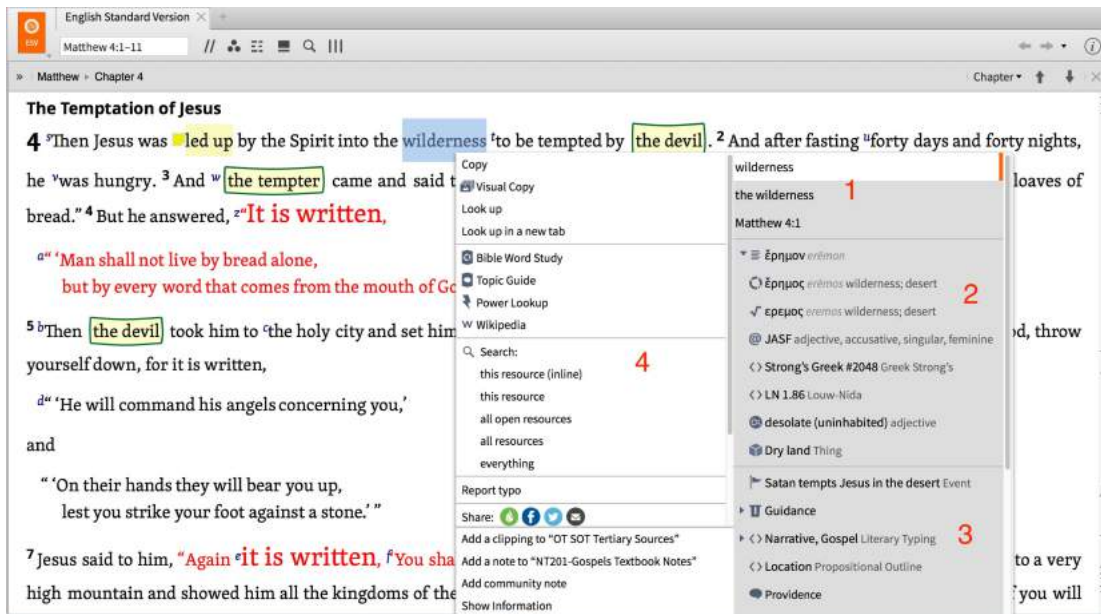


The Basics- The Context Menu

One of the most basic skills you need to learn to get the most out of Logos is using the **Context Menu**. The Context menu gives you quick access to your tools, guides, and a wealth of content related to your text with a single click. To use the Context menu, right-click or on an Apple trackpad two-finger click any word or selection of text in your resources.



Notice that the Context menu opens up and is divided into two sections. The section on the right is used to select the information attached to the word or verse. In this example, the top section (1) provides options of different levels of text to work with—the word, the phrase, or the entire verse. Next, we have word level information (2) like the inflected form, lemma, root, parsing, Strong's number, and more. The rest of the content on the right side (3) exposes layers and layers of tagging attached to the text. This allows us to quickly identify and search for literary types, figures of speech, discourse features, sentence types, and more.

The section on the left of the menu is the Commands section (4) providing us with the relevant tools and commands matching the information selected on the left. Once again, changing the selection on the right will change the options on the left. The Commands section will allow you to easily gain access to guides on verses, searches and word studies for single words, and even quick access to your favorite lexicons. Please note that this is also an easy way to attach notes to words, verses, and even lemmas. Any notes documents that are open will be found here or the if none are open, the last one that we use will be provided.
