a message from OUR FLDERS

Greetings from the elders

Does life sometimes leave you feeling down? Do you go to bed at night sometimes feeling like you failed, like you let someone down, like you are tired of trying to get it right? There is hope if you do, remember, there is no condemnation in Christ.

At times, even as believers, we may feel like a failure. We may feel discouraged, disappointed, embarrassed by our behavior, defeated, or even just ready to throw in the towel and quit trying to do the right things. But don't give up on yourself. God never gives up on us. In the book of Joel, chapter 2 starting at verse 12, the Word tells us this:

"Even now declares the Lord, return to Me with all your heart, with fasting and weeping and mourning. Rend your heart, and not your garments. Return to the Lord your God, for He is gracious and compassionate, slow to anger and abounding in love and He relents from sending calamity. Who knows, He may turn and have pity and leave behind a blessing..."

I love those Words, "even now", there is so much power in that simple phrase, "even now". You or I could be at our worst possible moment in time or in our lives, no matter what's going on or what failure we find ourselves in, God says, "even now". According to Strong's dictionary, those two Words are: "aw-khad" translated, "even" and "emeth" translated "now". Aw-khad means to collect one's thoughts or go one way or the other and emeth means firmness, stability, sureness, and truth. Aw-khad Emeth (even now) we can turn away from what we have done or failed to do and turn to God. Every day, we can chose to do the right thing, even now.

Lamentations 3:21-23 says basically the same thing:

"Yet this I call to mind and therefore have hope: Because of the Lord's great love we are not consumed for His compassions never fail. They are new every morning; great is Your faithfulness."

I just love God's Word, His truth, His encouragement. One of my mentors explained it to me this way, before we came to Christ, we were a slave to sin. We basically, had to do it, we had no choice. But in Christ, once we believe and are saved, we are now a new creation and we are no longer slaves to sin. Now we have the choice to chose what is right. The cool thing is, that's now always a choice. Even if I fail, I can again, chose the right thing to do. Romans 6:6-7, 2 Corinthians 5:17, and Philippians 4:13, I can do all things through Him Who gives me strength.

My prayer for each of us is that God will empower us to live a life that is worthy of the calling. That He will encourage us when we make mistakes. That He will lift one another up in prayer, in unity, and in love. That we will not accept defeat, failure, weakness, discouragement or despair. We are more than that.

Philippians 4:4-9 says it best when we may be feeling discouragement:

"Rejoice in the Lord always. I will say it again, Rejoice! Let your gentleness be evident to all. The Lord is near. Do not be anxious about anything, but in prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your request to God. And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus. Finally, brothers and sisters, whatever is true, whatever is noble, whatever is right, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is admirable – if anything is excellent or praiseworthy – think about such things. Whatever you have learned or received or heard from me, or seen in me – put into practice. And the God of peace will be with you."

Are you ready?

When Disaster strikes, it pays to be prepared. Having a Disaster Kit prepared will save you time and could save your life. A disaster kit should be in your designated shelter and it would also be helpful to have a smaller version in a small backpack or other containers that are easily carried if you need to evacuate your home. Disaster kits should be reviewed annually to be kept up-to-date with your family's needs. Items in your kit should include, but are not limited to:

Staple Items

- □ 3 day supply of Water (1 gallon per person per day)
- □ 3 day supply of nonperishable, ready to eat food items and manual can opener
 - □ High Energy Foods, e.g. Peanut Butter
 - □ Juices, dried Milk
 - □ Sugar, Salt, Pepper
- ☐ First Aid Kit (see list for individual items)
- ☐ Flashlight and extra batteries, or ones that generate their own energy by shaking them
- □ Battery operated or Hand Crank Radio
 - NOAA All-Hazard Weather Radio
- □ Clothing— Think about the climate; warm and/or cool season clothes
- □ Shoes
- □ Sanitation and Hygiene items (such as hand sanitizer, moist towelettes and toilet paper)
- ☐ Matches in waterproof container
- □ Whistle
- □ Blankets
- □ Other tools (e.g. hammer, pliers)
- □ Cash and coins
- ☐ Photocopies of important documents, personal ID's and credit cards
- □ Baby needs
- □ Special Needs
 - □ Prescription medications, eye glasses,
 - □ Contact lens solution, etc.
- ☐ Games to pass the time (e.g. cards)



First Aid Kit

- ☐ Sterile adhesive bandages in assorted sizes
- □ 2-inch and 4-inch sterile gauze
 pads
- Hypoallergenic adhesive tape
- ☐ Triangular bandages
- □ Scissors & Tweezers
- 2-inch and 3-inch sterile roll bandages
- □ Waterless alcohol-based hand sanitizer
- ☐ Antiseptic Wipes
- □ Petroleum Jelly or other lubricant
- □ Latex Gloves
- ☐ Anti-bacterial Ointment
- ☐ Aspirin or non-aspirin pain reliever
- ☐ Antacid (for upset stomach)
- □ Cold pack

Coming together, celebrating history

Our Story...1896-2024

Central Park Christian Church began as a Bible School organized in 1896. Interest grew until, in July of 1904, a building was erected at 16th and Clay Streets. With 60 members, the church held its first service on August 27, 1904. In May 1905, the cornerstone of the little, white church was laid. In 1920-21, plans were drawn for the new and present building, with the ground breaking service on July 27, 1921. The cornerstone was laid on July 31, and the building was dedicated on May 28, 1922.

The church was well attended in the early years, with documentation that indicates an attendance at times over 300. But over the years, attendance decreased, and really took a downturn after the tornado of 1966, which devastated the neighborhood surrounding the church.

In December of 2004, the church experienced renovation of facilities and membership as the church was reestablished as a sister church of Northland Christian Church. Since that time, the church has established itself as a point of light in the Central Park neighborhood as well as committing itself to help establish churches in urban Topeka and around the world through intentional missions work. Today, we are still committed to serving the Central Park neighborhood.

Make Your Requests Known

I recently read (well, listened to) Matthew McConaughey's book, Greenlights. No matter what your opinions of Mr. "Alright, Alright, Alright" are, if you take the time to dive into this fairly easy read, you just might find yourself fascinated. Fair warning, there are some over-the-top stories, some ideas that I can't quite get on board with, and a little profanity, but if you can get past those things, it's a pretty good book written by a remarkable, entertaining, and highly intelligent man.

McConaughey is a believer, he was raised Methodist and now describes himself as a Non-denominational Christian. He has a funny way of looking at the world and human nature sometimes, but he frequently references God and his relationship with Him. In one section of the book, he talks about prayer and brings up the concept of "white collar prayers." He talks about the difference between prayers for necessity and prayers for want and follows it with what he calls a prescription.



Prescription: White-collar prayers Blue-collar prayers are things that people need like food, shelter, medical assistance White-collar prayers are things people want like material things, privileged prayers We need to quit asking God



Now on the face of it, I don't disagree with the sentiment here. We should be careful not to pray with vanity in our hearts and we should absolutely never pray for anything outside of God's plan or will or against His direction but just because something isn't a matter of life and death or a dire need, I don't think that means we shouldn't pray for it.

to answer these kinds of prayers

The way Matthew (the actor, not the apostle) talks about it makes it seem like God is too busy to answer prayers for things we don't "need," that he doesn't have the time or patience to bless us with things we merely want. First off, to limit our Creator to any type of a time schedule or say that there is any way he would ever be "too busy" for anything is just flat wrong. Secondly, Matthew (the apostle, not the actor) shares what Jesus told us:



Ask and it will be given to you, seek and you will find, knock and it will be opened to you. ~ Matthew 7:7

The word also tells us:


"If you ask Me anything in My name, I will do it." ~ John 14:14

AND

"Do not be anxious for anything but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, make your requests known to God" ~ Philippians 4:6

We are encouraged to ask for things we want. Of course, the Bible puts some qualifiers on it; "In My name" pretty much rules out asking for vain or sinful things, and "by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving" ensures that we are thankful for what we already have and willing to accept God's will. He tells us to ask for things. He loves us and encourages us to make requests of Him. And He always answers, sometimes not in the way we want and most of the time not right at the moment we want it, but according to His will, His timing, and His plan he will always answer.


Meal Ministry Team
