A) Revealed wrath

- -John Murray, "Wrath is the holy revulsion of God's being against that which is the contradiction of His holiness."
- -Leon Morris, "The biblical writers habitually use for the divine wrath a word that denotes not so much a sudden flaring up of passion which is soon over, as a strong settled opposition to all that is evil arising out of God's very nature."

C) Contrary wrath

R. C. Sproul, "...I have to tell you that I do not have to prove to you that God exists, because I think you already know it. Your problem is not that you do not know that God exists; your problem is that you despise the God whom you know exists. Your problem is not intellectual; it is moral – you hate God."
