LESSONS FROM FIRST SAMUEL

1 Samuel 19:7 King Saul's son, Jonathan, convinced Saul that David should live. In verse **10** Saul threw a spear at David trying to kill him, but David eluded him. In verse **11** Saul sent men to David's house to watch it and to kill him in the morning, but during the night, David ran away to Naioth. In verse **20** when Saul heard that David was in Naioth, he sent men to capture him. But when Saul's men saw a group of prophets prophesying, with Samuel standing there as their leader, the Spirit of God came on Saul's men, and they also prophesied. **21** Saul was told about it, and he sent more men, and they prophesied too. Saul sent men a third time, and they also prophesied. **22** Finally, he himself left for Ramah... **23** So Saul went to Naioth at Ramah. But the Spirit of God came even on him, and he walked along prophesying until he came to Naioth.

LESSONS FOR US:

- **Read the signs!**
 - Saul might have thought it a coincidence after failing twice to kill David. But in his third attempt, when his men ended up prophesying, he should have stopped and **read the signs**.
 - In 1 Corinthians 11:20-32 Paul told the Corinthian church that when they come together, instead of partaking of the Lord's supper, they're doing something completely foreign in the eyes of the Lord and that's why many among them were weak and sick. The Lord was judging them, disciplining them. Paul was trying to get them to **read the signs**.
 - In John 2:18-19 the Jews asked Jesus for **a sign** to prove his authority and he said, "Destroy this temple, and I will raise it again in three days."
 - What will you do with **the sign** that Jesus gave the Jews? Will you more fully turn your life over to him and submit to his authority?
