

Sturtevant Chapel Celebrates 129 Years!

On March 10, 1894, the George Street Mission opened its doors at 101 George Street due to a vision turned mission to reach the youth of North Keene. The first Sunday School meeting was held the next day with 51 children attending. At that time, Charles Sturtevant was acting as church librarian. Other activities were added to further help the neighborhood youth in practical ways.

In 1897, a schoolhouse on Washington Street (now 412 Washington Street) became available for sale and the move was made to that building to offer a more central location. Charles had continued to help out during his vacations from Dartmouth College. Shortly after his graduation in 1899, he was put in charge as superintendent.

On March 14, 1905, a corporation was formed and the mission became the George Street Chapel. Soon after, a campaign was started to buy the corner lot at Washington Street and Washington Avenue, as the Sunday School had outgrown its quarters. After a delay of several years due to the economic depression, the new church building was dedicated on December 14, 1913.

Charles Sturtevant remained very active in the chapel until his sudden death at age 52 in 1926. The shock of this great loss was evident throughout the city of Keene as more than 600 people came to show their love and respect for this great man of God at his funeral. One of the first acts of the corporation after his death was to change the name in 1927 of the George Street Chapel to Sturtevant Chapel as a memorial to the man that God had raised up to build this spiritual work in North Keene.
