Notes from the Pastor...

Advent, Waiting, and Being Midwives for God

Advent (which means "the arrival" or "the coming") is a time of expectant waiting. Christians began to observe Advent as a season of expectation during the 4th and 5th centuries. During Advent, we celebrate the coming of the Christ child - what God has already done. We look for signs of the Spirit among us – what God is doing right now. And we wait in expectation of the full coming of God's reign on earth – what God yet will do.

But this waiting is not passive waiting. It is an active waiting – like the waiting of a family expecting a child. As expectant parents know, waiting involves preparation, excersize, nutrition, care, prayer, work; and birth involves pain, tears, joy, release, community. It is called labor for a reason. Likewise, we are in a world pregnant with hope, and we live in the expectation of the arrival of God's kingdom on earth. As we wait, we also work, cry, pray, ache. Someone once said that being a Christian is like being midwives of another world.

Advent is a good time to remember the "great cloud of witnesses," forbears in faith like St. Nicholas, who was a faithful man of God long before he was a cultural icon. Today, the season between Thanksgiving and Christmas that we try to recognize as Advent is the biggest frenzy of retail spending of the year. Billions of dollars are spent as we celebrate the birth of the homeless Son of God in that stinky manger.

How might we rethink Advent as a time of compassion rather than consumption?

A Subversive Christmas

"By the tender compassion of our God, the dawn from on high shall break upon us, and guide our feet into the way of peace." (The Song of Zechariah, Luke 1: 78-79)

"Glory to God in the highest, and peace to God's people on earth" (Song of the Angels announcing the birth of Jesus, Luke 1)

"Jesus' birth, his death, and his resurrection subverts systems of violence with God's nonviolent love. Jesus reveals the absurdity of believing that the means of violence can achieve the goal of peace. The terrible truth is that our world has never established lasting peace through violence. "Victory" through violent means establishes not peace, but lull. Thereafter, violence returns once again, and always worse than before. And it is that escalator violence that endangers our world.

The birth of Jesus should be cause for real reflection and discernment. Will we trust in false promises of peace through violence, or will we follow Jesus, who brings peace through self-sacrificial and non-violent love?" (Adam Erickson, the Raven Foundation)

A Christ-Centered Christmas: Ideas and Resources

Here are some ideas for celebrating Advent and Christmas differently, and more deeply.

Tell the Story – The Gospels according to Matthew and Luke tell of Jesus' birth, and the events leading up to it. These are amazing stories! This Christmas and Advent, take some time and read the stories. Tell them to your kids and grandkids. Encourage your children (and yourself) to creatively engage the story. Act it out. Create artwork or drawings based on the story. Have the older kids read parts of the story together. There are lots of ways to engage the Christmas story in the bible.

Discover the Real Santa Claus – The real Santa Claus embodies the true spirit of Christmas. His name was St. Nicholas. St. Nicholas became known throughout the land for his generosity to those in need and his love for children. Many stories still exist of St. Nicolas's life and deeds, including Nicholas saving people in times of famine, helping those in prison, and fighting for the lives of people innocently accused of crime. He did many kind and generous deeds in secret, expecting nothing in return. St. Nicholas continues to be a model for a compassionate and godly life. Have you or you kids Google "St. Nicholas" and see if you can learn more about this inspiring saint.

Observe Advent. Advent marks the beginning of the church year calendar, and is a time of preparation for Christmas. The Advent wreath is a great way to observe Advent and deepen the meaning of Christmas. Light the candles, do the devotions, learn the significance of each candle. In those moments around the Advent wreath, home becomes church.

Spend less. Spending less isn't about stopping giving gifts; it's about not spending money on gifts we won't remember in less than a year. By spending wisely on gifts we free ourselves from the anxiety associated with debt so we can take in the season with a full heart.

Purchase meaningful gifts. This holiday season, "spend less and give more" by ordering gifts for friends and loved ones from gift catalogues such as "ELCA Good Gifts." Catalogues are available at the church or on the web at www.elca.org/goodgifts.

Another good gift idea is Fair Trade products such as Fair Trade coffee, tea, chocolate, or hot cocoa from Fair Trade organizations such as Equal Exchange. Equal Exchange fair trade products are available at the church or on the web at www.equalexchange.com

Slow down and be at peace – Jesus is Emmanuel; God-with-us. God gives us all we need. In the hectic pace of the Christmas season, take some time to relax, take a deep breath, and simply enjoy God's blessings. Jesus is the Prince of Peace!

What are your Christmas and Advent traditions? What new traditions might you start? During the busy times of holidays, those traditions (old and new) are a haven and a refuge. This Advent, light a candle, and tell again the story of our Savior's birth.
