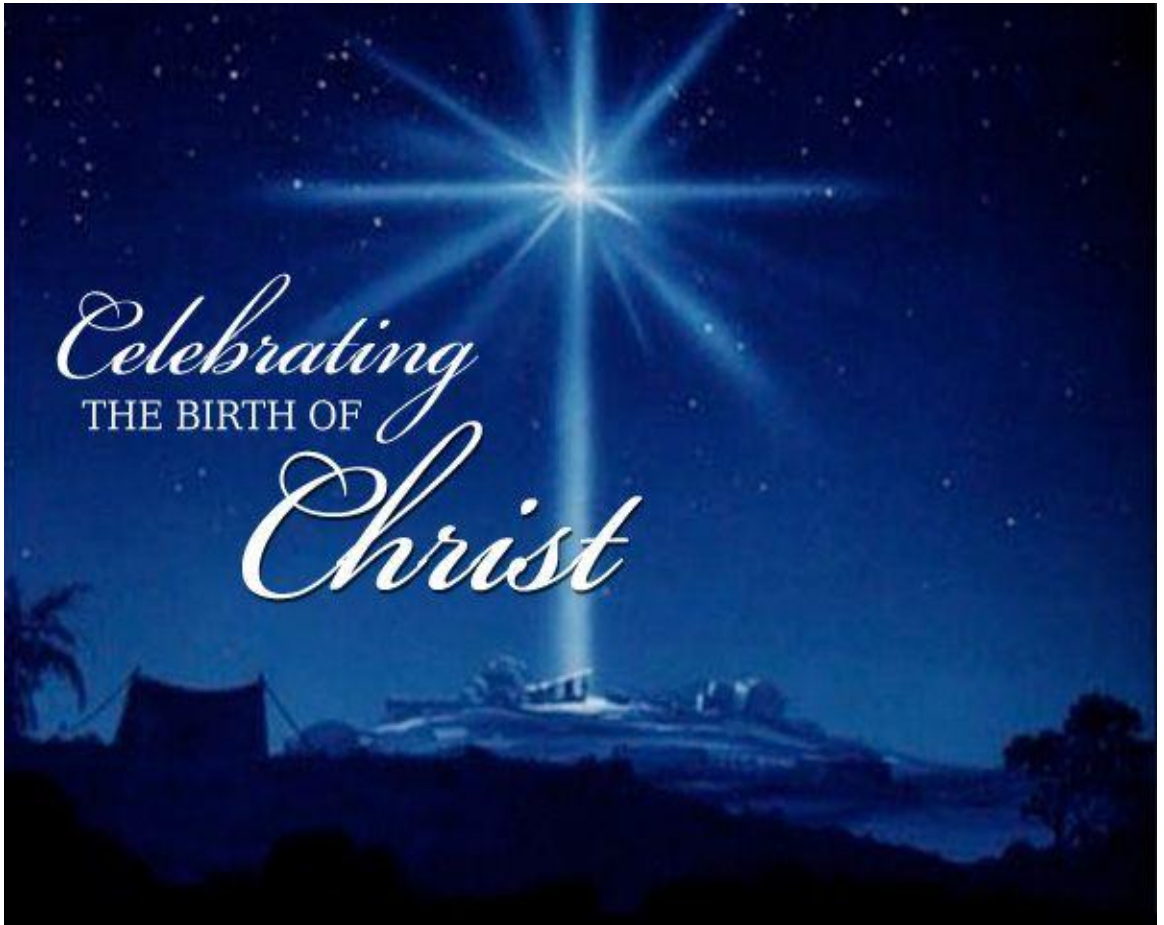

In the sixth month the angel Gabriel was sent from God to a city of Galilee named Nazareth, to a virgin betrothed to a man whose name was Joseph, of the house of David. But she was greatly troubled at the saying, and tried to discern what sort of greeting this might be. And the angel said to her, "Do not be afraid, Mary, for you have found favor with God. And behold, you will conceive in your womb and bear a son, and you shall call his name Jesus. He will be great and will be called the Son of the Most High. And the Lord God will give to him the throne of his father David, and he will reign over the house of Jacob forever, and of his kingdom there will be no end."

Now the birth of Jesus Christ took place in this way. When his mother Mary had been betrothed to Joseph, before they came together she was found to be with child from the Holy Spirit. And her husband Joseph, being a just man and unwilling to put her to shame, resolved to divorce her quietly. But as he considered these things, behold, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream, saying, "Joseph, son of David, do not fear to take Mary as your wife, for that which is conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit. From Seed to Flower: The Promise of the Son

1.) Creation

In the beginning, God created man and woman to dwell with Him in paradise. As His image bearers, God commissioned the man and the woman to exercise royal dominion over the world in His name. This was a relationship of blessing, communion and perfect peace.

2.) Fall

At the instigation of the Devil, the man and the woman broke faithfulness with the God who had made them. They chose instead the promise of the Serpent over the word of God. This resulted in the Fall, and exile from the garden of God. But, in the midst of sin, God made a promise that from the offspring of the woman would be born a Son. This Son would return Adam and Eve's children to blessing, communion, and peace.

3.) Covenant

In the early days of human history, God confirmed this promise of a Serpent-crushing Son with Abraham and Sarah with the sign of circumcision. God now had a specific people, a church, through whom this Son would come.

4.) King

When Israel was established in the land God promised Abraham, God anointed David to be king. And with David, God once more established that covenant that He once made with Adam and Eve, Abraham and Sarah. Now, this Son would be a son of David. This Son would be the true King.

5.) Curse

In tragic re-enactment of Adam and Eve's sin, the nation of Israel broke covenant with the Lord and was exiled into Babylon. Like Adam, Israel chose covenant loyalty to the Serpent, rather than to the Lord.

6.) Glory

The days of exile would not last forever. Even human sinfulness is unable to nullify the promise of God. In the fullness of time, the promised Son would at last be born to the Virgin Mary. In the manger, the promise of Eve's offspring was fulfilled. At the cross, the Son crushed the head of the Serpent. At the Empty Tomb, He secured for us life everlasting and a place in an unshakable kingdom. This Son is Jesus Christ, born on Christmas Day. Though faith in Him, we receive blessing, communion, and peace with God. That Promised Son, who crushed the head of the serpent, who death could not hold, will return to fully restore us to glory where He will be our God, and we will be His people for all of eternity.
