From our pastor

"Two people went up to the temple to pray. One was a Pharisee and the other a tax collector...I tell you, this person went down to his home justified rather than [alongside] the Pharisee. All who lift themselves up will be brought low, and those who make themselves low will be lifted up." Luke 18:10, 14

Humans love dividing the world in two: good guys and bad guys, have and have nots, the light side of the force and the dark, right and left, Buckeye fans and the wicked. You get the idea. We call this dualistic thinking, wherein we imagine the problem with the world to be out there in some other identifiable group of people. Naturally most of us imagine ourselves to be on the good side. Jesus tells the parable of the Pharisee and the tax-collector to address this problem. The Pharisee thanks God for not being like other sinful people, while the tax-collector prays to God for mercy. Then Jesus seems to say that only the tax collector went home justified by God. Is this parable a simple reversal of expectations? Is it merely that the good guy is really a bad guy, and the bad guy is a good guy? I don't think so. This only replaces one dualism with another. We still end up in a worldview where humanity is divided in two, and it's our job to end up on the good side, the humble side.

Greek is a tricky language. Prepositions in Greek can mean many different things, which can be confusing. When Jesus says, "this person went down to his home justified rather than the Pharisee," that word "rather" is *para* in Greek and can just as easily be translated "alongside." Hear how different that would sound,"this person went down to his home justified alongside the Pharisee." Here's a radical thought, what if both are justified by God, the good and the bad, the saint and the sinner alike? That would undo all our dualisms once and for all. That would be a true Reformation.

This Monday marks 505 years from when Martin Luther posted his 95 Theses on the church door in Wittenberg, thus beginning the Protestant Reformation. Luther had a famous Latin phrase that he coined, saying we are "Simul justus et Peccator," simultaneously justified and sinner. To be justified by God is to be declared good enough, made right, in the family of God. The good news is that's how God views you—holy, righteous, and good. At the same time, you still mess things up, don't you? Despite all my strivings, I'm still a sinner, and I don't have to pretend like I'm not. The truth is that both live in me—the Pharisee and the tax collector, the saint and the sinner. The goal is not to become one and condemn the other, for to condemn one is to condemn ourselves because we are both at the same time. God loves all sinners and saints and justifies them alongside each other. That's what I call good news. Happy Reformation Day!



Before her eyes, the fragile community of Jerusalem opens, and she starts to build her family to outlast the chaos. But as her son grows, so do the military checkpoints and bomb sirens, and Stephanie must learn to bridge the gap between safety and home, always questioning her choice to start her family and raise her child in a country at war."



CATCH COURT and Freedom a la Cart

For many years, Covenant members have made efforts to support programs for women who were trafficked and who are trying to recover their lives especially through CATCH Court's program. Each month, we take lunch for 55 people to CATCH Court on the first Thursday of the month. After serving lunch we have the option to stay to observe court in action. This is always inspiring because there is so much love, courage and determination expressed by the women, and you are invited to be part of this!

We have also provided resources such a toiletry bags and clothing for Freedom a la Cart which provides training for women in catering, food preparation and restaurant operations. Helping women regain drivers' licensing and providing activities for CATCH Court graduates, Butterflies, are among the many services we can help support. In December we will host the annual Christmas party for the CATCH women.

Opportunity to Serve by Providing Lunch through the OPEN SHELTER

Do you want to do hands-on mission once a month or occasionally? We would love to welcome new people to the Open Shelter Lunch Making Team!

Many thanks to the great group who worked together to shop, pre-assemble, work as a team on Friday morning to prepare the sack lunches, and/or deliver the lunches and supplies for Friday, October 14th!! What

fun to work in community to share the Glory of God's Love with our.... community!

Join us! There are so many ways to get involved (see below). Our next delivery date is **Friday**, **November 11th** and you can help in any future month

Covenant helps out people in need (including the homeless) served by the Open Shelter by providing 175 sack lunches on the **second Friday of every month**. We revised the menu and process, and we need more volunteers to help out! Here are ways to join in:

- Anytime, you could **drop off your clean**, **lidded take-out containers** (reusable disposable food containers) to shelving on the counter under the windows of Covenant's kitchen. We take them to the Open Shelter to help people take home leftovers from donated restaurant meals. When these meals are donated, people are encouraged to take sack lunches with them to-go as well.
- You could help with supplies for the sack lunches; we would let you know the quantity, and you'd
 deliver them to Covenant's kitchen by the Thursday before the delivery day (church closes at 4pm) or
 by the second Friday of the month at 8:15, when we assemble the sack lunches. The costs for these
 supplies may be reimbursed by submitting your receipts to our Financial Administrator, Tanvi
 Bhowmik. Ways to help include:
- You could shop for supplies (like paper bags and napkins from GFS, drinks, plastic bags, sandwich makings, bananas...)
- You could make 45 or 90 bags of unsalted nuts at your home.
- You could make 45 or 90 bags of baby carrots at your home.
- You could make 30 Peanut Butter and Jelly sandwiches at your home.
- You could help make 160 ham and cheese sandwiches with the team at Covenant's kitchen, and then assemble the lunches into paper bags and pack them in boxes and into a car (or two) between 8:00 and 9:10 am on the second Friday of the month.
- You could **transport** the lunches and other supplies from Covenant to the Open Shelter on Parsons Ave. by 9:30 on the second Friday of the month. This takes either two drivers or one driver with a larger hatchback car or minivan.

By splitting up the work, we can get more people involved sharing the Love of Christ in our community. Join us!
