A NEW HOPE

"Thank you! We have a new hope!" These words were enthusiastically spoken to me by Pastor Zeniya, of the Japanese Lutheran Brethren Church (JLBC), serving in Sendai, Japan. I was wrapping up my first visit as Director of Lutheran Brethren International Mission (LBIM) to Japan, and Pastor Zeniya was referring to his reaction to the conversations and meetings I had been priviledged to be a part of over the previous week. I had spent time with LBIM missionary Dean Bengtson and his JLBC partner, Pastor Haruya, learning about their church planting ministry in Ishinomaki. I had been part of a meeting of pastors from the Japanese Lutheran Brethren Church, discussing how LBIM might move forward with a renewed partnership with the JLBC in mission in Japan, where less than 1% of the population are evangelical Christian. I spent one on one time with Pastor Wakamatsu, the president of the JLBC. And I had met individually with several of the pastors, including Pastor Zeniya, whose congregation is eager to plant a new church or sister campus in the inner city of Sendai, and are hopeful that future LBIM missionaries might be able to work alongside them in this effort.

I believe that the "new hope" that Pastor Zeniya is referring to is multi-faceted. A hope for renewed partnership with LBIM, that emphasizes an interdependent unity in mission, focusing on community outreach and relational evangelism; a hope for new LBIM missionaries coming to Japan; a hope for a fresh mission passion and engagement on the part of the JLBC leadership and lay people alike; a hope for the spiritually lost people and nation of Japan, that God would use the JLBC and LBIM to be part of a fresh wind of the gospel to move through the nation of Japan; a hope in the sure promise that God will continue to use his global Church to be a people sent out into their neighborhoods, cities, and nations, for the sake of the gospel and the glory of God.

Dear reader, please join me in prayer for Japan this month. Pray for the JLBC, its leaders and its members, that they would be full of joy in their salvation and be encouraged in their calling to be a Church and people on mission. Pray for Dean and Linda Bengtson, for JLBC missionary partner Pastor Haruya, for Paul and Alexa Fraser (LBIM missionary candidates for Japan), and other potential future missionaries that the Lord is raising up for this field. Pray for the Lord's will, wisdom, and direction regarding a potential future LBIM/JLBC mission partnership development. And most importantly, pray for the unreached people of Japan, that they would hear anew the message of the gospel, and that faith would come through that hearing.
