Departing Pastors and their Congregations

The Presbytery Committee on Ministry has instituted a policy to assist former pastors, new pastors and church members in maintaining healthy and professional boundaries. A primary provision states that "On and after the effective date of the dissolution of the pastoral relationship . . . the pastor (a) shall not perform pastoral functions in the church, except when invited by the moderator of session and clerk of session, and (b) shall not otherwise participate in the life and work of the church during the interim time and at least one year following the arrival of the new installed or contract pastor Please take time to read the entire policy and brief interpretation here. Living with Creation

The average American uses 80 - 100 gal of water a day. Consider reducing your water consumption by 1) taking shorter showers (5 min. max), 2) installing water saving toilets, 3) turning off tap while brushing teeth, washing hands, washing dishes, etc. and 4) fixing leaky taps, pipes, and toilets. Changes in these areas can amount to significant savings.


