a message from OUR ELDERS

Over Worked and Under Paid?

Do you ever feel that way? I would honestly say there were times I used to. I am so very thankful that I don't right now. In a broader sense, our whole lives can be that way too, (overwhelming that is). Here's a couple more sayings that come to my mind, "when it rains it pours" or "one step forward, two steps back." Any way you look at it, all we can do is what we can do. My wife and I are hoping to do some traveling in August, so we are praying that life won't cause us to break the piggy bank between now and then so we can afford it. Either way, we will praise God for each day and each opportunity that does come.

In thinking about work, a familiar Scripture is Colossians 3:17 which says, "And whatever you do, whether in word or deed, do it all in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through Him." No matter the circumstances or what's happening at the time, give thanks always and do the work you can as for the Lord and no one else. Lyfie

Is there anybody reading this that knows anything about popular music in South Africa? Probably not many. South African music is pretty insular and doesn't make it to this side of the ocean very often. There are a few exceptions, there's Trevor Rabin, who actually got famous with an English Band, Yes, in the 70's. There is the rock band Seether and the very odd (to put it nicely) rap group, Die Antwoord, save yourself the trauma and don't bother looking them up. The biggest name in this country, at least right now, is probably Dave Matthews, who didn't actually become famous until several years after he moved here and became a naturalized American citizen.

One cool thing about South African popular music, at least the music that is actually famous over there, is that Christian and worship music is fairly mainstream. I recently came across a story about SA pop singer, Bernice West, and her song "Lyfie." I happened upon this song because of a video that was shared on a worship group that I follow of a cute, cherubic, little blond boy taking center stage at what appears to be a school performance, dancing to that song. Before we get into the video though, let's talk about the song itself.

"Lyfie," is one of the biggest hits for Bernice West and maybe one of the biggest pop songs in the country. Bernice West is described as an "uplifting" pop musician who records mostly in Afrikaans. Afrikaans is a language spoken in South Africa that is basically a form of colonial Dutch with some English, German, and native African languages mixed and colorfully blended in. "Lyfie" is Afrikaans for "little body." The song is recorded completely in Afrikaans and the lyrics include...

Die Here het my mooi gemaak Hy het my baie, baie mooi gemaak Ek sal dans, ek sal dans, ja ek sal dans Dans voor my God Dit is my koppie, dit is my lyfie, dit is my voete Doen dit lyfie, doen dit

Or in case you don't speak Afrikaans...

The Lord made me beautiful He made me very, very beautiful I will dance, I will dance, yes I will dance Dance before my God This is my cup, this is my little body, these are my feet Do it little body, do it

Now this is one song that I can recommend you look up. It's a little too sugary-sweet, pop for my personal taste and I don't speak Afrikaans so don't expect to ever use it during worship, but it's a fun, bouncy dance song that celebrates being so overwhelmed with gratitude to the Lord that you just can't help but move the body He blessed you with in praise.

So then, on to the video. The video in question shows, like I said before, what appears to be a school concert, with a bunch of elementary-age children on stage while the fun, happy melody of "Lyfie" plays and they dance and (sort-of) sing along to it. The vast majority of these kids are doing what you'd expect kids to do at a school concert. They're either running around all willy-nilly, dancing horribly arrhythmically, or just standing there, trying not to be noticed during their first time on stage. However, right there in the middle is this little, adorable, round faced boy dancing, as they say, "like nobody's watching." He is doing elaborate choreography that falls in perfect sync with the song and he's nailing every move.

Apparently after this happened, the video went viral in South Africa and became a sensation. More videos of this little boy dancing at various events started popping up and soon he was everywhere. Eventually he even got noticed on this side of the world and made an appearance on the Kelly Clarkson Show earlier this year. But before that happened, the artist who created "Lyfie," Bernice West herself took notice. As the video took off she eventually saw it and realized that this little boy was on stage, performing the exact choreography from her music video for the song, perfectly. Bernice did a little research into this and found out that the boy's name is Dirkco Jansen van Nieuwenhuizen but everybody, for obvious reasons, just calls him Klein Kwagga (qua-ha). She contacted Kwagga and his family and learned that the video was actually filmed at his sister's dance recital when all the siblings of the performers were invited on-stage to have their own moment in the spotlight in exchange for a piece of chocolate. I'd say he earned it, but his expression of faith during that moment earned him more than just a piece of chocolate.

When Bernice located our little dancer, she gave him the chance to perform again in videos that she posted on her social media and her website and then sat down to interview him. She told him how his video had taken off and that there were many people out there that looked up to him. She wanted to know if there was anything he would tell those people to encourage them, what would it be? Kwagga, who had by this time matured to the ripe old age of eight simply answered that people "should remain firmly on the ground and serve the Lord." Bernice shared his words with the caption "Ko mons glo weer soos kinders," Let's believe like children again.

Heads Up

Someone asked me recently what the two most important parts of my job were. I thought for a moment and came up with two things. I would say the most important thing I strive for in my position is to ensure that the truth is being taught to our students. Not my own version of truth or someone else's idea of truth, but truth straight out of God's word.

I would say the second most important thing in my position is assisting students and walking with students as they find truth outside of our walls. This one is a little more difficult. The world gets the students 24/7. The church gets the students for a couple of hours a week.

Something I'm learning as a new father is that my kids, if not reminded of what's true, will begin repeating a lie they heard outside of our house. This drives me crazy knowing someone told my child something misleading. So how do we address this? How can the church defend against this? Your first instinct may be to say "well all we can do is pray" while praying is a key part of this it's not the only thing we can do. And if not careful, it can become an excuse for not taking action ourselves.

The answer is three fold. Yes, one way is to pray for our brothers and sisters to be guarded from false doctrine, and that they would not be deceived. The other way is to teach them the truth, so that they would not wander from it. The third way is to warn them of the false teachers we do see. This is an act that has been mostly lost in the church. Why has it been lost? Maybe we're afraid to cry wolf, maybe we're afraid to say to another brother that their favorite pastor or teacher is a liar and deceiver. Let me ask you this question, wouldn't you rather disrupt a brother or sister than watch them be devoured by a false teacher? I know I would rather them be frustrated for a short time. But if we can challenge something for just a moment it could potentially be the very thing that steers them away from that false teacher.

In The Church we need to become comfortable with crying wolf. Because there are indeed wolves. So with that in mind I'm going to call out two "pastors" who are indeed false teachers. And if you follow either of them I challenge you to look at what God's word says about false teachers, and compare their teachings with the truth.

The first wolf is Steven Furtick. This man is a false teacher. He does not teach the truth. But he is a very popular teacher and the church as a whole needs to take a stand for the truth. If you have a friend who follows Steven Furtick. Challenge them in a loving manner.


The other wolf is Micheal Todd. He is a liar and deceiver, he is a wolf. He too is a false teacher. He does not teach the truth. And as believers we need to call out false teachers. They are a cancer in the church. If not addressed they will continue to lead people away from God.

So what does that have to do with my job? I need to be diligent to ensure that what I teach is true. Not my opinion, not what sounds the nicest. but the truth. There is no gray in God's word. It's black and white. Some answers we don't have, but a lot we do have. And we need to align our church and ourselves with God's word. Not the other way around. Stand on truth. Stand with God and his word. Give someone a heads up when they're walking into a trap.

Church Members Harassed on Anniversary of Crackdown

In December 2023, the fifth anniversary of the December 2018 crackdown on Early Rain Covenant Church, government authorities harassed more than a dozed Early Rain church families.

"Guards" were stationed outside the homes of some church leaders to prevent them from leaving, and one deacon was detained for 15 days at the Shuangnan Police Station. Church members lost contact with the deacon on December 8th and had no idea what had happened to him.

In addition, one of the church's pastors, Dai Shichao, was question and criminally detained under a charge of "picking quarrels and provoking trouble" And, after being warned on December 8th not to go online, Elder Li Yingqiang and his wife were detained for several hours the following day. The elder was again detained and interrogated on December 15 and December 19th for his participation in an online event commemorating the anniversary of the 2018 crackdown.

Elder Li distributed a letter on December 19th 2023, requesting prayer as Early Rain Covenant Church continues to face various challenges internally and eternally.
