

Missions Emphasis & Updates




Toby & Susan Stevens—International Baptist Church, Cambridge, MA

Missions Emphasis Sunday—January 22 PM; Sid & Susie Messer (GFA Missions, Ecuador)


Sid & Susie Messer will be with us during the evening service on January 22. They were able to make a brief last-minute "bonus visit" back on October 5.

Sid will be preaching and presenting a ministry update that evening. This will be a wonderful opportunity to fellowship with our faithful ministry partners and to praise the Lord together.


Adult Sunday School Series

Starting on January 1st, we began a new study in adult Sunday school.

- Topic/Text: Genesis—"God's Plan Begins"
- Teachers: David Galvin and Brandon Cordio.



• Summary: This study surveys the book of Genesis. The special focus is on God and His plan of creation and redemption. Learners will take away meaningful applications from the study, and they will grow in their understanding of God's dealings with characters such as Adam, Noah, Abraham, Isaac, Jacob, and Joseph.

Verse 3





The Letter to the PHILIPPIANS January 2023—Philippians chapter 1

January 1-7

¹ Paul and Timotheus, the servants of Jesus Christ, to all the saints in Christ Jesus which are at Philippi, with the bishops and deacons: ² Grace *be* unto you, and peace, from God our Father, and *from* the Lord Jesus Christ.

January 8-14

³ I thank my God upon every remembrance of you, ⁴ Always in every prayer of mine for you all making request with joy,

January 15-21

⁵ For your fellowship in the gospel from the first day until now; ⁶ Being confident of this very thing, that he which hath begun a good work in you will perform *it* until the day of Jesus Christ:

January 22-28

⁷ Even as it is meet for me to think this of you all, because I have you in my heart; inasmuch as both in my bonds, and in the defense and confirmation of the gospel, ye all are partakers of my grace. ⁸ For God is my record, how greatly I long after you all in the bowels of Jesus Christ.

January 29-February 4

⁹ And this I pray, that your love may abound yet more and more in knowledge and *in* all judgment; ¹⁰ That ye may approve things that are excellent; that ye may be sincere and without offence till the day of Christ;

Week of January 1-7:

Morning Service (1/1)—Pastor Wiggins brought a message for the New Year, "Fresh Starts and Second Chances." It focused on the examples of some believers in the scriptures who were both bad and good examples. They were believers who faced serious challenges and made significant mistakes in their life. But they didn't stay "stuck in reverse." They expressed repentance. They embraced God's forgiveness and grace. And they experienced God's blessing. (1) Moses, a big man with a big problem [Exodus 2:11-15; Acts 7:18-29]; (2) **David**, a powerful man with uncontrolled passion [Psalm 32 & 51; Acts 13:22]; (3) Peter, a confident man with a significant disconnect [Luke 22:31-34, 54-62]; and (4) John Mark, an eager young man who failed to stand the test [Acts 13:4-5, 13; 15:36-40; 2 Tim 4:9-11].

Evening Service (1/1)—Pastor Wiggins taught on "Start Well, End Well," based on 1 Corinthians 10:1-13. The background in chapter 9 shows Paul's delight in service, being willing to make any sacrifice and employ any legitimate means to reach people for Christ (1 Cor 9:19-23). However, he was also very concerned about the danger of sin in the life of believers, including himself, and did not want anything to cause him to be disqualified in the ministry (1 Cor 9:24-27). In light of that, he also challenged the Corinthians believers. (1) The historical context (1 Cor 10:1-5) highlights the sinful failures of the Nation of Israel during the years wandering in the wilderness. It is a reminder that privileges are no guarantee of success. (2) Personal exhortations follow (1 Cor 10:6-11), reminding the believers that they should not under any circumstances engage in sinful behaviors like the Israelites did. Sin is never safe! The consequences are serious. God's patience is not to be tried. God's holiness is not to be trifled with. (3) Paul finished by focusing on the spiritual resources available to believers, a theological foundation (1 Cor 10:12-13). He acknowledged that the temptations are real. He reminded them that the needed strength is not in them. Then he encouraged them that the needed strength is in the faithfulness of God who works in and through trusting believers. God will enable us to overcome temptation and endure hard trials if we obey His word!

Psalm 90:10, 12

¹⁰ The days of our years are threescore years and ten; And if by reason of strength they be fourscore years, Yet is their strength labor and sorrow; For it is soon cut off, and we fly away. 12 So teach us to number our days, That we may present to You a heart of wisdom.

Midweek Service (1/4)—Pastor Wiggins taught a lesson, "Another New Year!" We looked at Psalm 90, especially vs. 9-12. How one prepares for and faces the brevity of life and its trials depends on what one believes about important spiritual realities. (1) Life is brief...longer for some than others...but always brief. (2) Life is challenging for all...and can be crushing for some...because of sin [e.g. sin affecting our world, sin in our heart, sins of others impacting us]. (3) Life reveals our sin and reminds us of God's holiness. We must cling to His loving kindness and plead for His mercy. (4) Life requires humility before a mighty God. We desire to see His splendor and majesty in life. We need to experience His blessing upon our labors. That leads to an important responsibility and a holy desire. (1) "Number our days!" [i.e. pay careful attention to each day since they are so limited; don't neglect or overlook any day] (2) "Present...a heart of wisdom" to God! [i.e. make our lives count; use each day wisely; live in a way that will please God].
