Thirty First Sunday in Ordinary Time 30th October 2022

We celebrate this Tuesday the great Solemnity of All Saints and then move into the month of the Holy Souls in which our prayer turns in particular to our departed brothers and sisters. We give praise and thanks to the Father for those holy women and men who support us with their prayers and offer an example for our lives and we pray for the forgiveness of sins and beatitude of those who have died.

In his plan for our diocese Bishop Richard speaks about our parishes becoming *communities of saints*. I spoke at Fr Michael's funeral about our being a pilgrim people rather more than a perfect society. One of the other great ideas at the Second Vatican Council sixty years ago was the "universal call to holiness". There is always a temptation to leave certain things to specialists: to think the teacher is responsible for our learning (and that we don't need to do that homework) or that the doctor or medical professional is responsible for our health (and so we don't need to work to live a healthy lifestyle). Some are very happy to leave things they see as religious to priests and nuns and get on with the rest of life. The truth is that holiness of life is the only path to true happiness for each and every human being – it is not the preserve of the specialist. That is why every Christian is called to be a saint.

Ten years ago, when he visited this country, Pope Benedict addressed our school children in "The Big Assembly" saying that God wanted them to his friends, who would reflect something of his infinite goodness in their own lives, and thus be holy saints, feeling compassion for people in difficulties and eager to do something to help them.

More recently in the wonderfully encouraging letter on everyday holiness (*Gaudete et Exsultate*) Pope Francis presents an idea of what it might mean for ordinary human beings, not 'plaster-cast' saints. He writes, "I like to contemplate the holiness present in the patience of God's people: in those parents who raise their children with immense love, in those men and women who work hard to support their families, in the sick, in elderly religious who never lose their smile. In their daily perseverance I see the holiness of the Church militant. Very often it is a holiness found in our next-door neighbours, those who, living in our midst, reflect God's presence. We might call them 'the middle class of holiness'".

This is the invitation that God makes to each and every one of us. It is my hope that our parish will be a community which will transform each of us into such everyday saints, endowed with the virtues of courage and fortitude, radiating the Father's great love into every part of our world.
