

### **Blessings & Beauty**

This past month, my wife and I were blessed with a vacation in New Zealand. I say blessed because there is no way we could have afforded such a luxurious expense apart from God's blessings. We went there to celebrate our 35th wedding anniversary, which is actually this month, but our daughter, who is on missions there, happened to have a two-week vacation during the month of August. So, we spent some time with her and were able to see the beauty of God's creation while we were at it. The first morning we were there, Kim and I were both sharing how we wanted to seek a time of Spiritual renewal while we were vacationing. Setting that goal as a priority become the most important, and most memorable part, of our vacation.

We began a new daily devotion together and early each morning we spent time in prayer, sang praises to the Lord, and read God's Word. We were full of gratitude and overwhelmed with the love of God. Through all the distractions of vacationing, and with things put on hold back here at home, and through driving on the wrong side of the road, all while watching our pennies, God spoke so clearly. - <sup>1</sup>The heavens declare the glory of God; the skies proclaim the work of His hands.
- <sup>2</sup>Day after day they pour forth speech; night after night they reveal knowledge.
- <sup>3</sup>They have no speech, they use no words; no sound is heard from them.
- <sup>4</sup>Yet their voice goes out into all the earth, their words to the ends of the world. In the heavens God has pitched a tent for the sun.
- <sup>5</sup>It is like a bridegroom coming out of his chamber, like a champion rejoicing to run his course.
- <sup>6</sup>It rises at one end of the heavens and makes its circuit to the other; nothing is deprived of its warmth.

These verses all remind us to take time to see Him in His creation. Being in New Zealand made that super easy to do. When I was a boy, I used to study the petals on a single flower and notice how each one was perfectly presented, beautifully colorful, and amazingly unique. God's glory can be seen all around us.

### **Power**

Happy end of Summer to everyone! I don't have much this month and just want to put out a simple follow up message to the three weeks' worth of sermons I just wrapped up yesterday. As I ended each of the three messages I preached this month, used a simple fact as the exclamation on each one... The almighty, incomparable power and sovereignty of our God.

The first sermon was about our wants, desires, and will and how they relate to God's plan; the second was about God's perfect plans and will and how they relate to our wants and needs; and the final week was about Spiritual Warfare and our part in the struggle between the ultimate good and the ultimate evil. At or near the end of each of the three sermons, I made a point of talking about how we serve an omniscient, omnipotent, omnipresent God. That means our Lord is all-knowing, all-powerful, and ever-present.

God created the universe, there was nothing before Him and nothing even came into being until He told it to... NOTHING! Colossians 1:16 says "For in him all things were created: things in heaven and on earth, visible and invisible, whether thrones or powers or rulers or authorities; all things have been created through him and for him."

Have you ever been in the mountains or stood over a huge canyon and looked down to see more of the world than you thought possible? Have you ever stood by the ocean and watched the waves come in and felt the immense power of the sea? Have you ever (and being Kansans, I know at least some of you probably have...) stood or been caught outside when a violent thunderstorm or tornado just somehow seems to appear out of nowhere? As amazing and awe-inspiring, and frightening as all those things can be... they are nothing compared to the power of Our Father. In fact, they only exist because he spoke them into existence. The vast landscape of our world, the overwhelming power of the ocean, and the unpredictable force and potential of nature were mere words spoke by the Creator.

My three sermons all had the same conclusion and that was to take peace in the fact that the God you serve is more incredible, more powerful, just more... than anything possible... and He loves you! I don't know about you, but I can rest in that.



New Young Adult Class!!!




