These words penned by Robert Lowery show the attitude Christians have in deep relationships to God. This hymn shows the vulnerability of Christians and how desperately they depend on their Lord. Lowery co-wrote this piece with hymn-writer Annie Hawks. The hymn points to an avenue of peace in the Creator during a time of uncertainty. The words to this beloved hymn bring a timeless message that seem just as appropriate to this day and time. "And the peace of God, which passeth all understanding, shall keep your heart and minds through Christ Jesus" (Phil 4:7). The peace which is found in Jesus is one that transcends reasoning. It is a peace that does not waver in the face of unimaginable hardships, since our eternal life rests in God's abundant grace. What a blessing of assurance for us as Christians!
