Highlights from 2022 include:

- Community Outreach (including establishing "Community Chests" at Vang and Dennison, the frozen meal ministry, the "Growing Connections" Garden, Care Team, training in people to take communion to people's homes, parent's night out)
- New Worship services at Dennison (Songs of My Life, Evening Prayer)
- Cultural Encounters (JustMove led worship in May, A Migrant's Journey joint confirmation event, Border Immersion presentations)
- Christmas Play

As a way to lift up healthy stewardship, I often will highlight something positive our churches have done in the previous week. It is never hard to think of something. Our churches are active and making a difference in Christ's name.

Goals for 2023 include:

- Faith formation opportunities for adults. I hope to begin an on-going Centering Prayer group in February, and adult ed opportunities at the Wednesday community nights.
- Work on ways our local churches can share ministries and resources. Good things happen when
 we collaborate, and I feel this could be a source of vitality for our churches moving forward.
- Continue Dennison Outreach.
- Begin planning summer a youth/young adult trip for this summer and the ELCA Youth Gathering in 2024.

At our 2022 Synod Assembly, we gathered under the theme *Imagine: Endless Possibilities in God's Grace*. As we live into the future God has for us, we see what we had once only imagined start to take shape in concrete ways.

This year has brought a new way of meeting the needs of congregations in transition as we have explored various models for pastoral ministry. Most prominent among them is what we call a Bridge to Settled model. This new model allows congregations to work with a Bridge pastor (different than an intentionally trained interim) while forming a call committee and engaging in the call process with the understanding that both the pastor and congregation are open to transitioning from the Bridge into a settled call. It is not the right model for every congregation, but it has greatly benefited many.

We have also seen a gentle uptick in individual congregations exploring partnerships of all kinds. Some congregations are forming new joint parishes, others are working together to meld two part-time calls into full-time work for a single candidate, and still others are merging weekly confirmation classes. More and more of our congregations are realizing the profound benefits and joy of collaboration.

It has been fun to walk alongside folks as they lead their congregations into new ways of being the People of God in their community in this time and place.

As 2023 approaches, I remain ever hopeful for all that the Spirit will continue to do in and through us as the Southeastern Minnesota Synod. Looking ahead to our next Synod Assembly, I am excited to announce that we will be joined by Drs. Susan Brower and Matt Bloom. Drs. Brower and Bloom will give us tools to understand our communities as they are presently and as they are projected to be. They will also explore ways congregations can ignite flourishing in the communities to which they are called.

I am excited to continue imagining alongside each of you as we discern what God is doing in our midst and calling us to do. What a wonderful time to be the church together for the sake of the world.

Vang Dennison Care Team usually meets a few times during the year to discuss different topics relating to the needs of people in our congregation or others that may need some extra support or a visit. One topic was, "Recognizing Depression in the Elderly".

During the Pandemic, as we all know it became a challenge to visit people in person. Team members came up with new ways to let people know we care; by sending Halloween, Thanksgiving, Christmas, Thinking of You cards and letters.

For Valentine's Day a group gathered to make and decorate Valentine Cookies. Plates of cookies that were decorated with love were delivered to church members.

At Christmas we collaborated with our youth to decorate cookies and put together fruit and cookie trays that were delivered to church members and others in our community.

Care team members keep in touch with individuals with phone calls or in person visits. They can even get into playing cards on visits, bringing frozen meals, homemade treats, flowers, or even donuts for Donut Day.

Communion has also been brought to members requesting it, especially when Pastor Paul was on vacation.

Family Ministry Team - Annual Report for 2022

The mission of the family ministry team reads, "Through family ministry at Vang and Dennison Lutheran Parish, we seek to grow faith, build relationships, and serve together."

Primary duties of the family ministry team include providing children's ministry, community events, and milestone ministry. The Family Ministry Team also provides input on confirmation and high school ministry.

Ministries in 2022 included:

Service and Learning trips: There were 16 people signed up for the ELCA Youth Gathering. The Gathering was to be last summer, but was cancelled due to COVID concerns. A number of other trip options were explored as an alternative. We had signed up for a service trip in Chicago, but that to was cancelled at the last minute due to lack of staff. We are exploring options for a trip this summer, and are looking ahead to the ELCA Youth Gathering in 2024.

Confirmation Ministry: 7th and 8th grade confirmation meets weekly on Wednesdays at 6:30. Thanks to Amanda Flom for all her help this year with this ministry. The 9th grade confirmation group is focusing on service projects.

Community and Faith Formation Nights," providing worship, and faith ed opportunities for children, confirmation students, and adults.

Milestones celebrated in worship included First Communion, Confirmation, Graduation, and bibles to 3 year olds and 3rd graders.

Community events - Including "parents night out" and bingo night.

Worship participation opportunities for children – including the Christmas Play, bulletin cover artwork, noisy offerings, children's messages, and "Lectio Visina."

One challenge in the upcoming years is that we will be having smaller class sizes in the upcoming years than we have had in previous years.

Moving weekly children's activities from Sundays to Wednesdays was a big change this year. Part of the intent was to have community nights were adult, youth, and kids were all engaging in worship together, and then breaking into age groups for faith formation and continuing ed activities. This is intended as an experiment that will be evaluated at the end of the year.

Serving on the Family Ministry Team are Amanda Flom, Lori Ramig, Molly Ryan, Louise Starr, and Missy Sviggum. The family ministry team meets on the first Monday of the month at 6:00 PM.

KW Ministry Partnerships

Grace and peace to you!

All of our churches are dealing with a variety of challenges, and amid those challenges there are opportunities. One area of potential vitality is developing ministry partnerships among our KW area churches. Good things happen when we share our resources, ministries, energy, and ideas.

There was good work done in developing ministry partnerships with KW ELCA churches in 2022. This is a review of the past year and a look ahead at possibilities for 2023.

Discernment Gathering - In May, a group of pastors and lay leaders from KW area churches met. The purpose was to gather interested congregation members and to build relationships.

Rally Day - In September, a combined Rally Day service was held at Holden Park. Members of Dale, First, Holden, Gol, Minneola, and Vang churches participated. We welcomed Bishop Regina Hassanally, who preached about our unity in Christ and our shared mission as Christ's church. Following worship there were service and fellowship opportunities (including lunch and root beer floats.)

Planning Gathering – In October, a group of pastors and lay leaders met at Fireside in Dennison to brainstorm shared events for the upcoming months.

Community Faith Night – In November, there was a community faith night at First Lutheran.

Confirmation groups from Dale, Holden, First, and Vang learned about homelessness. An adult forum welcomed Bob Hawley from Goodhue County Habitat for Humanity, who shared about the good work they are doing in our community. There were activities for children, who made "Advent Chains" to help celebrate Advent in the home.

KW Area Church Collaboration Facebook page – A Facebook page was set up to share information about worship services and upcoming events at our churches.

Upcoming events - Coming up on Sunday evening, February 18, there will be an adult ed time that will be a movie night, and a time to gather ideas from people for future adult ed events. (Time and location TBA)

A Centering Prayer group is currently taking shape that will be open to people from all area churches.

The next ministry sharing leadership meeting will be on January 31. Please contact your pastor if you would feel called to be a part of this collaborative ministry team, or if you have additional questions.

We look forward to ways we can witness and serve together in Christ's name in 2023.

BUILDING COMMITTEE

The church steeple remains the biggest concern. Upon inspection, we determined the main supports below look to be still structurally sound. We found that the upper structure is badly damaged on the main support on the southeast corner and the spires are rotten and leaking. The project was put on hold due to the weather conditions and will continue this spring.

In March 2022 we applied for a grant from the National funds for Scared Places to use for restoration of our steeple. There were three hundred sixty five applications submitted, we were one of thirty four selected for the second phase. The final selection of sixteen historical churches were announced in October, of which we did not receive the grant.

Our Big project this year was the roof replacement, damaged and rotten wood replacement, and painting those areas. A thank you to Al Kern for the donation of time and resources during this project.

The float was replaced in the septic tank. The phone in the kitchen was changed from a landline to a cellphone at substantial savings. We would like to thank Ken Vesledahl for furnace, elevator and alarm system maintenance and door latch repair. We would also like to thank Larry Flom and Steve Rauk for lawn and parking lot maintenance.
