








GIVING UPDATE THROUGH 11/30




BROOKE IS HOME, IMPROVING, AND MULTIPLYING

We're all rejoicing in the restoration of health for Brooke Hopkins. Brooke collapsed during rehearsal on December 7 with cardiac arrest. EMTs could stabilize the heart, but several days of sedation and intubation were followed by several more days of testing. MRI revealed a genetic condition called a mitral annular disjunction. Brooke received an internal defibrillator and was released on December 23. He is at home rehabbing, and we're waiting to see when he can return to lead us in worship. FAMILY OF THE MONTH: DUPEE



Therefore, I urge you, brethren, by the mercies of God, to present your bodies a living and holy sacrifice, acceptable to God, which is your spiritual service of worship. ²And do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind, so that you may prove what the will of God is, that which is good and acceptable and perfect. – *Romans* 12:1-2

Let me try to show you what God planned for this very well known and loved feature family at NPC before they were born. It would be slowly revealed to them as they lived their favorite scripture, Romans 12:1-2. Dan grew up in Cincinnati, OH as the surprise youngest of four children to a "nominally" Christian family. He graduated from Ohio Wesleyan with a BA in History and English. Carol grew up on the other side of the tunnels in Pittsburgh with two younger brothers. Her father was both a nuclear physicist and a Dr. of Theology. Her mother is an attorney. They were a Catholic family that was part of the Cursillo Movement. Carol made her public commitment to follow Christ as a high school freshman on a Campus Life weekend retreat. She went to Penn State and got her undergraduate degree in marketing.

Dan's brother Dave, who was working with the CCO at Thiel College, was led to invite his younger brother Dan, a freshman in college, to a "Jubilee" in Pittsburgh where Tom Skinner was the main speaker. Dan told me that weekend Tom took apart all the bricks of works theology and put the bricks back together in a way that transformed his life in grace as a living sacrifice. If you haven't read Romans 12:1-2 yet do it now! After graduating, God's plan sends Dan to Penn State where he begins work with the CCO. Remember Carol Korsmeyer?

She is a resident assistant at Penn State and is struggling in her faith because one of the girls on her hall attempted suicide. Carol follows God's leading and makes an appointment to talk to the CCO leader, Dan, about her issues. Well you know what this leads to...Carol asks Dan to a sorority party. Even though there is only 2 ½ years difference in their ages the CCO has rules about a staff person dating a student. Dan asks his boss Howie Shultz what he should do. Howie and his wife Joanne decide to double date with them and evaluate. The relationship deepens and Carol ends up staying at Penn State after graduation to pursue her Masters in counseling. Nine months after meeting, Dan would propose to Carol in Howie and Joanne's home. They were married in Heinz Chapel in 1984.

After 3 years with the CCO at Penn State and now happily married to Carol, Dan began his career with his family's business in Cincinnati, Olsten Staffing Services in 1984. His brother had also left the CCO a year earlier and joined the business. Dan spent 13 years under the leadership of his father and older brother while the business grew from \$12 million to \$33 million and he contributed significantly to that growth in his sales position. Carol was employed in career development at Northern Kentucky University and they both led the college fellowship at their church. Life

changed significantly in 1992 when as Carol says, "Be careful what you pray for". Their prayers were answered and they had twin boys Jack and Spencer. God was not done and in 1996 they had twin girls Anne and Eliza.

Dan was not meant to be a follower; God was just preparing him to be a leader. The President of the CCO Bob Long, had his eye on grooming Dan to be his successor. (Incidentally my father, Jim Ludwig Sr., was a founding board member of the organization with Bob Long.) In 1997, Dan would accept a position with the CCO as VP of Development and move his family to Pittsburgh. Bob being satisfied with Dan's trial period promoted him to President in 1999. During the next 17 years the CCO would grow from 46 campuses to 116 and in the last 13 years of his tenure each year they were recognized as one of the best places to work by Best Christian Workplaces Institute. Temporary retirement in 2015 gave him time to write his first book, "It's Not Too Late."

Dan and Carol were led to NPC in 1997 because Brian Tome who was a former youth pastor at NPC, was headed to Cincinnati just as Carol and Dan were headed to Pittsburgh and recommended they come. During their 25 years at NPC Carol has worked in the nursery, taught Sunday School, done Summer Celebration, meals for the youth group, and co-led a girls small group with Barb Buirge all while her kids were working their way through NPC. As an empty nester Carol has mentored younger women in the church and become a Deacon serving with the Mercy Team. Meanwhile Dan joined the praise team early on having played keyboard with Tom Jones in a band that played for Jubilee Conferences. Tom had also recommended they follow him to NPC. Dan is currently working through his second set of two consecutive threeyear terms as an elder and he has taught 3 excellent adult Sunday School classes.

Dan had begun work on his second book and started leadership coaching business, (including a client who is a priest in Melbourne Australia), when the CCO asked him to become an interim president. With that calling being completed again in June of this year Dan and Carol are pleased to announce God's latest plan for them. Check it out at www.dupeestrengths.com.

SPECIAL GIVING OPPORTUNITY — HELP RENOVATE THE GROW CENTER IN LEBANON

January 22-February 12

For the past several years, North Park Church has partnered with the GROW Center in Lebanon after sending a team to Lebanon to see it operating on the ground. The GROW Center operates with a "missions in reverse" concept where they reach families by reaching children. They concentrate on providing quality, Christian preschool for families of migrant workers, refugees, and others below the poverty threshold. Through showing their children the love of Christ, the families are open to talking with staff and missionaries about their faith who are then plugged into local churches.

At present, the GROW Center is seeking to replicate its design to another location. They have recently purchased a new location and are seeking to renovate it to make it functional and add a floor to combine this missional opportunity with a church plant. They are raising money right now to finish the work and make the new location operational. We are hoping to raise \$5,000 for this project as a church, and if you would like to participate, we will be making this opportunity available from January 22 to February 12.
