Seek the Lord... Seek integrity, seek humility

The prophet Zephaniah spoke to the remnant of Judah at a time when the Assyrian power was waning and a sense of hope was starting to emerge. He calls them, as the prophets often did, to integrity and humility. This same call is made to us today through beatitudes. St Paul's advice to the young church of Corinth encourages them to see things differently from the values of power and strength.

Pope Benedict described the Beatitudes as "a new programme of life, to free oneself from the false values of the world and to open oneself to the true goods, present and future. Indeed, when God comforts, he satisfies the hunger for righteousness, he wipes away the tears of those who mourn, which means that, as well as compensating each one in a practical way, he opens the Kingdom of Heaven. The Beatitudes are the transposition of the Cross and Resurrection into discipleship. They mirror the life of the Son of God who let himself even be persecuted and despised until he was condemned to death so that salvation might be given to men and women."

In other words, they sum up both what it means to imitate Jesus in our lives and how we might understand that which Jesus brings about. In the words of Romano Guardini, they demand that we "eradicate the old, deeply rooted claim that the world is sufficient unto itself, the essential and only reality... Such self-emancipation is particularly difficult for those for whom the world holds the most delights – the powerful and creative, for all who have a large share in earth's greatness and beauty... [Blessings are given to] the poor, the mournful, the hungry and persecuted, not because their condition in itself is blessed, but because it helps them to realise that more than just this world exists."

In the changing of an era that marks the present day, a time in which the church and Christian community is humbled by sin and weakness, I wonder if the Beatitudes may help us to reimagine life together in Christ and to trust that our letting go of self and the faithful, persistent and patient search for the Lord will indeed bear the fruit of the kingdom of heaven.
