Although the man born blind is a major person in John 9, we never learn what his name might be. Although we do not learn his name, Jesus said of the man born blind that the works of God were displayed in him. He directs the cross currents of our daily lives. In His light we see light—and that is what matters!

WE PREPARE OUR HEARTS & MINDS FOR HOLY COMMUNION

St. Paul, in his letter to the Corinthians, bids us to examine ourselves before taking Holy Communion. Therefore, to faithfully prepare to receive our Lord's TRUE body and blood, we

- CONFESS that we are sinful people- unwilling and unable to be righteous according to God's just Law.
- **BELIEVE** that Jesus shed His Blood for us on the cross for the forgiveness of our sin;
- ▶ **BELIEVE** that, in the Supper, Jesus gives us His true body and blood in, with, and under the bread and wine that is, the bread and wine are NOT merely symbols of the body and blood of Jesus, but truly are united to the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ, as He said, "Take eat; this is My BODY... Take, drink; this is My Blood."
- ► INTEND, by the power of the Holy Spirit, repent of our sinful lives and strive to walk according to God's will.

HOLY COMMUNION POLICY: In the Lord's Supper, we believe, teach and confess that with the bread and wine, we receive Christ's very Body and Blood for the forgiveness of sins and the strengthening of faith. We also believe that as we come to receive Christ's body and blood, we are also making a public confession of the unity of faith and doctrine that we have in The Lutheran Church – Missouri Synod (LCMS). If you are not an LCMS member but would like to come forward for a blessing, we invite you to come forward and ask that you cross your arms indicating that intention.
