seeking: How do we begin again?

From our pastor

Jesus answered, "I assure you, unless someone is born anew, it's not possible to see God's kingdom." Nicodemus asked, "How is it possible for an adult to be born?" John 3:3-4

The phrase "born again Christian" has so much theological and political baggage that many people want nothing to do with it. But I think we need to reclaim it. At the heart of this metaphor is our need for change, the need for new beginnings, and new ways of seeing the world. We need that right about now. Jesus invites Nicodemus, a well-respected Pharisee, to be born anew, and Nicodemus makes the mistake of taking Jesus' words literally. Jesus clarifies he is speaking in metaphor of beginning again, and all beginnings are hard. When we've been taught to see the world a certain way, it's difficult to begin again.

Being born physically happens once in our life, but being born again happens over and over. Jesus says, "The wind blows where it chooses, and you hear the sound of it, but you do not know where it comes from or where it goes. So it is with everyone who is born of the Spirit." When the Spirit of God takes us places we never imagined we'd end up, we are born again. God has destinations for us travel, the likes of which we know nothing about. Right now, our church is considering taking new steps of welcome and inclusion toward people who have been systemically excluded from churches including this one. These steps mark a new beginning for Covenant, one that many of you welcome and others of you might not be so sure. It's hard to begin again.

While no one knows where the Spirit will lead us next, one thing we can know for sure, wherever God is leading us, it's all for the sake of love. Because with God, that's what it's all about. That's all it's ever been about, "For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him [whoever trusts in this love], may not perish but may have eternal life" (John 3:16). When we trust in love, eternal life starts now. Jesus came as the embodiment of divine love, a love that does not condemn us but saves us. In this time of new beginnings, God's love will save us again, and again, and again.

Now enrolling for Summer Camps and the 2023 - 2024 School Year!

Summer Preschool Camp (ages 3 - 5)

This 4-hour camp is for children ages 36 months through 5 years old who have not yet attended kindergarten. Children must be potty trained and 3 years old by the start of their session. Camp starts at 9:00 a.m. and ends at 1:00 p.m. Children should eat breakfast before attending camp. Parents must provide a packed snack or lunch.

Focus on Fundamentals Sports Minicamp (ages 6 – 9)

Focus on Fundamentals is more than a sports camp. While campers work on basic moves and strategies that will increase their fun and enjoyment of sports, they also receive positive coaching on collaboration, teamwork, and how to build good relationships. The daily 2-hour schedule includes a team meeting, warmups (calisthenics, stretching), skill drills, special games, snack from home (fuel up), game time (play the game!), and a closing huddle-up. Enrollment is limited to 12 children per day.

"God is our refuge and strength ... though the mountains shake." - Psalm 46:1-3

The scale of the disaster facing Syria and Turkey after the Feb. 6 earthquake is becoming clearer. The 7.8magnitude quake and its aftershocks have left more than 11,000 people dead and thousands more injured; these numbers will rise as search and rescue continues. Buildings have been reduced to rubble, and roads and bridges have been severely damaged, resulting in dangerous conditions for first responders. In some places, such as Aleppo, this destruction is compounding the damage of the now 11-year war in Syria.

Presbyterian Disaster Assistance (PDA) is providing emergency relief and short-term recovery in the impacted areas through long-standing partners in Syria, in addition to ACT Alliance members in Syria and Turkey, all of whom are already on the ground. PDA will remain active throughout the entire recovery process, accompanying our partners in the area as they determine long-term program needs and providing financial support for building and resilience.

DONATE METAL WATER BOTTLES for those who visit the OPEN SHELTER

What: Donate Stainless Steel water bottles with sturdy carrying loops For Who: The people who visit the Open Shelter on Parsons Ave.

Why: Stainless steel bottles are healthier to drink from and easier to clean. Each bottle's lid should include a sturdy loop for hooking fingers through or hooking a carabiner hook through because folks must carry all their belongings. No need to donate the carabiner hooks; we will buy them by the box and add them to each water bottle before taking them to the Open Shelter.

Where: Place your donations in the marked bin in Covenant's Donation Center, which is in the coat closet closest to the main entrance to the sanctuary.

When will the Open Shelter receive them? For decades, we take 175 sack lunches to the Open Shelter on the second Friday of the month. We also bring drinks, including disposable bottled water. The availability of high quality water bottles will reduce the demand for bottled water, thus improving the impact on the environment. Reusable bottles are preferred by many over disposable! We take them with our monthly delivery of the lunches.

Want to help your neighbor? Are you short on time but big in heart? Check out these opportunities to join our team! Call us; maybe one of these tasks will fit your schedule. If yes, great! If not, thanks for considering it! We want to involve YOU!

Covenant helps out people in need (including people who are homeless and marginally-housed) served by the Open Shelter by providing 175 sack lunches on the **second Friday of every month**. *Our next delivery date is Friday, March 10th or you can help in any future month*. *We particularly need help with SHOPPING at this point in the year, as some of our top shoppers take winter vacations*.

Here are ways to join in:

- Anytime, donate sturdy, stainless-steel water bottles with a loop (see the e-newsletter article for details)
- Anytime, you could drop off your CLEAN, LIDDED take-out containers (reusable disposable food containers) to shelving on the counter under the windows of Covenant's kitchen. We take them to the Open Shelter to help people take home leftovers from donated restaurant meals. When these meals are donated, people are encouraged to take sack lunches with them to-go as well.
- Help with supplies! (Costs may be reimbursed by submitting your receipts to our Financial Administrator, Tanvi Bhowmik.)
 - Shop for supplies (like paper bags, or napkins, or drinks, or plastic bags, or sandwich makings, or bananas...)
 - **Pre-assemble** at your home (45 or 90 bags of unsalted nuts, or 45 or 90 bags of baby carrots, or 30 peanut butter and jelly sandwiches)
- Join the Lunch-assembling team at Covenant's kitchen (help make 160 ham and cheese sandwiches, assemble the lunches into paper bags and pack them in boxes and into a car (or two) between 8:00 and 9:10 am on the second Friday of the month).
- **Deliver** the lunches and other supplies from Covenant to the Open Shelter on Parsons Ave. by **9:30**. This takes either two drivers or one driver with a larger hatchback car or minivan.

By splitting up the work, we can get more people involved sharing the Love of Christ in our community.
