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### The Gospel in Seven Words

Imagine that a friend or family member who is unfamiliar with your Christian faith asks you to summarize the gospel. She isn't looking for a laundry list of doctrines. She has no interest in hearing you recite the Apostles' Creed. She wants to get to the heart of the matter. "In seven words or less," she says, "tell me what you believe as a Christian."

What would you say? How would you put it? Are you be prepared to confess your faith in Jesus?

To be a Christian is to "*believe with your heart*" and "*confess with your mouth*" the good news of God's love for us in Christ (Romans 10:9–10). Peter calls us to be prepared always to give a reason for the hope we have as Christians (1 Peter 3:15). Christians have the best news in the world to share! But are we prepared to share it?

During this season of Lent, we're going to prepare to celebrate Holy Week by sharing why Holy Week is so important. Our midweek worship services will serve as opportunities to consider the many ways in which the Scriptures proclaim Jesus. During the week, each of you will be working on your own summary, with the hopes that all of us are more prepared to share the good news of Jesus. Come and join us this Lent, and join us by crafting your own confession of the gospel!



### **From the Pastor**

### The Gospel in Seven Words!

"[B]ut in your hearts honor Christ the Lord as holy, always being prepared to make a defense to anyone who asks you for a reason for the hope that is in you; yet do it with gentleness and respect." - 1 Peter 3:15



Our country has changed a lot over the past 60 years. Some of the changes have

been positive, others have not. One of the changes that we see so prevalent in our country and community is the lack of knowing what Christians believe and why. Many simply so not understand the Christian faith or what seasons like Lent are all about. If someone were to ask you what Lent is about or even the Christian faith, how would you answer? The apostle Peter encourages us to always be prepared to give an answer for the hope that we have in Christ. To be a Christian is to confess the faith.

Back in 2010 an article was published in a Christian magazine called, "The Gospel in Seven Words" (The Christian Century, Sept. 2010). The author invited fifteen prominent theologians around the country to give it a shot— to proclaim the gospel as clearly as they could. But instead of letting them recite the Apostles' Creed, he allowed them only seven words. Some of their versions were faithful and true and creatively insightful. Others left something to be desired, and even missed the point. Here are some of the better ones:

"In Christ, God's yes defeats our no." "God, through Jesus Christ, welcomes you anyhow." "God was in Christ, reconciling the world."

All of these statements are faithful to the Gospel. Each of these brings out one specific aspect of the Gospel. Each of them tells someone something specific that Christ has done for them. That is what we do as Christians; we simply are telling someone about Jesus and what He has done for them. In our Lenten sermon series, we are exploring what it means to confess the Gospel and we are preparing ourselves to be able to state the Gospel in seven words. These summaries of the Gospel are meant to be a place where you can start to have a conversation about what Jesus has done for you. Throughout this season, as we study the Word of God, the Holy Spirit will guide as we prepare to share the Gospel. I ask you to come and prepare a specific and personal confession of the Gospel. I will ask everyone to turn in a copy and will share them with the rest of the congregation. Do not worry! I will not share names but it is my hope that we can all be encouraged from one another!

Until then, I pray that the Lord will lead you to greater insights as you explore the Gospel and what it means for your life! May the Lord abundantly bless you all!

### ST. JOHN AND IMMANUEL NEWSLETTER





#### Nebraska Lutherans for Life essay contest

Nebraska Lutherans for Life would like to invite students in grades 6-12 who are members of a Lutheran congregation or attend a Lutheran school in Nebraska to participate in this year's Lutherans for Life Essay Contest, based on the 2023 Conference theme: *Just As ... I Am* with the Bible verse: *"For we are his workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand, that we should walk in them." Ephesians 2:10* 

One winner will be selected for grades 6-8 and one for grades 9-12. Winning entries (one from Grades 6-8 and one from Grades 9-12) will be awarded \$100 each. The winning essays will be entered in the national contest. Grand Prize for the national winning entry at each level will be \$250 plus free conference registration to the 2023 Conference and one night at a conference hotel. Second place national winners at each level will receive a \$125 prize.

Essays should, of course, be the students' individual, original work, but pastors, teachers, and parents are encouraged to discuss the criteria on which the essays will be judged. The same rubrics will be used at both the state and national levels. Entries must be submitted electronically by April 1, 2023.

Pastors, teachers, and parents are asked to promote the contest. It is our hope that this contest will give them an opportunity to discuss the Sanctity of Life and life issues with our young people.

### Lutheran Church Extension Fund Nebraska District College Scholarship

#### What is the Nebraska District College Scholarship?

The Lutheran Church Extension Fund (LCEF) Nebraska District College Scholarship was developed to encourage college students in The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod (LCMS) Nebraska District to pursue their educational goals. A \$1,000 scholarship will be awarded to at least one applicant.

Applicant must be a graduating high school senior with a minimum 3.0 GPA or current full-time postsecondary student at an accredited institution with at least one year of courses remaining and a minimum 2.5 GPA. Applicant must also be a member of a congregation belonging to the LCMS located in the Nebraska District.

Applications close April 15, 2023. Winners will be announced on May 5, 2023.
