#### **TBPC's 2023 Missions Conference**

## TBPC MISSIONS CONFERENCE Serving God's Purpose in Our Own Generation Acts 13:36-52

The TBPC Missions Conference is February 17 through 19. It will be a great conference with 7 of our 8 supported missionaries taking part. It is an excellent opportunity to meet your missionaries and they will be delighted to share what is happening in their respective ministry.

February 18 is our All-Church Dinner Event beginning at 5:30pm until 7:30pm. The meal will be catered by Mission BBQ—we thought it appropriate. The cost to you will be \$10, for ages 12 and under--no charge. TBPC's choir will be singing. They will also lead us in congregational singing as we celebrate the work of missions. A missionary will be at each table giving you ample opportunity to talk personally. In addition, each missionary/couple will share briefly about their work during the program. To add some fun to the evening, we ask you to bring a special, unique, or tantalizing dessert. We will have 'people's choice' awards for the desserts. For the best dessert overall in two categories—youth and adult—the TBPC coveted apron will be awarded. So, we hope to be dazzled by desserts. Of course, it means you will have to engage in the hard duty of sampling a multitude of desserts.

Our conference speaker is Dr. Herb Ward. He is a professor at Covenant College in Chattanooga, Tennessee in Biblical Studies and Missions. Dr. Ward has enjoyed more than one career, which has provided him with an array of skills he puts to use in teaching, research, preaching, and missions. He was a practicing attorney in Michigan and later with MTW he served as a missionary in East and South Africa.

#### **Programs**

Pre-K 2 (Students must have turned 2 by 1 Sep 2023)

Two-day class (T/Th): \$245 per month Three-day class (M/W/F): \$345 per month

Pre-K 3 (Students must have turned 3 by 1 Sep 2023)

Two-day class (T/Th): \$235 per month Three-day class (M/W/F): \$335 per month Five-day class (M-F): \$525 per month

Pre-K 4 (Students must have turned 4 by 1 Sep 2023)



Five-day classes (M-F): \$300 per month

Note: This is a private program; not a VPK program

Tuition is charged for nine months beginning in August of the school year. A non-refundable registration fee of \$175 is due at the time of registration, (\$100 for Pre-K 4). A supply fee of \$50 for Pre-K 3 and \$65 for Pre-K 4 is invoiced with the first month's tuition to assist us with the cost of student material for the Abeka curriculum. A 25% tuition discount is offered for the tuition of a second child enrolled and for members of TBPC.


We are encouraged by the good attendance at the beginning of the new year. We have had 12 new students inquire about ESL just during the month of January!




#### **Student Prayer Requests:**
