On the Anointing of the Sick

Being a bear of very little brain, one of my favourite books at the moment is *YouCat for Kids*. It talks about the Anointing of the Sick as "a meeting point where God, with his strength comes to the aid of those who are sick and have lost their strength". It continues, "The gospels report that Jesus took particular care of the sick; he healed many, many people in body and soul. Sick people can still feel God's love today through the Anointing of the Sick. In the priest Jesus himself is standing at the sick person's bedside... You can receive the Anointing of the Sick if you are seriously ill, especially when the condition is worsening. It does not matter if you are old or young. In serious spiritual need or before an operation people also ask for the Anointing of the Sick."

It may be helpful to say a little more about what is meant by seriously ill. David Power says that "the sacrament is for those who, being clinically ill, undergo serious spiritual crisis, making it difficult for them to sustain faith and hope, and to live human life with resolution and dignity". Lizette Larson-Miller in her commentary on the rite draws attention to the way in which "chronic illnesses such as mental illnesses and severe alcoholism, long-term and frequently terminal illnesses such as AIDS and cancer, as well as debilitating diseases such as Alzheimer's, have generally come to be seen in pastoral circles as appropriate occasions for anointing, even repeated anointing throughout the course of the illness". In summary, I think if one is clinically ill and the illness significantly impacts your life or you are worried that it may do then it is entirely appropriate to seek this special means of grace.

Sacraments are all actions of the Body of Christ and there will be an opportunity later this month both to seek this Sacrament and to offer our prayers and support for those who do so. If you feel the need of this sacrament or wish to discuss any aspect of it at any other time, please feel free to approach Fr Jonathan or Fr Rajesh. If you are going into hospital it is often easier to arrange its celebration before you are admitted.
