

# 2022 MIDWEEK ADVENT SERVICES START WEDNESDAY NOVEMBER 30th - LUTHERAN TOUCHES TO CHRISTMAS CELEBRATIONS

While a significant amount of time has passed since Martin Luther posted his protests on Wittenberg's church doors (505 years ago!) which started the Reformation, his influence can still be found around us today. This is especially true at Christmas time. Did you know before Luther's time Christmas trees weren't part of Christian celebrations of Dec. 25<sup>th</sup>? Or that prior to Luther, Christmas gifts were rarely given on Dec. 25<sup>th</sup>? Or that the Christmas carol staple "Away in a Manger" is associated with Martin Luther? Our midweek Advent services this year will merrily explore the influences Luther left on our modern-day observances of Christmas. Hopefully these explorations of Luther's influences will, like his influence in causing the Reformation movement, draw us closer to the grace of Christ, which is what Christmas is all about.

This Advent season, you're invited to come enjoy a quiet night at church during a hectic season. Relax over a good meal, listen, and participate in the soothing music of the Holden Evening Prayer. You'll learn a little bit of history, and celebrate a tidbit of tradition. In the end we hope you'll feel like your soul got a hug and God got the glory. Don't let society's secular focus this Christmas make a humbug out of you this year. Mark your calendar, *better yet <u>clear</u> your calendar* and join your church family in welcoming the newborn king into your home and heart this Christmas. Wednesday November 30th, Wednesday December 7th, 14th and 21st. Dinner begins at 6:30 pm with worship at 7:15 pm.

**MIDWEEK ADVENT OFFERINGS:** Our church council has designated the loose offerings from our midweek advent worship services to be combined with the FELC Cantata offerings and given to the Idaho Falls Food Basket, Soup Kitchen and Meals on Wheels. If you want your offering to go toward the church budget please place it in one of the blue envelopes available in the pew racks.

#### CHRISTMAS CAROL SING-ALONG IN DECEMBER:

Traditionally, liturgical churches only sing Christmas Carols during the official church season of Christmas, December 24th to January 6th (the twelve days of Christmas). However, with secular holiday songs that have no mention of the Christ child taking over the airwaves (Grandma got run over by a reindeer) traditional sacred carols are becoming less well known. In an attempt to honor the Advent season (a time to prepare for Christ's coming rather than celebrating his arrival), FELC will be refraining from singing Christmas Carols during Advent Worship. However, there will be exceptions to the rule. Prior to each Sunday's prelude Pastor Mike will lead a singalong of some of the top vote getters from our recent



Christmas Carol Survey. We will also enjoy wonderful Christmas music when our Choir, Bell Choir and Praise Band present their annual Christmas Cantata on Sunday December 11th. In addition to this celebration of Christmas music, we will have a service of Lessons and Carols on Sunday December 25<sup>th</sup> utilizing all of the top ten Carols from our congregation's Carol Survey. Don't miss out, come early, come often, and catch the Christmas spirit this Advent.






### Finance




