What does it look like to be homeless? The homeless walk amongst us, with no mark to indicate their status. They are happy and sad, worried, hopeful and anxious just like everyone else. At the end of their work or school days, they head to a program facility to shower, pick up stuff they need and maybe wait for a ride with their hungry, tired families to be taken to the next church. They arrive, drop off their stuff and are served a meal provided by volunteers. Maybe your family will like the meal, or maybe your kids will have a meltdown over it. Maybe there is an activity planned, maybe not. Maybe you can get on their wifi to save your data plan, maybe you can't. Maybe there will be toys or other kids for yours to play with and maybe not.

Maybe you will get along with the other families and bond with them. Maybe you won't. You have a curfew to follow, rules that aren't yours. You haven't slept well in weeks. Your kids are tired but not cold and hungry. You move not only every day back and forth to school, work or the program, but on most of your days off you can't sleep late. Every week you change churches. You have to find and pack all of your stuff and your kids' stuff. Double check the vehicles so that no missing lovey object is lost. Heaven forbid if Teddy is lost. If you have your own vehicle, maybe the check engine light will make it one more week just like the bald tires. One more paycheck maybe if you can skimp on other things. Please Lord!?

You may be reflecting on how you became homeless. What choices you would make differently, if you had a choice at all. Maybe you have lost a job, maybe you fell ill and got behind on your rent. Maybe your spouse died, or you gave all your money to a relative without a contract to help them out in order get to stay with them. Or maybe you work hard and just could no longer keep up with your expenses. Maybe your kids got sick or your parents. Maybe you are raising your grandkids.

The volunteers all vary. Some are respectful and caring. Others are stern. Some will listen and provide replacements for lost items like extra pillows, socks, toothpaste or reading glasses. Others may judge you. Hopefully, most don't. We are just like you, you see. But each day you wake up and make progress. You get dressed, and get the kids dressed. Each day is a day of hope that maybe this is the day you hear word that you will have a place of your own again.

Thank you to all of those who have served our neighbors, who have dropped off food or stayed with us to chat or play games. While Mary and Joseph could only find a manger, let us rejoice that we have found room for them in our hearts and our church home. Let us welcome them, as we would grandma and grandpa to the holiday party. Let us share all of our blessings with those amongst us looking for room in the inn. Let us remember Jesus in this holiday season.

RECAP - In 2022, all of the 2020 Cash Reserves were used as well as \$10,000 from the P/E Nelson Annuity. There is a balance of \$14,461.90 left in the Annuity.

PLEDGES - As of December 21, 2022, there are 148 returned pledge cards totaling \$310,376. This includes increases in pledges from two members.

2023 BUDGET - At this time we are looking at a budget of \$501,459 which includes income from pledges and some other income of \$441,422. There is a shortfall of \$60,037. This initial budget includes paying for an organist and a music director for all of 2023 and an associate pastor through April. This does not include hiring an Outreach Coordinator or a Children's Director at this time. *Please help up close the gap so we can continue the many wonderful programs at Trinity!*

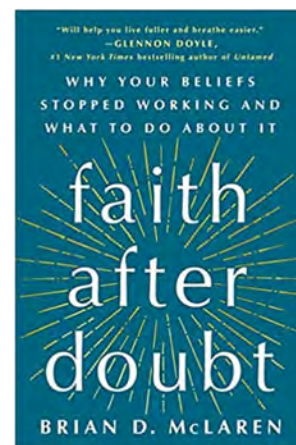

BOOK STUDY

Thursday's at 1pm at Northwoods has started a new book entitled "*Faith after Doubt*" by Brian McLaren.

Sixty-five million adults in the U.S. have dropped out of active church attendance and about 2.7 million more are leaving every year. *Faith After Doubt* is for the millions of people around the world who feel that their faith is falling apart.



Using his own story and the stories of a diverse group of struggling believers, Brian D. McLaren, a former pastor and now an author, speaker, and activist shows how old assumptions are being challenged in nearly every area of human life, not just theology and spirituality. He proposes a four-stage model of faith development in which questions and doubt are not the enemy of faith, but rather a portal to a more mature and fruitful kind of faith. The four stages—Simplicity, Complexity, Perplexity, and Harmony—offer a path forward that can help sincere and thoughtful people leave behind unnecessary baggage and intensify their commitment to what matters most. Even if your faith is strong, this study will help you understand why numerous people are leaving the church and will also help you make connections and new friendships! All are welcome!

However, SNAP cannot be used to purchase these necessary paper products, so families often turn to their local food shelf as the only place that can help them with paper products.

Trinity Blanket Ministry

Trinity's Prayer Blanket Ministry began in 2008 under the guidance of Donna Bakke, Trinity member, who's primary goal was to provide comfort for Trinity members and others as they were going through a life changing event and to let them know the Trinity Congregation was praying for them. She, along with Carol Johnson, organized Trinity members to cut out and make the blankets. Since this program began, over 1800 blankets have been distributed to Trinity members and the Community through such programs as The Refuge, the Angel Tree, the Outerwear Fair, Veterans and the community at large. A typical year at Trinity sees the distribution of 70 or more blankets. Cost per blanket is a minimum of \$20. We will be collecting donations for the Second Sunday offering on January 8th to support the Trinity Blanket Ministry. 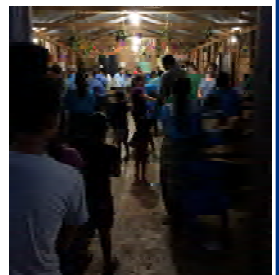

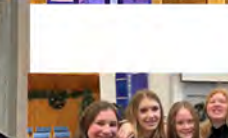

Depression is more than being sad or going through a rough patch. It is a serious mental health condition that requires understanding and medical care. Some people have only one episode in a lifetime, but for most people depression happens multiple times and may last a few months to several years. Depression affects all people and is somewhat common, although young adults are more likely to have depression than those who are older.

What are the symptoms?

Just like with any mental illness, people with depression show different signs of depression. But for most people, depression changes their daily life.

Common symptoms of depression include:

- Changes in sleep
- Changes in appetite
- Having a hard time focusing
- Feeling low energy
- Losing interest
- Low self esteem
- Feeling Hopelessness
- Changes in movement
- Aches and pains in the body
- Suicidal thoughts

What are the causes

Depression is not caused by just one thing, instead there are many things that may cause depression,

- **Trauma.** Trauma at an early age can change a person's brain. These changes can lead to depression.
- **Family History.** Depression can run in families.
- **Life Circumstances.** Such as being stressed, losing a job, feeling unsafe where you live, difficult relationships, etc.
- **Brain Structure.** Some parts of the brain may act differently in those with depression.
- **Medical Conditions.** People with medical illnesses such as diabetes, MS, or heart conditions are more likely to experience depression. Those who experience sleep disturbances, chronic pain, anxiety, or attention-deficit hyperactivity disorder (ADHD) are also more likely.
- **Drug and alcohol use.**

Diagnosis

To be diagnosed with depression, a person must experience a major depressive episode for more than two weeks. The signs of a major depressive episode include,

- Loss of interest or pleasure in all activities
- Change in appetite or weight
- Difficulty sleeping
- Feeling nervous or feeling slowed down
- Feeling very tired
- Feelings of low self-worth or guilt
- Difficulty concentrating or making decisions
- Suicidal thoughts or intentions

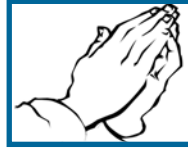

Trinity is a Climate Justice Congregation.

Climate Justice Congregations are communities of faith and spiritual practice that are committed to living out their faith and values through effective and sustained action on climate justice.

Along with Trinity, there are 24 other churches in Minnesota who are certified by Minnesota Interfaith Power & Light (MNIPL) as Climate Justice Congregations.

When Earth was created, God entrusted us as stewards. This calls us to care for it and each other in all of our actions. When we make environmentally wise choices we are celebrating and respecting creation, giving thanks for Earth's abundant resources, and being good stewards with what we're given.

Being good stewards of resources also means using only what we need-- like the energy we use to cool or heat, turn the lights on, and power our favorite gadgets in our homes, churches and other buildings. We can also be more thoughtful about where the energy we use to power our lives comes from. The routine electric energy mix received in Minnesota continues to come mostly from coal, and coal is the most polluting source of electric energy. The good news is that wind and solar energy are growing very fast, and we can encourage that growth by opting in to a clean electricity program. Transitioning to renewable energies ensures a healthy planet for future generations.

According to MNIPL, It has never been easier for faith and spiritual communities to choose solar energy and care for the earth with clean, renewable electricity. With MNIPL's programs, faith and spiritual communities have two excellent options:

1. buy our own solar system and eliminate electricity bills, or
2. pay nothing and lock in a 10% discount on electricity for 25 years

(Colossians 3:17) Whatever you do in word or deed, do all in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks through Him to God the Father.
