Casting

Indulge me if you will and read Luke 5:1-11 before you go any further in this article.....

I'm one of those guys who knows you can take the Bible literally, but I also know that it is full of symbolism. This is one of those metaphorical moments, when Jesus said, "Go out into the deep." I don't know what it was like for these fishermen but for us, at least speaking metaphorically, we prefer to fish close to the shore. We want to risk as little as we can so our failures will be as unnoticeable as possible.

A pastor friend of mine told me about an opportunity his church had to reach hundreds of people in their community through a special event, but the possibility of failure haunted the leadership team. They kept saying, "What if no one shows up? We'll have wasted all this money and we'll look foolish. Let's play it safe. Let's choose an outreach program that has a lesser downside, even if it also has a lesser upside." In his frustration, this pastor said to his leadership team: "This is our greatest hindrance to growth. With every opportunity, we're afraid to go deep."

Friends, don't settle for a life in the shallow water. Even if you have a history of failure, go deep! Hope for something bigger than you have ever experienced in your life. Hope for something bigger than this church has ever experienced before! It comes down to this: even if you've worked all night and your nets have come up empty again and again and again, don't be afraid! Go out into the deep! That's where Jesus is calling you. That's where Jesus is found. That's where He shines!

Don't be afraid to dream, especially after a failed attempt, because your greatest success could be just a few steps away! Jesus is saying...not Derek is saying...Jesus is saying "Go out into the deep and let me show you what I can do!" So, while you make that initial move towards the deep, He's also saying, "Let down the nets." Now, we saw what Peter's response was. He said...⁵***Master, we've worked hard all night and haven't caught anything...***

What he didn't say (but boy he had to be thinking it) was, "You know, this is not our first day on the job. No disrespect, Jesus, but aren't you the carpenter here? We know our craft!" Simon Peter didn't say that, which is a shock considering he did have a tendency to blurt out from time to time. To be honest, I probably would have blurted. Instead, he said exactly what he should have said...⁵***But because you say so, I will let down the nets.***

Jesus is telling him and telling us, "Try again. Cast your nets again. One more time. Even if you have failed again and again and again. Even if you're exhausted from trying, and feel discouraged. Trust me. I understand. Don't give up. Let your nets down." This is the most powerful principle we can ever learn. The power of casting again is crucial in anything we do, but especially when we fail. Let the nets down again. Keep on casting out! Chuck Swindoll once said, "Failures who give up are a dime a dozen; failures who *GET UP* are one in a million." That's why you need to keep casting that net again, and again, and again...

At the end, we see this incredible miracle take place in the story. But please know this, it's only the beginning of what Jesus was going to do. After these fishermen brought in two boatloads of fish, Simon Peter fell at the feet of Jesus' and said, "**Lord, depart from me. I am a sinful man.**" And Jesus said... ¹¹"**Don't be afraid; from now on you will catch men.**"

They knew what they had just witnessed just doesn't happen. It's impossible, and yet it did happen. Simon Peter knew he was in the presence of someone great. He was in the very presence of God. And so, Simon Peter fell at Jesus' feet.

Essentially what Jesus replied with was, "What you saw now is nothing compared to what you will see in days to come. You just caught fish and made money? Wait till you see what happens next. Lives will change. Nations will change. You will change history, and this, my friends, is only the beginning."

This is what you're being called to, and God wants you to know it is just the beginning. God has great things in store for you and for this church. He has things in store bigger than this church has ever seen. And even if you don't think it is possible, "Because you say so Lord, we will let down are nets again." His blessings only began with that full net, that's not where they ended.

I know there may be many who are reading this today who are discouraged. You may be thinking, "I just don't have it in me to cast out or let down those nets again." I'm talking to you. Right where you're sitting. In this moment, you are in range of God's voice if you just listen. He's calling out to you specifically. He knows you're discouraged. He knows you're ready to give up...on your job, on your marriage, on your family, on yourself, or maybe even on this church. He's saying to you, "Don't stay in the shallow end. Move to the deep. Dream bigger. Hope beyond all measure. Believe in the impossible. Cast your net again."

This is where the journey begins my friends. Let down those nets down again and again, until they're overflowing.

So I love it when God works things out so that I get to follow up one month's newsletter with continuation in the next. If you read last month, I talked about my plans for a time of prayer, meditation, and fasting in observance of Lent. I spoke of how the focus of this time would be to follow Psalm 139's plea for God to "search me and know my heart." Well, He has been doing exactly that, but I have to be honest...He isn't showing me the "offensive way in me" that I thought he would. I really thought he was going to show me some dark part of my soul that really needed scrubbed out, some back corner of my hardened heart that I may not have even been aware of. I thought there would be some persistent sin we could tackle together or some failing in my faith that we would strengthen. Instead, what God has shown me has been so much more fulfilling, and was something that was long overdue that I hadn't even recognized as such.

Megan and I will have been married for ten years this coming June. We have been together for over eleven years, and they have truly been wonderful years. For those that don't know, I met Megan in the midst of heartbreak and immediately recognized her as a gift sent from the Lord to pull me out of that darkness. We have had a wonderful life together...of course with the expected ups and downs of any healthy marriage, but overall we have a deeply fulfilling life together.

Over the past few months, we have been busy, very busy; and we have been tired, very tired. I had noticed we had been arguing more often than we really ever had in those eleven-plus years together. I felt distant from her, and I'm pretty sure she felt the same emotional separation from me. I don't think I gave it much thought though, I just racked it up to the busyness and exhaustion...but God was paying attention.

When I asked Him to "show me any offensive way", He knew exactly where He would start. He showed me, through another particularly bitter argument that, for some time now, I had not been keeping up my end of the bargain on this marriage. Ephesians 5 gives us those great parameters of love and respect that keep a marriage running the way it should, but I had neglected my end. I was expecting all the respect I believed I deserved while not loving her the way I was supposed to.

Don't get me wrong, I have never for one moment stopped loving Megan since the day I met her. What I'm talking about here is the specific "love as Christ loved the church," the "love in the same way I love my own body." That sacrificial love that God tells us to have for those that He has entrusted us with as men. I had started putting my own interests before hers and, while always caring for her and being in emotional love with her, I had started to just exist alongside her instead of cherishing her, instead of dedicating my energy to meet her needs first before my own were met. God showed me this, and it stung...it stung bad.

In the past two to three weeks I have fallen back in love with my wife, more than I think I ever have before in our marriage, and it has been amazing. We are spending more time together just for the sake of doing it, we are working through issues that have been a blight on our marital happiness for our entire relationship, and we are closer than we have been in years without ever even realizing we had drifted apart. I encourage you, if you are feeling like that in your relationship with your spouse, to pray for insight and direction. God can do wonders where you didn't even know wonders were needed.

The Sacrifice

The Holy Trinity. God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit. The Godhead together, inseparable, in fellowship before time began.

The first time we are introduced to the Holy Trinity in Scripture is in Genesis chapter one verse twenty-six through twenty-seven.

Genesis 1:26-27

²⁶Then God said "Let Us make man in Our image, according to Our likeness, let them have dominion over the fish of the sea, over the birds of the air, and over the cattle, over all the earth and over every creeping thing that creeps on the earth. ²⁷So God created man in His own image; in the image of God He created him, male and female He created them. (emphasis mine)

There it is... "let Us make man in Our image"...that's the Holy Trinity. The three-in-one.

They never had to be separated but, from before the time man sinned, God had a plan that would ultimately require the separation of the Holy Trinity.

Fast forward a few thousand years and we find Jesus tortured, spit on, beaten, lashed, ridiculed, and nailed to a cross naked in front of hundreds of people who had put Him there.

The night before the crucifixion, Jesus had prayed and pleaded with His Father to find another way out for mankind. Jesus was in such distress that He was sweating blood. But ultimately, out of love for His Father and out of love for us, Jesus wished only that the will of the Father be accomplished, even if it meant His death on the cross.

Jesus experienced two deaths on the cross, two deaths He should never have had to experience. The first death, as He was hanging by the nails in His hands and feet, was a spiritual death - separation from the Father. You see, God cannot be around sin. That's why He cast Adam and Eve out of the Garden. When Jesus took the sins of the world on the cross, He was separated from the Father.

Matthew 27:45-46

⁴⁵Now from the sixth hour until the ninth hour there was darkness over all the land. ⁴⁶And about the ninth hour Jesus cried out with a loud voice saying

"Eli, Eli, lama sabachthani?" That is "My God, my God, why have You forsaken me?"

When Jesus cried out those terrible words, "Eli, Eli, lama Sabachthani?," for the first time in all eternity Father and Son were separated.

A short time after that, in verse 50, Jesus yielded His spirit and died physically. Two deaths, one spiritual and one physical.

In the words of Jesus, "greater love has none than this, that one would lay down his life for another." John 15:13

In John 3:16 we see why God made this sacrifice.

John 3:16

For God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son, that whosoever believes in Him should not perish but have everlasting life.

Jesus did everything He could, gave all He could, to give us the opportunity to receive salvation. Tortured, separated from His Father, and killed...all for just the chance that we would receive salvation.

In conclusion, praise God for the resurrection, but don't ever forget the sacrifice.

a message from OUR ELDERS

Greetings from the elders!

“Love the sojourner, therefore, for you were sojourners in the land of Egypt.” Deuteronomy 10:19

If you have been reading through the Bible in a year, you probably read this verse. As sometimes happens, you may have breezed right past it. At the same time, maybe it should stand out. What are we called to do at Central Park Christian Church? We serve those who are transient, those who may only be with us for a short time, those who may not be seen by people around them. We don't have to be transient to feel like we are unseen, unheard, or unloved. Our vision statement is “Discipling in the heart of the city for freedom in Christ.” But how does that apply here, you may ask? Jesus tells us in John 13:35 that “By this all people will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another.” Discipleship is not just academic. Anyone can memorize scripture, or history, but only a disciple applies all he or she has learned through the filter of love for their neighbor.

As it was stated earlier, discipleship is not purely academic; however, discipleship begins with knowledge. To that end, the elders continue to work in the background preparing to roll out a discipleship plan. Our enemy, the devil, has thrown many obstacles at us in this process, but the plan is to roll out the opening phases by the end of the first quarter (which may have passed by the time you are reading this). You've already seen the beginning of this with the spiritual gifts inventory. Additionally, we will begin with a class for new members; however, we strongly encourage all current members to attend, so we are all on the same foundation as the new members. It will be a good refresher for all of us. From there, the plan will be to have a specific, step-by-step discipleship process in place to take our relationship with God, and each other, deeper and wider.

To close, the elders have a few housekeeping/communication items to address in the following paragraphs. We have access to the Creator of heaven and earth, through Christ, in prayer. We encourage everyone to attend a prayer meeting. It is a powerful time of corporate prayer with other believers that God uses to encourage us in our faith in Him. We will also have a prayer team available to pray with those in the Sunday worship service who would like to pray, either at the front of the sanctuary or in a separate room.

In addition, we want to invite the congregation to attend elders' meetings. Our normal business meetings are the second Monday of each month, and our Bible study/fellowship meetings are the fourth Monday of each month. These meetings are open unless we have HR matters to discuss, at which point we will go into a closed session. The Bible study/fellowship meetings are often held away from the church, so check with an elder for the location. We will attempt to post a draft of the agenda in the newsletter, but it is subject to change prior to the meeting. If there is a topic you are particularly interested in, please talk with an elder closer to the date of the meeting to ensure it is on the agenda.

April at Doorstep

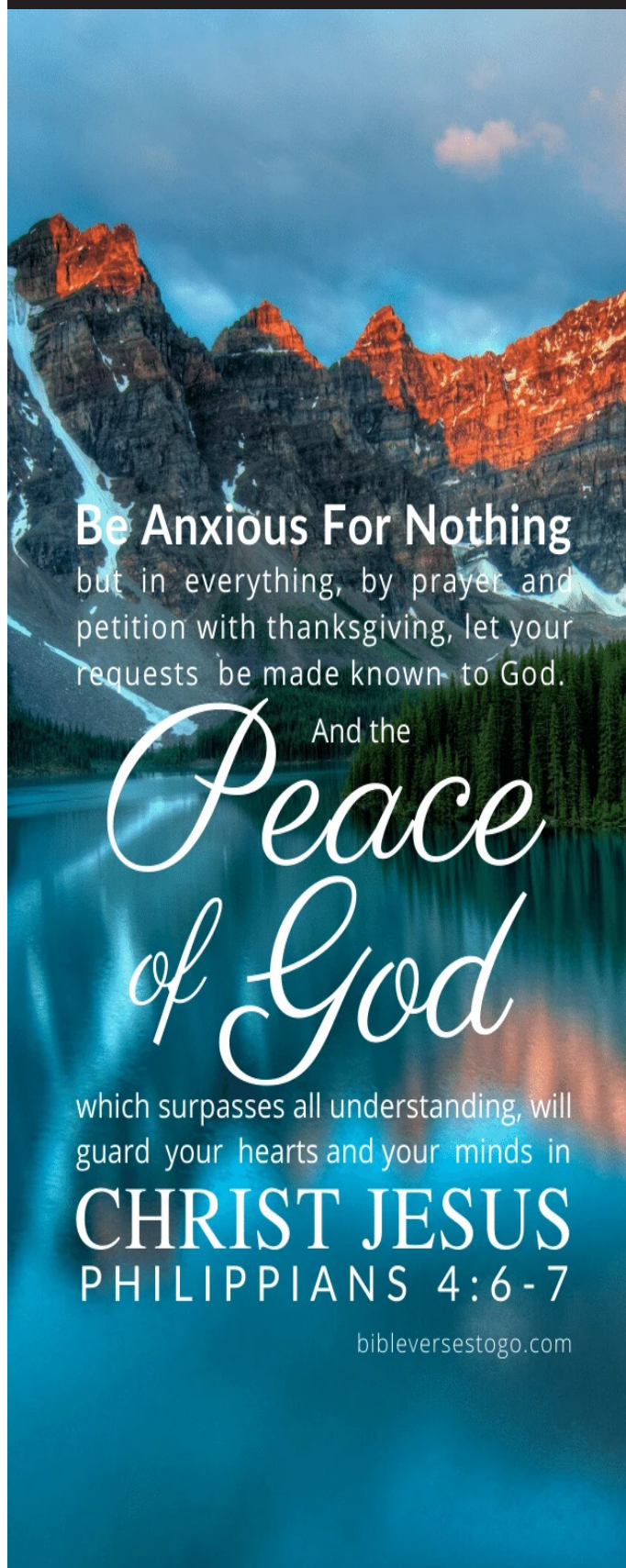

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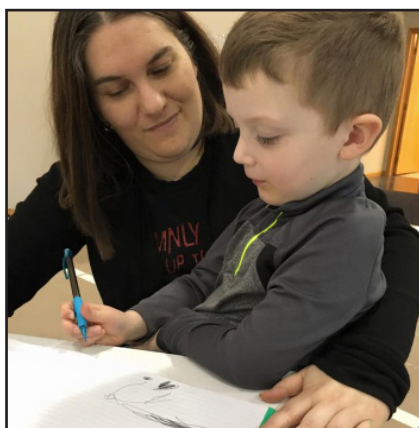
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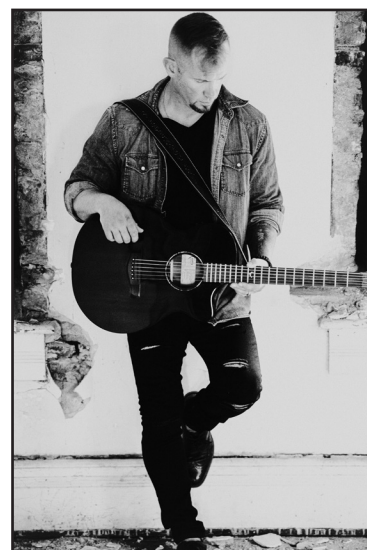
