Krista Webb Ministry Update

To the family of believers at Beth Eden Baptist Church:

It is a joy to write to you all once again and share what God has been doing here in Cojutepeque, El Salvador. It continues to amaze me how God brought me here. And it is my prayer to make the most of the opportunities He's given me to serve in this special place.

At the beginning of the October we had the privilege of welcoming two new, short-term interns from Honduras to our team. Both are seminary students from Bethlehem Baptist Seminary in Danlí, Honduras and are fulfilling their internship requirement with us before their graduation in December. I've been especially able to get to know Mirian (one of the newcomers) very well as she's joined me and another intern at the house where we've been staying. Her heart for lost souls has been especially impactful.

During Mirian and I's first weekend together, while getting caught in the rain on a Sunday afternoon at the park, we met a woman selling slushies who let us find shelter from the rain under her umbrella. After chatting and getting to know the woman a bit, it became clear that the woman had a fear of God and, to our surprise, had come across various women from the Emmanuel Baptist Church who had previously invited her to attend. By the end of the conversation, we were able to explain to her

God's plan of salvation and the woman prayed to receive Christ in her heart. We thank God for the wonderful and unexpected ways that He works and for putting His people in the right place at the right time!

When it comes to the school side of ministry, October was my busiest month yet. With the final week of school being the last week of October, there was much preparation to be done for final exams and final projects. Thankfully, both staff and students successfully made it through the hustle and bustle of the end of the school year and were able to enjoy some special moments along the way. We praise God that during the week of Emmanuel Baptist Church's mission's conference, 13 students accepted Christ during the times that were set aside for chapel services. Various students attended the mission's conference during the weekend as well. The messages that were preached during the conference were both challenging and encouraging. I personally left assured and excited to continue serving in ministry and missions and was reminded of how sweet and weighty the work of the great commission is (Matt. 28:18-20, Romans 10:15).



Representing different countries

As we finished up our work in the classroom for the year I, and various members of the school and church staff, had the opportunity to attend an inperson seminary class taught by Dr. Mike Lester, President of Veritas Baptist College in Greendale, Indiana. Dr. Lester traveled down to Cojutepeque for about one week and taught both an Old Testament class and a class on the book of Hebrews. Due to my teaching schedule I was only able to take the Old Testament class in-person. Thankfully, all of the sessions were recorded so I will be able to take the class on Hebrews later online.

I am exceedingly grateful for the opportunities I've had here to not only serve but to learn and to grow. This past month I also started taking piano lessons with the Pastor's wife, Esther Fridenstine. At the end of the month traveled with a group of women from the church to attend a women's conference at a church in Metapán, El Salvador. Although the first sessions of the conference were primarily geared towards married women:), the principles that were taught were applicable to all and we walked away with biblical truths to put into practice.

Week of November 6-12:

Morning Service (11/6)—Pastor Wiggins continued the series, What Is a Christian? We looked at "A Runner in a Race." Believers must run the Christian race with (1) patient endurance [Heb 12:1-4]; (2) discipline & purpose [1 Cor 9:24-27]; and (3) humility & persistence [Phil 3:12-14].

Evening Service (11/6)—Bill Pearce brought a Bible challenge from **Isaiah** 63:15-64:12.
