

- Prayer Empowered Evangelism



JOURNEY THROUGH GRIEF Saturdays, February 25-March 25 2:00 p.m. | Ashton Commons

This class is designed to educate individuals about the grief process and to create a safe space to share grief experiences with one another. Expect to learn from others' journeys, walk alongside each other, and spend time understanding the process of grief and the many emotions and thoughts that result from it. The class will consist of one-hour weekly meetings on Saturday afternoons at 2:00 P.M. for five weeks.

The facilitator, Kiley Librich, is a licensed social worker who has more than 20 years of therapy experience. Currently she has her own private practice out of Zelienople, PA. She counsels individuals, families and couples and treats a variety of mental health issues including but not limited to, depression, anxiety, trauma, abuse, family conflict, relational issues, and anger management. She has a bachelor's degree in Psychology from Grove City College and a Master's in Social Work from the University of Pittsburgh.

New Hope sends a huge THANK YOU to NPC! Once again, NPC provided an impressive amount of gifts and dozens of cookies to our sister church, New Hope. Memorial Park Church also donated gifts and cookies to help with the "store." Ann Spangler donated several boxes of children's books and Tim LaBarre and his friends at Highpoint's Rebecca Retirement Center provided about 30 hand crafted wood trains and trucks. Those extra gifts were a big hit. We also provided new hats, scarves, gloves, mittens and some items for their stockings!

Eighty-four families which included over 200 children were served from December 17 through Christmas Eve. Sixty-one families came on the actual date of the "store" but Linda Collins, the New Hope liaison, was able to keep enough toys aside to serve late coming families. Twenty-three families called on her up until as late as Christmas Eve! You may have read in the Prayer Letter that Linda is struggling with health issues but that didn't slow her down. She organized the gifts and kept track of those in need so the day went smoothly.

We have really enjoyed the New Hope Christmas Store ministry for the past five years and even though dealing with COVID took away some of the hospitality opportunities, we were still able to give generously and show love to our neighbors. We are very grateful to Jeff, Kristen, Will, Ben and Natalie Smalley for stepping into this ministry to continue the relationship with the New Hope Christmas Store as we step down.
