Servant Thoughts

Recently the Elders and I surveyed the congregation about the move from two services to one on Sunday. In part the reason for the survey was to evaluate how the change has been working and how it has impacted the Christian Education portion of our Sunday mornings. Later in the newsletter, you will see the actual results of the survey, which was completed by about 40% of the average worshiping congregation, though if you factor in children who likely wouldn't do a survey, that number is closer to about 50%, which is pretty good on such a survey.

After much discussion, it was decided to continue into the new year with the schedule we began this fall. I wanted to take a moment to discuss some of what I think we learned, and some of the things we are going to do moving forward, as well as some of the challenges. As we begin the new year, you will be receiving a letter introducing your elder assigned to you and I would encourage you to contact them or me if you have any questions or want to provide further input as it is appreciated.

One of the surprising things is that a clear majority of the congregation wants to keep just one Sunday morning service as almost $80\,\%$ would like to keep it, with 60% liking the schedule as is and the other 19% interested in a different time or switching the worship and Sunday school around. I think that was in large part the reason the Elders decided to keep the schedule as it is. From comments that were given, there was a lot of positive comments on the energy it brings to the service as well as getting to see more people that having two services doesn't allow for as often.

A second insight which probably isn't that surprising is that when it comes to a particular style of worship, there are those who do have a preference and would like to see more of their preference being used in the service that they attend. Having only one service doesn't allow of course for everyone to be satisfied with that, but we have discussed how to try and find a balance as much as possible, and blended worship provides the best avenue for that with just one service. Here is where some of the challenges come in. We are limited somewhat by availability of musicians, something that will become more difficult in the future. Legally we also are unable to stream our services if more contemporary music is used that isn't played by our own musicians, so one option is to stream and archive only the Saturday service, but if someone prefers the contemporary but isn't able to get to church, they won't be able to make use of that style of music. It should be noted by the way, that when we say contemporary, we are referring only to the songs, as our services remain liturgical and will continue to do so. One plan is to have BOB be our music book on the 3rd Sundays of each month.


The other challenge, and one we will continue to wrestle with is the education piece. As you'll see we have seen decreased involvement in Bible Class and Sunday School. It does increase as we prepare for things like the Children's Christmas Program, but we are exploring things to keep both children and parents engaged.

I should note as well, that almost all churches in America are facing some of the same challenges, and while it might be discouraging at times, I would remind you of the Lord's promise that His Church will prevail. I am hopeful that we will continue to see growth, especially as we seek to grow spiritually together.

DIFFERENCE BETWEEN

THRIVENT CHOICE DOLLARS AND THRIVENT ACTION GRANTS

Thrivent Choice Dollars

Thrivent Choice Dollars is an easy way for ELIGIBLE THRIVENT MEMBERS to recommend how Thrivent should distribute a portion of its charitable outreach funds to organizations, such as Trinity Lutheran Church, Orphan Grain Train, Mission Central, Lutheran World Relief, St. Judes Hospital, St. Louis Seminary and many others. All organizations receiving Thrivent Choice dollars must be a 501 C 3 organization. For Thrivent members to be eligible to designate dollars, you must have a certain amount of cash value or own certain products. You can do this on the computer or you can call your representative (Scott Harvey 870-4663) or Thirvent at 800-847-4836 to see if you are eligible to designate dollars. You will have to call Thrivent or go on line to tell them where you want your dollars to go. Thrivent then sends the dollars to whatever account you have designated to receive them. You do not get tax credit for the donation. Choice dollars designated for Trinity go into a designated fund here at church and dollars are designated by the Board for certain expenses or requests. Every year these dollars must be designated by March of the following year. Example: 2022 dollars must be designated by March of the following year.

Thrivent Action Grants

Any Thrivent member 16 years or older may apply for an action grant. You can do this on the computer or you can call 800-947-4836 and they will do it with you over the phone. (Very easy to do over the phone.) You have to be able to tell the name of the project, date it will be completed, how many workers will be involved, do you want T-shirts and how the \$250 will be used. Only 1 request per project is allowed. This is given as a credit card, so be sure that where it is going to be spent accepts credit cards. Planning ideas: Orphan Grain Train, LWML projects, LLL projects, music for choir or band, Christmas Shoe boxes, Mitten trees, coats for children, school supplies for teachers, rodeo club needs and many more. A Thrivent member may do 2 projects a year, an investment member, one project. A final report must be completed (computer or phone) before a second request can be applied for.

If you have a Thrivent, Lutheran Brotherhood or an Aid Association for Lutheran policy or investment be sure to check if you are eligible for either benefit.

Sprinkler system was winterized

Furnace filters were changed in church and parsonage. We switched to a single manufacturer and standard merv rating for all filters

The toilet in women's restroom in the north wing was not functioning. Toilet was cleared and is back in service.

Small rectangle of carpet in sanctuary lifted out at beginning of advent service. Glued the carpet piece back down.

Discussion was started regarding fans in the sanctuary. Spoke with HVAC personnel and was advised that keeping at least one bank of fans on continually will greatly help keep heat/cooling evenly and reduce energy usage.

PASTOR'S REPORT

Put together a worship survey to gage the impact of our change to one service this fall and if any changes are needed. Will be evaluating with leadership and Elder's will be considering any changes going forward. I also want to take some time in the New Year to work with the church leadership to look over questions on a congregational self-study as we look to the next 5-10 years of ministry at Trinity. We have made the transition over to Church 360, which kept our old Shepherd's Staff historical information, but will be updating some of the contact info that was in the Faithlife Equip church management software into Church 360 as it reflects changes since January 2021. We will also be changing our website in the New Year as that feature of Equip is also going to be sunset by April. We hope to accomplish that in January. I will be participating in a continuing education experience with a pastor pod of 3-4 pastors in our area, along the lines of the Leadership Learning Community, but less travel involved as the pastors are in Holdrege and Kearney.

OLD BUSINESS

Sound System- Fellowship Hall sound/video is pending until March of 2023 at the earliest due to supply chain issues on equipment. We are still receiving gifts toward the cost of the project.

NEW BUSINESS

Pastor presented results of the Worship Survey thus far. Notable results: 58% of current responses indicate a desire to keep the current schedule. There was no change in average worship attendance between fall 2021 and fall 2022. It was suggested the Elders revisit why the change was originally made. Pastor suggested we reach out to our individual Elder with ideas.

We will provide the survey to Sunday School parents by way of sending home with students It was suggested to refresh the Facebook newsfeed to bring the survey to the top Pastor will continue to remind congregation of survey in announcements at worship Membership Changes – Deceased, Esther Nierman, December 4, 2022.




My Sunday Worship attendance...

42 responses




My Bible Class/Sunday School attendance...

43 responses




If it were up to me, I would...




If we only have one Sunday morning service I prefer...

42 responses




Impact on our Sunday morning worship change on Bible Class/Sunday School... 40 responses




If you have seen a decrease in attendance in either or both worship and Bible Class/Sunday School since the change in schedule, what is the main reason...


If we were to return to two services, which would you prefer...
