Christ the Treasure

Read Luke 2:1-20

Over the past couple of decades, I have taken more and more notice that the season of Christmas has lost some of its wonder. Not the wonder of the gifts per se or the families gathering, but the actual Christmas story itself. It feels like all too often we get so into the routine of the story that we almost try to rush it along so we can get to the "good stuff".

In my opinion, taking the Christmas season in stride would be a tragic step. Its spirit and alluring sense of supernatural goodness are not just for children, but even for the grown ups. Especially for the grown ups. It would be terribly sad to me if we ever get just plain used to Christmas.

Have you ever really evaluated the whole story? There is something so remarkable in it that pagan astrologers took off on a long, arduous journey westward.

The intensity of a wicked king who commands the slaughter of innocents. Something so unusual that blue-collar workers, who thought they'd seen it all, are filled with great fear, then leave their flocks in haste to find this newborn — and then can't keep quiet. "And all who heard it were amazed at what the shepherds said to them." (Luke 2:18).

I won't waste your time with some sort of whimsical thoughts about what Christmas should look like. I believe the Christmas story, in and of itself, takes care of all we should need to know to make this day, that we celebrate this month, worthy of such awe.

When we really peel back the layers of the story, we find more than just a baby lying in a manger. We find our Christ born into this world to take hold of what His Father in Heaven bestowed upon him.

We learn that He is indeed Christ the Lord, that He is Christ the Savior, and in this Christmas season we learn that He is Christ the Treasure.

God himself arrives not only to save us from sin and death, but to rescue us to himself. Christ comes, and will pay the ultimate price in suffering and death,

For Christ died for sins once for all, the righteous for the unrighteous, to bring you to God. He was put to death in the body but made alive by the Spirit (1 Peter 3:18)

And then the psalmist wrote before Christ's birth that He would be our joy and delight (Psalm 43:4) at the bottom of this good news of great joy (Luke 2:10).

Thomas Goodwin wrote, "all the benefits achieved by his life and death are all far inferior to the gift of his person, to us." His person, His coming from Heaven for us, is of infinitely more worth than all else. In other words, Jesus himself is the Great Joy that makes all the joys of our salvation so great. The risen Christ is the treasure hidden in the field. "The kingdom of heaven is like treasure hidden in a field. When a man found it, he hid it again, and then in his joy went and sold all he had and bought that field." (Matthew 13:44).

He is the pearl of great price. "Again, the kingdom of heaven is like a merchant looking for fine pearls. 46 When he found one of great value, he went away and sold everything he had and bought it." (Matthew 13:45–46).

Jesus is not just God with us, here to save us. He himself is our greatest joy, the main treasure, who will satisfy our human souls forever...like only the Christ can. One of the things that bothers me about this season is it seems to end so abruptly. But the Christmas season's end doesn't terminate our enjoyment. The bearer is joined by the heavenly host: 14 "Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace to men on whom his favor rests."(Luke 2:14).

Call it Christmas indulgence, if you will, it is the gift that keeps on giving. The joy He came to bring in His own person as the God-man is the joy that aligns with, and fulfills, the great purpose of all creation. Christmas brings the electricity of joy that runs along the grid of all reality.

Thomas Goodwin went on to say: "God's chief end was not to bring Christ into the world for us, but us for Christ." That means Jesus is not just Lord and Savior, but also the Treasure.

This child of Christmas is more than Lord. He is even more than Savior. He is our great Treasure, and in "our eternal enjoyment of Him" is His glory and the end for which God created the world. Christmas is not finally about His birth for our salvation, but our existence for His glory.

You were made for the Great Joy of Christmas. And if you read this without the assurance of what it means to be a child of His grace, then the greatest gift that you could ever receive sits before you this day. It is the gift of salvation, and it is yours for the taking.

From His birth in Bethlehem to His death on a cross, this Joy was great enough to be born in obscurity, be laid in a manger, and have no place to lay His head. He would be rejected by His own people, delivered over by their authorities, and betrayed by his own friend.

But this Great Joy could not be extinguished. It cannot. It is too high, too long, too deep — even for death itself. And our Great Joy is now with us to the end of the age, strengthening us in every fear, cheering us in every grief, holding us in all our suffering. Until the day he unseats every sorrow, he promises, "No one will take your joy from you" (John 16:22). Soak it all up this Christmas, my friends, and let it carry you all the way to next Christmas.

Be Available: Part 2

God wants to connect with us; He wants to talk with us, encourage us, and guide us. But when we're living in days of saying to God: "Sorry. I'm not available"...we must stop! We must stop the busyness and listen to God. Once we slow down in life, we can hear God not only saying STOP, but also REST. REST IN ME!!

Who's not tired? Our culture loves that word— it's like a badge we wear to let people know there are demands on our time and our presence.

Being tired isn't always a good thing, though. We can't be as available to God when we're exhausted, whether physically or spiritually.

That's why we need good rest — and scrolling through Instagram or binging on Netflix doesn't count.

Real rest should do two things:

Get your mind off your source of stress. Get your mind on God's love and power.

We can't be fully available to God without rest. The best rest comes in the presence of God. Psalm 62 describes God as our fortress — what better place could there be to rest?

What's your favorite way to rest? For some of us, it might be listening to uplifting worship music. Others might prefer praying in a quiet room. Maybe it's sitting and reflecting on a favorite passage or writing in a gratitude journal. If it's physical rest you need, maybe you can schedule more sleep during your week. Whatever kind of rest will most help you connect with God, make some time for it.

When I need comfort

I have a pretty talkative conscience. My whole life I have been pestered by my inner monologue to analyze my every decision and choice. To be honest, my conscience has been, at varying times in my life, so obnoxious to my own selfish and earthly desires that I have come up with ways to completely ignore it, in spite of myself. At times like this, my conscience turns to his friends, guilt and regret, to take over the job. I have spent a good portion of my life thus far hanging out with these three.

For most of my life I've had an out when this happens. From my childhood, all the way up until now, when I am upset about failings or poor choices, I do what a lot of us do... I talk to my mom. For my whole life, my mother has had the ability to just make me feel better. She has always been able to put things in perspective for me. Even when I really don't deserve to feel better about something, she has always been able to show me the error in my ways without that feeling of condemnation that creeps up from the cellar of my psyche. Talking to her doesn't necessarily fix the mess I've created but it always seems to help me cope with the results, be they consequences or the process of fixing the mess myself.

It took me far too long to realize that my relationship with my Heavenly Father is just like this. In fact, it's far more powerful... and easier to do. I don't have to pick up a phone to call God or travel to where He is, because He is always right there with me. All I have to do is acknowledge His presence and confess to Him right there, no matter where I am. And while I may not always audibly hear His voice (although there've been a few times...) if I open my heart and quiet my mind, I get the same perspective, the same comfort, the same direction. On top of that, the one thing my mom can't offer me is eternal forgiveness from the condemnation of sin...**BUT HE CAN.**

We have the greatest counselor, therapist, confidant, and parent that ever existed right beside us everywhere we go, all the time. I encourage you all to say a quick prayer of thanks for that. And if, like with me, He has blessed you with an earthly source of similar comfort, I encourage you to thank Him, then go find that person and give them a hug.

Identity. Where do you find your identity? I want you to pause for a moment and describe yourself out loud. Recently I asked the youth group to identify themselves. One by one they named physical attributes, color, sex, height, clothes. They then named the things they like to do, for example, their favorite sports, TV shows, classes they're taking. Then they named places they lived or are currently living. A couple of them, in the end, remembered to say something about God, but only a couple of them remembered God at all.

How do you identify yourself? Where do you find your identity? Maybe your job, car, house, family, pets, position at the church, or what you spend time doing. In America, there is extreme identity confusion. People are scrambling to put a label on themselves and then demanding we meet their expectations of how they identify themselves. In the pursuit of identity they seek themselves, but fail time and time again to seek Who created them. No, I'm not talking about their parents. In the life of non-believers, the lack of identity is obvious. Drugs, same sex marriage, transgender individuals, hateful people, political extremists... the list goes on. The bottom line is, without the One who bestows identity we can never find our true identity. **Ephesians 2:10 For we are His workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which He prepared in advance for us to do.** Any time we seek identity outside of Christ Jesus we end up with a broken identity.

So remember your identity and where it comes from. I challenge you to ask God how He identifies you. Listen for His response and align it with scripture.



Merry Christmas from the elders!

We've been working to finish 2022 well and preparing for 2023. By the time you read this, the budget for next year should be finalized and will be presented to the congregation. We encourage every member to attend the congregational meeting on December 11th immediately after service. At the meeting we will present the budget, answer questions, and collect votes per the by-laws affirming the budget as well as those serving as elders, deacons, and deaconesses. Please make plans to attend.

Being an elder, as you may or may not know, is a difficult calling (if you do not, we have some plans that should come to fruition next year to help you better understand an elder's role within the church). We have an enemy who does not want us to succeed and makes war against us. As elders, we are particularly tempting targets for our enemy and the battle leaves us tired. From time to time, elders need to take a one-year break and rest from the duties of shepherding the flock. For 2023, Bill White has decided to take a year break from elder meetings. He is still an elder and will be active in the men's ministry, siafu, and other ministries at CPCC. We are thankful for Bill's (and Kim's) heart for Central Park, their service, and we look forward to how God uses the next year to bring glory to His name.

While 2022 has been a year of varying challenges, God has been faithful as always. We were able to complete the purchase of the lot at 1600 SW Clay (corner of 16th & Clay where the house burned) and we are still considering how we can use the space to best grow God's kingdom. The first order will be to clean up the lot, which will likely occur in the spring. Our church van was hit by a drunk driver and totaled, but the insurance company paid more than expected. We have formed a committee to find a replacement and will be looking at small buses and "people movers" as they are safer to use and more accessible to more individuals. We hope to begin using whatever replaces the van to bring people to service, ARROW, and youth activities on a consistent basis once again. We have much to be thankful for in 2022.
