## Solemnity of Christ the King 20th November 2022

On the 6<sup>th</sup> May 2023 Charles III will be anointed king at his coronation. It is an ancient rite and the anointing of kings, and Jesus in particular, provides the focus for today's feast in this year of the cycle of reading. Remember how at the start of his ministry Jesus stands up in the synagogue in Nazareth and reads from the scroll of the prophet Isaiah, "The spirit of the Lord is upon me, for he has anointed me". This anointing of Jesus reaches its consummation on the cross, where having had his feet anointed, he is now questioned about and acknowledged as the Christ. "Christ" is the Greek word meaning the anointed one, and it translates the Hebrew word "Messiah". The kingship of Christ is revealed on the cross.

We are rightly named Christians not only because we follow Jesus, the Christ, but because we too are chosen and anointed – outwardly at our Baptism and Confirmation and inwardly by the Holy Spirit. We are chosen and anointed to share in the person and the work of Christ. Each has been given their own gifts (time, talents and treasure) to bring to this work, and others are chosen from them and anointed again as shepherds, holding the rich diversity of the body of Christ in communion.

Our parish is a community, and over the last few weeks many have expressed their appreciation for what they have experienced. Lovely as the sense of community is, it is not an end in itself. The community of our parish exists as a lifeboat or a field-hospital for sinners, the lost and the broken. It has to provide, through the network of relationships that make it up, a place of friendship on our journey through life, a place of light and hope. Even the ancient writers knew very well the power and joy of friendship – its role in protecting us from error when we are young and lacking wisdom, supporting us in our infirmity or weakness and providing us with others with whom we can do wonderful deeds.

I invite you to consider how you might share, possibly more deeply, in the mission of our parish, by sharing your time, talents and treasure, for God has chosen you and anointed you as prophets, priests and kings to share in the work of Jesus, the Christ, the King of the Universe.
