real world and no longer relevant. Or a story that our actions won't have an impact. Or a story that we don't have enough. So during the month of October we are going to be asking where might God be speaking a new narrative into the limited ones we have often told ourselves? This theme and series invites us to discover and tell our stewardship stories in light of God's stewardship story of invitation, liberation and justice. We hope everyone will be inspired to transform our stewardship practices into more full expressions of who we are and what we believe.

This stewardship season, we invite you to remember, release, reimagine, and restore your story and understanding of stewardship so that we can write the one God is calling and inviting us to live into.

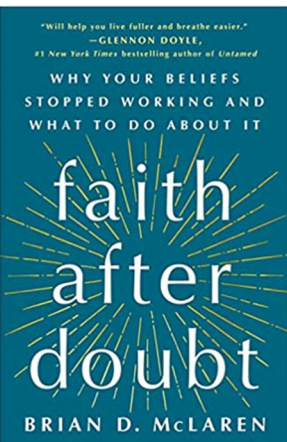

On November 3rd, the Thursday 1pm book study at Northwoods will begin a new book entitled *Faith after Doubt* by Brian McLaren.

Sixty-five million adults in the U.S. have dropped out of active church attendance and about 2.7 million more are leaving every year. *Faith After Doubt* is for the millions of people around the world who feel that their faith is falling apart.

Using his own story and the stories of a diverse group of struggling believers, Brian D. McLaren, a former pastor and now an author, speaker, and activist shows how old assumptions are being challenged in nearly every area of human life, not just theology and spirituality. He proposes a four-stage model of faith development in which questions and doubt are not the enemy of faith, but rather a portal to a more mature and fruitful kind of faith. The four stages—Simplicity, Complexity, Perplexity, and Harmony—offer a path forward that can help sincere and thoughtful people leave behind unnecessary baggage and intensify their commitment to what matters most.

Even if your faith is strong, this study will help you understand why numerous people are leaving the church and will also help you make connections and new friendships! All are welcome!

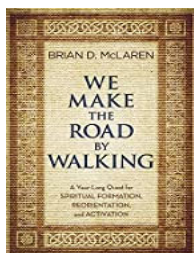

From the hearts of the members of Trinity Lutheran in Lindstrom, Minnesota to children around the world, God's love has the opportunity to be experienced. Christmas can come in the form of small gifts in a shoe box. Since 1993, more than 198 million shoe boxes have been delivered to children in 170 countries and territories, along with the Gospel being shared. The children learn that Jesus is God's greatest gift to all people and that is why we celebrate Christmas. For many children the items in the shoe box are the only ones they have that belong personally to them. Parents do not have money to buy toys, so their playthings are the animals on the farm, or they live in orphanages where all things are communal property.

Trinity is participating in the Operation Christmas Child project in 2022. Look for the box in the Fellowship Hall. On the box is a list of suggested items. Items must be new as no used items can be accepted. It cost \$9 to mail each shoebox and the October Second Sunday Offering has been designated for Operation Christmas Child, although other monetary donations are also appreciated. 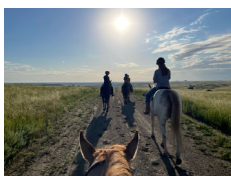

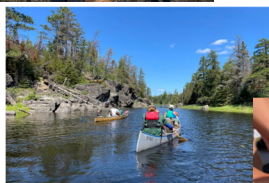
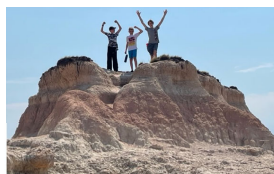

Building Renovation Committee Update

Here's the latest news I know about the building renovation:

Sanctuary Roof and Garage:

1. Shingling of the sanctuary roof is expected to be completed today (Wednesday) and work on the garage will be started.
2. So far there has not been any roof decking that needed to be replaced so it has been going well.
3. Access to the building via the Choir door is expected to be available for the Thursday coat fair.
4. The dumpsters should be out of the parking lot by end of the day Friday.

Flat Roof:

1. The rock was vacuumed off the flat roof on Friday September 23rd.
2. A dumpster and roofing materials are scheduled to arrive tomorrow (Thursday).
3. Removal of the existing tarred flat roof is scheduled to start Friday and continue for the next week.
4. Most of the noise from this project will occur in the morning when the workers are cutting and removing the tarred roof. The afternoons should be relatively quiet. North Tech said there should not be any reason the fellowship hall cannot be used during the construction if people can tolerate the noise.
5. Work is expected to be completed each day around 4 pm, unless there is something that keeps them longer.
6. Access to Trinity via the fellowship door will likely be blocked from Friday through all of next week. Access to Trinity through the main ramp entrance should be available by Thursday.
7. Scott Mower has been notified so that he can come to Trinity to check on the progress.

HVAC:

1. Aerotek will be coordinating with North Tech for the removal of the roof top units and other A/C on the flat roof. They will also disconnect the gas line if needed.
2. Trevor Kirsch, from Mountain Man Electric, will be doing the electrical work for the HVAC systems. He and Jason from Aerotek were at Trinity on Tuesday to look at the electrical systems and for Trevor to provide Trinity with an estimate for the electrical work.
3. Most of the HVAC equipment has been ordered and is arriving except for the boilers for the Sanctuary which has not come in yet and the commercial HRV's which have a 12-week lead time.
4. Aerotek is planning to start the HVAC installation after the Path-to-Home ends by October 16th and will be working through November with the installations.

Architect:

Progressive Architecture has received the signed work order and Scott will be calling the office next week to schedule a time to do the physical measurements.

TOPIC: *The Web of Life

Genesis 2:15 tells us, "The Lord placed the man in the Garden of Eden to tend and watch over it." Our very first call from God was to tend the garden. Other than taking care of each other, there is no more important thing we can do than tend the garden, our Earth, as it was divinely and perfectly created by God. Ever since the last glacier receded from this land the plants, animals, insects, and even bacteria in the soil and water have been forming symbiotic relationships—meaning they have evolved together and depend on each other for life. When we bring non-native plants and animals into an ecosystem, it can disrupt the crucial balance that all life living there depends on.

According to Science Magazine, since the 1970's North America has lost over 3 billion birds, nearly 30% of the total. Some causes are habitat loss and ecosystem demise. There has been a 53% loss (700 million adults) of grassland birds in that same time period. Bees are experiencing a similar fate. Millions of bees are dying due to loss of habitat, pesticides (neonicotinoids), and parasites (the varroa mite). The garden is suffering and needs our tending.

Today and in the future, I can:

- Volunteer with a county park or environmental protection group, ie; "Friends of the Mississippi River" or "Great River Greening".
- Learn about sustaining wildlife with native plants in my yard with books like "Bringing Nature Home" by Douglas Tallamy or "Pollinators of Native Plants or Bees" by Heather Holm.
- Provide food and water for birds.
- Plant native plants, ie; White Oak and River Birch trees, Prairie Willow shrubs, Milkweed or Meadow Blazing Star perennials, and Little Bluestem and Prairie Dropseed grasses, to name just a few.
- Install a rain garden to capture precious precipitation.
