*Angel of God, my guardian dear, to whom God's love commits me here,
ever this day, be at my side to light and guard, to rule and guide.*

If it wasn't a Sunday today would be the Memorial of the Guardian Angels. Some of our readers may remember the old prayer to the guardian angels from their younger years. Even though we may not speak about them so often these days the angels remain an important part of God's work of creation and salvation. Here are some reasons why you might like to include them in your view of the world.

Guardian angels are the expression of God's care for each and every one of his children. He created a being whose sole purpose is to look out for me and care for me. In Newman's *Dream of Gerontius* the angel leads the soul through the heavenly hosts into God's presence, and when it arrives she sings out "Alleluia! My work is done!".

Angels are a reminder that God's work of creation extends beyond the visible world. That there are things even more wonderful and glorious that we cannot see. Sometimes we make our world simply too small.

The angels are part of the heavenly host ('army'). When we celebrate Mass we call to mind their work of praise of God and join in with their song. They are creatures who dedicate themselves to serving God.

Angels remind us of the importance of our senses. Being purely spiritual beings they have knowledge that comes to them directly whereas we get our through our senses. Films such as *City of Angels* capture this quite well in their depiction of how angels – though spiritually closer to God – lack the blessings of our senses. And as we draw the season of creation to a close perhaps we might take inspiration and make the most of the turn of the year to expose all our senses to the full wonder of God's creation.
