Third 'Gaudete' Sunday of Advent 11th December 2022

Do not lose heart, because the Lord's coming will be soon

"Are we nearly there yet?" Children find waiting difficult and if we are honest, it's often a challenge for adults too. We may have developed strategies for delaying pleasures to attend to less gratifying but important things, but sometimes it's hard work and a lot of effort. In the Gospel today John has sent his disciples to Jesus to know whether he is the one who is to come. Instead of saying "of course" Jesus tells them to look around and notice the signs of his coming.

Over the last week or so I have been quite uplifted by signs of how things should be – expressions of life and joy, expressions of unbounded love and happiness. The narrative presented to us by the news is all too often discouraging and depressing and if we are to nourish our sense of hope we need to keep our eyes alert for the breaking-through of good news around us, especially in the everyday holiness and wholeness in the lives of those we encounter through our week. (Not just in the fleeting triumphs of football and cricket.)

The practice of the *Examen* at the end of each day can be quite helpful in cultivating an attitude of gratitude and getting used to noticing God at work in our own lives and in world around us. At its simplest it consists of taking a few moments to ask prayerfully "How have I loved today? How have I failed to love? How have I been blessed today?"

In the season of advent in particular we are exposed to how the whole of scripture is about Jesus. The Gospels tell us about his coming among us in the flesh. The other writings of the New Testament reveal his continuing presence in his body, the Church. Many of the characters, stories and prophecies of the Old Testament foreshadow Jesus – they give a glimpse of what was and is to come such that we say that Jesus fulfils and completes them. Do join us for Lectio Divina at 7.30pm on Wednesday evening as we continue to pray through the writings of the Prophet Isaiah.
