

The Church: A Reflection of Jesus' Light

In these weeks of the church year between Epiphany and the start of Lent, we give thanks for the ways Jesus shines light into the darkness of this world and for the ways God calls us to share that light. We, the Church, together are a reflection of that light. So I thought that, once again, I would *reflect* on the ways and reasons that I find the Church so special:

- -The church is a place where we come <u>together</u> to live our life of faith. Just as God is not acting alone but is revealed in three persons, we are not meant to live out our faith alone.
- -The church shows up. Whether it's for a funeral or a fundraiser or to cheer someone on, members of the church intentionally make time and space to show up for each other.
- -The church surrounds and supports each other. I can't count the number of times I've seen someone in worship who can't speak, sing, or participate because the burden they are carrying is simply too overwhelming. Yet everyone around them can speak, and sing, and participate on their behalf. We can bring our struggles to this place and trust that we will be surrounded with love and care.
- -The church welcomes. I love to watch a member approach and welcome a visitor. I love to watch members bring their friends and family to show them why

they find this place meaningful. I love to watch the mess of kids barrel down the aisle for the Children's Sermon. I love to look up from the pulpit and see a child playing with trucks in the aisle, or sitting next to someone from a different generation or different family coloring together. I love it when I hear someone say, "this church is just so friendly!"

SCHOLARSHIP

Central States Women of the ELCA Scholarship Available

"... support one another in our callings, engage in ministry and action ...".



These words reflect a small portion of the Purpose Statement of the Women of the ELCA. In keeping with the Central these words, States Women of the ELCA sponsor an education scholarship for women who are members of an ELCA

congregation.

This scholarship became part of our ministry in September 2014, when it was approved at the women's annual convention. The scholarship is available to high school graduates:

- Women who are seeking to further their education beyond high school,
- Women pursuing a higher degree, or
- Women seeking to career change.

This is a one-year scholarship which is non-renewable and does not exceed \$1000 per recipient. Multiple scholarships may be given each year, depending on the monies available.

Applicants are to obtain a written recommendation and signature from their pastor, mentor, unit president or a unit representative. They also are to submit an essay that describes their participation in church, school, and in the community.

Applications can be found on each of the ushers' stands. The application must be submitted by March 1 (address provided on the form). If you have any questions, please contact Janice Gerken (660-281-7380).

This scholarship is an opportunity for the Central States Women of the ELCA to uplift and support ALL women of the ELCA.



EVANGELISM MOMENT

I pray that my understanding of and ability to evangelize, that is, to share the GOOD NEWS continues deepen and grow. Years ago, more I care calculate. than to understanding of the term evangelism was very naïve and limited, and thus my desire to share the good news, was very limited. I remember having an image of perhaps walking door to door, either inviting people to attend an event or church services. My initial perception of when taking a pastoral counseling practicum at a hospital as part of a college course was of perhaps handing out Bibles and making sure the person's local Pastor, if he or she had one, was in contact. I came to understand that sharing the Good News was not an activityoriented behavior. Evangelism was a SHARING behavior. If we focus on an activity, a "doing" behavior, we are missing the point, I think.


My youngest sister, a nurse, went to Haiti during the summer one year, to medically care for people, and to share Christ's love with those in need. My middle sister, also a nurse, was for many years a nurse during Lutheran summer youth camps, caring for scrapes, poison ivy rashes, and a few broken bones. I helped at youth camps with sports activities, donating

a week of vacation time, to help troubled youth. These events were all activity oriented, but opportunities to share God's love through participation and caring, taking time to talk, to interact with others. Each step along this path, my understanding of the evangelism process has grown. The activity just provides a vehicle, a "car", if you will, towards a destination. That destination is the opportunity to Share God's love through giving of ourselves, whether it be our attention, interest, our advice, experience or knowledge, but mostly our time and actual caring to demonstrate God's love, to share the Good News through our behavior and our experiences learning about Christ's love. lookina forward to learning and growing more in this manner.


