# Message from Michael

It was one of the big social events of the year. People wore their finest clothing and jewelry. They really got spiffed up, and there were usually social activities following the service.

Whether Christmas was on Sunday or not, there was always a Christmas Day service as well. The Christmas Day worship service was not nearly as well attended, but my mother's family never missed.

No mater how late they were out the night before, my grandfather got the whole family up for church on Christmas morning. He would always say the same thing, "Last night was for show, this morning is for Jesus." Neither Christmas Eve nor Christmas Day is celebrated in the same way now-a-days. Most churches don't have regular Christmas Day services. Even though I am not sure I agree with my grandfather's reasoning, he does have a point. The whole point of Christmas is the birth of Christ, is there any better time to worship him?

This year Christmas does come on a Sunday, and we will worship at 10:00 am. I know many will have family obligations, but I encourage you to join us for a casual service of scripture and carols as we celebrate the birth of Christ.

Since it is the last Sunday of the month, we will have the potluck following the service. Since many might have family dinners later in the day, lets keep it simple, maybe finger foods or holiday leftovers.

Like my grandfather said, "This one is for Jesus."

# Advent Worship Series

# Christmas is for Everyone Prophet Priest Shepherd King











The Good News of Jesus Christ is that his message of salvation wasn't for a specific group of people, but for all who call him savior. The prophets announced the coming of the Messiah. Angels told the Priest Zechariah as well as Mary and Joseph that the child was coming. Zechariah represented the religious leaders of the time. Although not wealthy nor noble, Mary and Joseph were faithful to their religion.

The birth of Christ were not just for the religious, for it was the shepherds and Magi who also witnessed the coming of Christ. The shepherds were the outcast of their society. The Magi were most likely foreigners of a different race and not of the Jewish faith. These were signs that the coming of the Messiah was for all people. So our theme for our Advent Season is "Christmas is for Everyone: Prophet, Priest, Shepherd, and King."

These are also titles for Jesus. In Matthew 21:11, "The crowds were saying, "This is the prophet Jesus from Nazareth in Galilee." Hebrew identifies Jesus as the High Priest. Jesus said, "I am the Good Shepherd," [John 10:11] and the people recognized Jesus' kingship when he entered Jerusalem on Palm Sunday, "Blessed is the king who comes in the name of the Lord!" (Luke 19:38).

So each Sunday we will look at this aspect of Jesus and how that connects to us today.

December 18 King:




Wise men from the East came to Jerusalem" *Matthew 2:1-12*

December 12 "Go, Tell it on the Mountain," led by Mark Ford of Baxter/ Crosslake.


# Movie Night-Saturday, December 10, 6:00 p.m.

Bring a snack and join the congregation for a family friendly Christmas movie. Pastor Michael has never seen "Elf," is that what we want to watch?




Caroling Caravan—Saturday, December 17, 5:00 p.m.

The regular meeting of the Session was called to order at 6:35 p.m. in the basement of Randall Presbyterian Church by Moderator Reverend Michael Hartwell, who opened the meeting with prayer.
