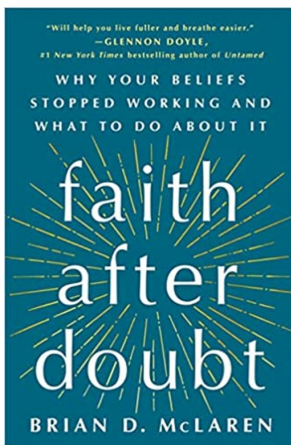

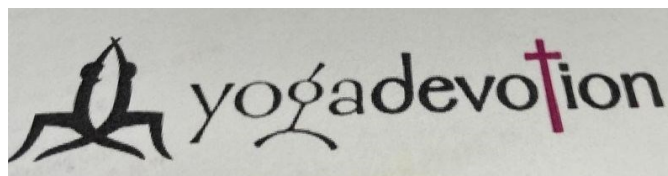

On November 3rd, the Thursday 1pm book study at Northwoods will begin a new book entitled *Faith after Doubt* by Brian McLaren.

Sixty-five million adults in the U.S. have dropped out of active church attendance and about 2.7 million more are leaving every year. *Faith After Doubt* is for the millions of people around the world who feel that their faith is falling apart.

Using his own story and the stories of a diverse group of struggling believers, Brian D. McLaren, a former pastor and now an author, speaker, and activist shows how old assumptions are being challenged in nearly every area of human life, not just theology and spirituality. He proposes a four-stage model of faith development in which questions and doubt are not the enemy of faith, but rather a portal to a more mature and fruitful kind of faith. The four stages—Simplicity, Complexity, Perplexity, and Harmony—offer a path forward that can help sincere and thoughtful people leave behind unnecessary baggage and intensify their commitment to what matters most. Even if your faith is strong, this study will help you understand why numerous people are leaving the church and will also help you make connections and new friendships! All are welcome!

Anonymous Santa

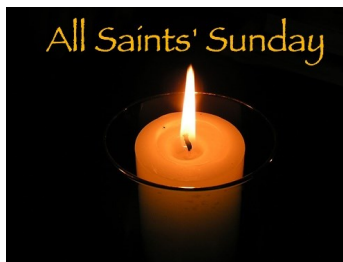

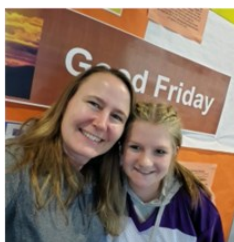

TOPIC: "SOLAR FAQs"

**Psalm 113:3****"From the Rising of the Sun to the place where it sets, the name of the Lord is to be praised"**

Solar panels are made up of photovoltaic cells that convert sunlight into electricity.

Electricity created by the solar array (a group of panels) flows out of the panels in Direct Current (DC) form. Most homes, churches, other establishment buildings can only use electricity that is in Alternating Current (AC) form. As a result, an inverter that converts the electricity from DC to AC is a necessary component of a solar installation. A single solar panel does not produce enough electricity to power a home or other building, so multiple solar panels are wired together to create the solar array that is used to produce the required amount of electricity for each solar project (installation).

Solar panels can be mounted on the roof of the building, or on the ground. The electricity generated travels through the inverter, is converted into AC electricity, and connects through the main electric panel in the building. It will be used on the specific site it is made, and any excess electricity will flow out through the electric meter and onto the local grid. Solar is a minimum maintenance technology. The system contains no moving parts, which means the equipment is not likely to fail.

The electrical capacity of each solar panel is measured in watts (W). The typical solar panel is rated at 250W to 320W. To get the total power (in watts) of the solar array, the wattages of each panel is added together. For example, if ten 300W panels are installed, the total wattage of the system would be equal to 3,000W. 1000W is equivalent to 1 kilowatt (kW), so another way to describe the size of that system is 3kW. How large the solar array is, depends on the amount of electricity the building will use, the size and orientation of the roof, and person or business budget.

Solar panels are typically considered a 25 year investment. Panels will continue to produce electricity after 25 years, but at a slowly decreasing rate over time.
