⁵ "Behold, I will send you Elijah the prophet before the great and awesome day of the LORD comes. ⁶ And he will turn the hearts of fathers to their children and the hearts of children to their fathers, lest I come and strike the land with a decree of utter destruction."

- 1) The Day of the Lord is **coming**.
 - a) Just as his first coming occurred in time, bringing the **Day** of **Salvation**,
 - b) His second coming will occur in time, bringing the **Dav** of **Iudgment**.
- 2) Prior to that day, the Lord has purposed to **prepare** his people by sending Elijah (John the Baptist) to **reissue** the call of the Law and Prophets: Repentance and Faith.
 - a) The ongoing testimony of this voice, along with the **good news** of the gospel, leads them with seriousness to the **cross** of Christ, where they find both forgiveness and ongoing **sanctification**.
 - b) In the language of Malachi, the **effect** of this is:
 - i) to turn the hearts of the fathers to their children, concerned with their **eternal destiny**,
 - ii) to turn the hearts of the fathers to the Lord, as they seek to lead their children by **example**,
 - iii) and to turn the hearts of the children to their fathers as they witness the **genuineness** of that
