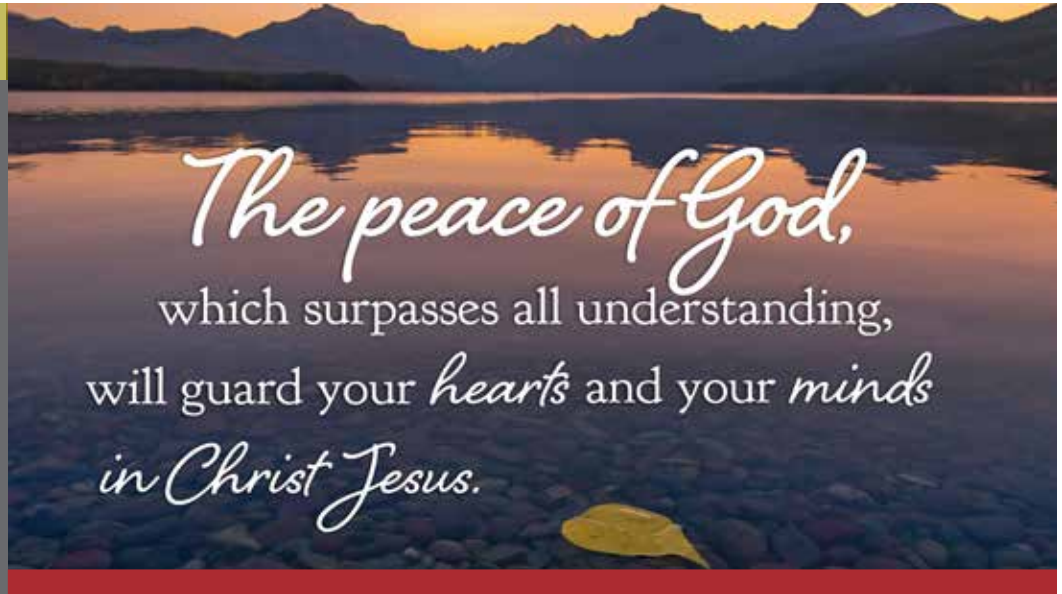

OUR ELDERS

Greetings from the elders

Have you ever heard of the idea of memorizing Scripture? Do you have a favorite Scripture that you've memorized? One that can help you when you are in trouble. I've kept this one, "Therefore be anxious about nothing, but in everything, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your request to God and the peace of God which transcends all understanding will guard your hearts and your mind in Christ Jesus." Philippians 4:6&7. Having that verse memorized has kept me from panicking on multiple occasions. Life is full of challenges and difficulties and, on top of that, we have an adversary, one who has come to kill, to steal, and to destroy. Having God's Word in your heart and in your mind (memorized) is the quickest way to protect ourselves when we are under attack. Jesus even quoted Scripture when He was tempted.

Scripture also tells us that all things were created by the power of God's Word, (Hebrews 11:3), that everything is sustained by the power of God's Word, (Hebrews 1:3), and that all things will be made new by the power of God's Word, (Revelation 21:5). Jesus tells us, "Your Word is truth." (John 17:17). When I think about what I would consider my "Life Verse", this would have to be it, John 17:17, "Your Word is truth". If you are not familiar with the concept of a "Life Verse", it is a verse that your entire belief system revolves around. For me, this single verse holds the very power to give life and so much more. It's not just a childish, blind faith kind of belief either. For me, it is sincere, concrete, and confirmed, over and over and over again, in the fiery furnace of life.

When the serpent came into the garden of Eden to tempt Adam and Eve, his cunning plan was to make them doubt God, doubt what He said, doubt if He had told them the truth. The devil is still doing the exact same thing thousands of years later. Humanity is faced with an ever-growing avalanche of false doctrines, false teachings, bad ideas, attempts to do better than God's Word, and so much more.

Here is an example according to the popular belief regarding the Golden Rule, (Luke 6:31) "do unto others and you would have them do unto you". Now, we are told it is not nearly as good as the more modern Platinum rule which says, "Do unto others as they would have you do unto them". This new rule is being taught in corporate America as a better standard; but, that's just man's wisdom, and even though it may sound like a nicer idea, it is not the truth.

There are constant attacks on the truth of God's Word. We have heard arguments that say it was written by man, many of the original transcripts are lost, words are missing or contraindicative of themselves, the original language is dead, many writings were left out intentionally, words have different meanings now and the list goes on and on. Some people do not think hell is even a real place and that a loving God could never let anyone go to a place of eternal punishment. With access to the world wide web at most of our fingertips, everyone has access to ideas and concepts that are blowing up in theology, are contraindicative to the Word of God and have led many astray. Make no mistake about it, truth is under attack.

I remember the song, I stand upon the Word of God, the "B", "I", "B", "L", "E", yes that's the book for me. I don't need to follow God's Word with blind faith. He has shown me through my entire life that His Word is true. I honestly believe that the God of all creation, the One Who even created language, can speak clearly to me. I can believe His Word is true not only because it says it is, but because I have seen His glory, the glory of the One and only Who came from the Father, full of grace and truth.

God's Not Done With Us Yet

Over the last 20 years God has taught me several lessons. One of my favorite verses that He has highlighted over and over again is John 16:33, **“I have said these things to you, that in me you may have peace. In the world you will have tribulation. BUT take heart, I have overcome the world.”**

Life storms can hit hard, God tells us it won't be easy, BUT if we walk in His Spirit, we will have peace, and we can take comfort, knowing He has already won the battle.

One of the first revelations God taught me in my ministry was to always, “Do the Next Right Thing”. The life of Joseph wasn't easy. He experienced everything from being mocked for his dreams, getting jumped and thrown into a hole by his brothers, being sold into slavery, being put in prison, and defending false claims against him. But no matter what life threw at him, he always did the next right thing. God has encouraged me to do the same. When life's storms hit, and they will hit...hard, I am often reminded of Joseph to do the next right thing. Do the next right thing in that season of life. And if not for the season, then for that month. And if not for a month, then for a week. If you can't for the week, then do the next right thing for a day, an hour, or even a minute. If you have to, take a deep breath, focus on what's happening right then in that moment, focus on the blessing God has blessed you with, take 5 seconds of courage, and do the next right thing in that moment. **Never give up on Him.**

Another pressing message God has been trying to get across to me is to be **H.O.T. (Honest or Humble, Open, and Transparent)**. God wants to have a relationship with us, He knows our hearts better than we do, yet we still try to run and hide from Him. If I know the truth, and trust in His word, then it's insanity that I keep trying to run or hide from what I'm really struggling with. He calls us to not just come into His presence but be in a relationship with Him. We need to be H.O.T. with ourselves, others, and more importantly, with God.

I know my purpose and mission is, and has been, to plant seeds in people's hearts and to allow God to grow in them. We are all called to be missionaries, within our own homes, our jobs, and every time we step out into the public. We are called to **“Represent** who Jesus is”, and to **“Re-Present** Jesus” to those who have been hurt, by being **Present** with Him, and by being willing to serve where He leads you to.

With all of that being said, with a heart filled with mixed emotions, God has called me and my family to step out in faith, to do the next right thing, to be honest and open about what God has called us to do, and to take on a new

Lord, I feel the weight of all my worries, pressing in and pressing down on me. The pressure on my chest. The world weighs on my shoulders. I cannot hold it any more but I feel obligated to endure. “Be strong” are the words I repeat to myself day and night. Be strong for your family, be strong for your church. But Lord, the pain in my heart, it hurts so bad. I’m in an ocean and I’m sinking, the water is flooding my lungs. I cannot breathe. Remain calm I remind myself as I sink deeper, I can see the light fading, I can feel myself slipping away. Be brave Elijah, don’t let them see the fear in your heart. You may be drowning but they don’t need to see you struggle. Act natural, be cool, all is good. But I can’t breathe. The walls are closing in around me, my foot is slipping, my strength is giving way. My pillars have fallen. I stand alone, I can’t breathe. Lord, how long will my breath be so shallow?

Father, when the burden is heavy I will give it to you. When I cannot breathe, you are the air I breathe, and you will fill my lungs with new life. God, You are so, so good to me. In oceans deep, I will keep my eyes on you. Father, I give all I have and all I am to you. When I fall short, you will provide. When I am empty, You will fill me again. My cup overflows. 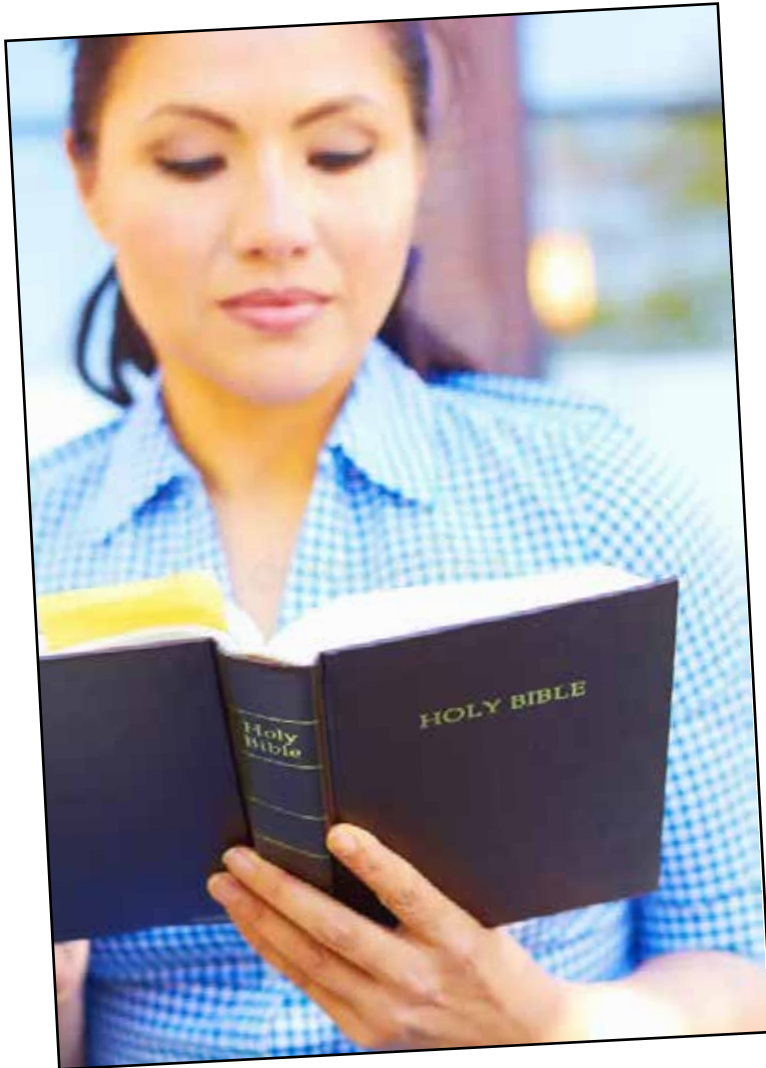

Iran

Pastor Faces 10 Years in Prison



Pastor Avedian is serving his sentence at Iran's notorious Evin Prison where countless other Christians have been imprisoned.

On Aug. 21, 2020, while Pastor Anooshavan Avedian was leading a worship service in his home, Iranian security agents interrupted the service and arrested the pastor and two other Christians. The group was meeting in the pastor's home because Iranian officials had closed their Church several years earlier.

Government agents confiscated Bibles and cellphones before taking Pastor Avedian and the other believers to Tehran's notorious Evin Prison. The two other Christians were released two days later, but Pastor Avedian was held for 26 days and harshly interrogated. On April 11, 2022, an Iranian judge sentenced the pastor to 10 years in prison for engaging in "propaganda contrary to and disturbing the holy religion of Islam."

Police ordered Pastor Avedian to appear at Evin Prison on Sept. 18, 2023, to begin his 10-year prison sentence; upon completion of the first sentence, he faces an additional 10-year sentence (not in prison) that deprives him of his "social rights." He had appealed to Iran's Supreme Court for a retrial, but the appeal was denied. Pastor Avedian is 61 years old and has a wife and two children.

The Iranian government is among the most oppressive in the world, and Christians there face constant threat of imprisonment and false charges for following Christ. Several Christians are currently imprisoned, and many others are under house arrest awaiting sentencing.

Pray for Pastor Avedian and others like him who are imprisoned in Iran for their faith.

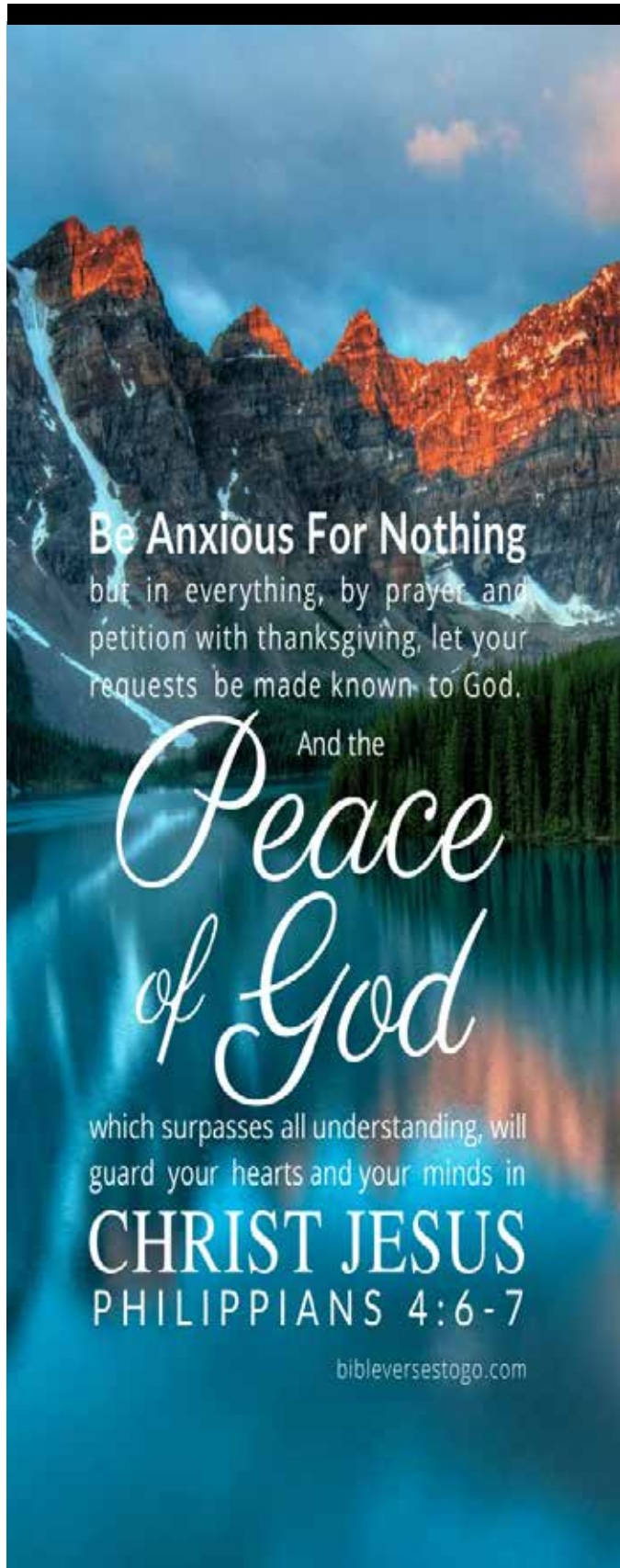
Meal Ministry Team
