Pastor's Corner Leave the Past in the Past

Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, the new creation has come. The old has gone, the new is here! All this is from God, who reconciled us to himself through Christ and gave us the ministry of reconciliation: that God was reconciling the world to himself in Christ, not counting people's sins against them. And he has committed to us the message of reconciliation. 2 Corinthians 5:17-19

Past definition - having existed or taken place in a period before the present

Greek translation - Past - to parelthón

Hebrew translation - etmol - meaning yesterday - the past

Wouldn't it be great to have a do over, a second chance to do and be better? Can you imagine being able erase the past and start new? In this passage, from 2 Cor. 5:17-19, Paul, the Apostle, is saying just that. Upon acceptance of Christ, that which represented the past, your former life, mistakes, sin, have been forgiven, through Jesus' sacrifice on the Cross, and His resurrection. You become a new creation, through your intentional choice to follow and serve Christ. By reading God's Word, through prayer and being mindful of your thoughts, actions and words, your mind, heart and spirit become renewed.

By following Christ, you allow your mind to be transformed to those things, which are pure, good, compassionate, and pleasing to God (Romans 12:2). God removes the heart of judgment, unkindness and unforgiveness and creates a new heart, and kind spirit, that reflects His love, grace and mercy (Psalm 51:10).

Paul, who was formerly Saul, epitomized this transformation from being a murderer, and persecuting Christians, to being a follower of Christ. On his way to persecute more Christians, he was blinded by a brilliant light and fell to the ground. The voice of Jesus came from the light, asking then formerly known as Saul, why does he persecute him. Jesus was letting him know that when he persecuted His people, Saul was persecuting Him.

After that experience, Saul had a radical conversion experience and was renamed Paul. He became a devout follower of Christ, preaching the Gospel to the Gentiles and all who would listen, and leading many to Christ. The former nature of Paul no longer existed. Through his acceptance and obedience to serve Christ, he became a new creation. If Paul could change, by the personal encounter with Christ, anyone can become a new creation.

Choose this day to follow Christ, and serve and glorify God, all the days of your life. Choose to be a servant of God's people, as His hands, feet and mouthpiece in this world. Choose to be bold and courageous in your witness and testimony of Jesus, to people. Ask God for wisdom, regarding when and how to speak to a person that is lonely, afraid, and needs to hear of the salvation of Jesus, and His unconditional love of all people. Do not be a closet Christian, but a Christian, who is unashamed of the Gospel of Jesus Christ, nor being a follower of Christ. You have the power to share the love of God, His compassion and forgiveness, with all who are in search of knowing Christ. Choose this day to be all that Christ has called you to be – blessed, highly favored, and your best self.

Missions

For the past six years, your Missions Committee has been supporting a student through Pura Vida Ministries, a nonprofit organization promoting education in the western highlands of Guatemala. I am pleased to announce that this student, Natividad, recently completed the 12th grade (a major accomplishment in rural Guatemala) and she is now anxious to continue her studies at the university level with aspirations of becoming a secondary teacher. Janie Williams, the Student Sponsor Liaison with Pura Vida, reached out to Pastor Tracey in December to see if Hilltop would be willing to continue supporting Natividad through her three years at university (sponsorship rates more than double due to increased costs for higher education).

Pastor Tracey asked the Missions Committee to make a decision on this issue, so a special meeting was held on December 22nd. At this meeting, it was decided that it is important for Hilltop to not abandon Natividad at this point in her educational pursuits and it is our deepest hope that she will be able to use her skills as a teacher to 'multiply our gift' by giving back to the next generation of students in Guatemala.



The Missions Committee is very grateful to the Scarborough/Montoya family for their gift of communicating with Natividad on a regular basis and for providing her with the love and encouragement that has enabled her to thrive. Together, we look forward to another three years of fostering the relationship that has blossomed between Hilltop and this remarkable young lady in Guatemala! (If you would like to get more information about Pura Vida Ministries or would like to see some of the correspondence from Natividad, please check the Missions bulletin board in the north hallway).

In addition to increasing our Pura Vida sponsorship, the Missions Committee is making \$500 disbursements to the Ntabende Primary School in Zimbabwe, UMCOR (to be used to fund relief efforts where needed most) and the Inn Between (a hospice facility for unsheltered people in Salt Lake City). Volunteer opportunities in the coming month include the Share Your Bounty Food Drive on February 5th and Family Promise hosting during the week of February 26th through March 5th.

As always, we are very grateful to everyone who has supported the committee through their donations, volunteerism, and participation in our various missions projects. We will continue to work hard to ensure that everyone has the opportunity to Walk with Christ by getting involved in a missions project that they find meaningful to their spiritual formation.

Walking with Christ



10 Spiritual Principles for Climate Repentance: The Elijah Board of World Religious Leaders

The leaders of the world were gathered in Egypt, during this time of great international tension and conflict, for the Cop-27 meeting. Theirs is the urgent work of addressing the practical challenges of climate change and for negotiating between nations, in an attempt to help humanity resolve the climate crisis. As religious leaders we offer our voice as a contribution to the gathered leaders and to humanity. With the following ten principles we seek to initiate a process of climate repentance, broader understanding, and effective action. Our call is a call to action; and a call to return to a correct vision of the creation, the creator, and the harmonious relationship of humanity with creation.

God and the world - the Nature of Being

- 1. We recognize human responsibility to love and protect nature.
- 2. We must treat all of life with reverence.
- 3. We must care for each other and the planet.

Humanity and Its Responsibilities

- 1. We recognize that we are responsible for the wellbeing of all life today, as well as for future generations.
- 2. A disciplined spiritual life is helpful in overcoming the challenges of climate change.
- 3. Use thought, speech and action only for the good.
- 4. The human person is benefitted by the ongoing effort to purify, raise, and transform himself, in view of a higher vision.

Living in Spirituality and Responsibility

- 1. Act knowing that every action counts.
- 2. Take seriously the lessons and observations that humanity has reached by application of its mind in scientific study and through common reason.
- 3. Be sensitive to the intolerable insecurities and injustices in which so many of our fellow-humans live.
