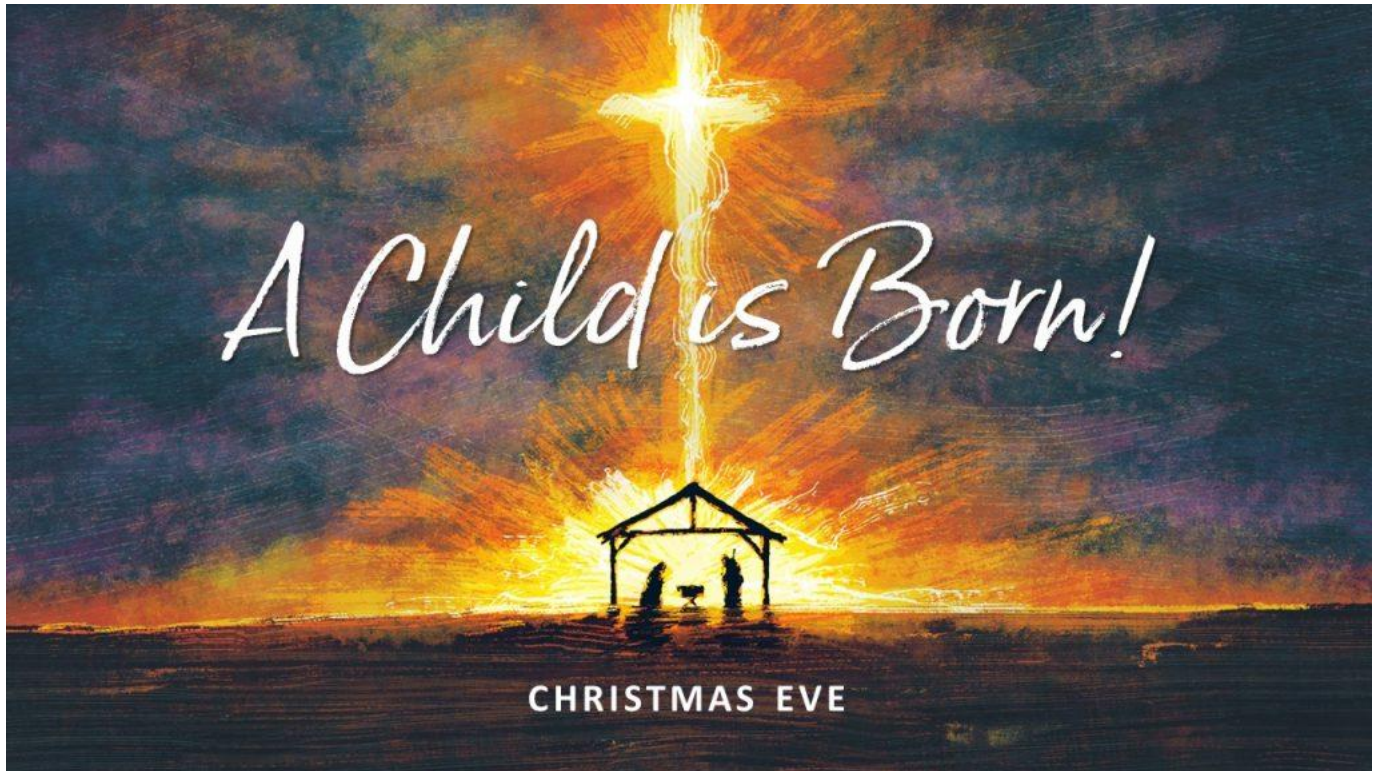

**LIGHTING OF THE CHRIST CANDLE:** UCC Liturgy

Liturgist: Rejoice, people of God! The light has come into the world. O God, now we light the candle of your nativity! (With 4 Advent candles lit, Liturgist lights the Christ candle) Pastor: With the company of heaven and with sounds of great joy, you come to us. This is the time of light and resplendent joy. God has been born among us.

### **THE INVITATION**

Tonight, heaven and earth meet. Tonight, a backyard shed is holy ground. Tonight, strangers gather as family. And so we come here, to the feast table of God, as Christ’s invited friends, chosen and beloved. If you have been here often, if the memory of this table stretches back through all your Christmases, you are welcome. If you have been here rarely, if reverence for bread and juice is strange to you, you are welcome. If you have much faith, or little, or wouldn’t know where to begin even if you wanted to believe, you are welcome here. For Christ does not hold himself back from us, but boldly enters every heart. Christ welcomes you to this table. That is all you need to know.

## **PRAYER OF THANKSGIVING**

Let us pray: Lord God, tonight of all nights we remember your son. We celebrate his infancy tonight. We remember the innocence of children. We remember how quickly the years go by. On this night of celebration and life, we remember this child we are celebrating will only a few short years later sacrifice himself upon the cross for our sins. We remember his actions and teachings of love that lead to this moment. But tonight, we remember most of all his birth. We remember the angels, the shepherds, and the kings who paid homage to him. We remember our savior tonight as an infant, and we do so by saying a prayer he would teach us, which goes:

**Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name. Thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. ## **WORDS OF INSTITUTION**

Tonight, we celebrate Christ, the Bread of Heaven, who, on the night before he was arrested for daring to love more boldly than others thought proper, took bread, and after giving thanks to God, broke it, and gave it to his disciples, saying: Take, eat. This is my body, given for you. Do this in remembrance of me.

In the same way he took the cup, saying: This cup is the new covenant sealed in my blood, shed for you for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this in remembrance of me. And so, whenever we eat this bread and drink of this cup, we too proclaim the boldness of God's love, that will always come to us again.

The feast is ready. All are welcome.
