## Pentecost Sunday – 28th May 2023

### **We stand before You, Holy Spirit,**

as we gather together in Your name.

With You alone to guide us, make Yourself at home in our hearts;

Teach us the way we must go and how we are to pursue it.

At the start of most meetings I use the traditional and probably best known prayers for the coming of the Holy Spirit (*Come Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful... Pour forth we ask you O Lord...*). This Pentecost I would like to share with you another and **invite you to pray it each and every day** until the Feast of Peter & Paul on 29<sup>th</sup> June for our parish and our diocese.

The prayer is a version of the *Adsumus Sante Spiritus* and has been used at important church meetings for hundreds of years and was said at the start of each session of the Second Vatican Council. It is being used as the prayer for the synod process and one I commend to us for an important time of discernment for our parish and our diocese.

When he first came to our diocese Bishop Richard visited each deanery three times in the course of the development of a pastoral plan *The Word Who is Life*, listening, discerning and feeding back. Last year he updated the plan and made his invitation for us to become "communities of saints, strong lively and welcoming schools of discipleship". In 2023 he is meeting with clergy and with parish pastoral teams in the deaneries of the diocese to discern and start to put in place the shapes and structures that will support the mission of the church and its sacramental life in the coming years. He is meeting with us in later in June and the outcome of these meetings will have a major role in shaping the pattern of our ministry and mission into the future. God is at work in the church and in our world, and under the guidance of the Holy Spirit we will know what it is that we must do and have the courage to do it.
