Westminster Shorter Catechism #15: By what sin did our first parents fall from their original condition? Our first parents' sin was eating the forbidden fruit.

He has been a minister in the Presbyterian Church for 51 years and has served as pastor of several PCA churches in MS. He has also been a Christian school administrator and university instructor. Mike and Robin both lost their first spouses a number of years ago and married each other in 2005. Both have two children from their first marriages, and are now raising a 13-year-old grandson.
